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


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

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FOREWORD.

The Bureau of Analysis and Investigation was established by the State Board of Charities in July, 1911, to investigate the condition of the poor seeking public aid in New York State, and to analyze the data in the Board's archives bearing on the causes of poverty, delinquency and defectiveness. The latter purpose of the Bureau requires knowledge of the work done by others in the same field, and to obtain information readily, a comprehensive bibliography must be compiled. This bulletin is an effort to supply the need. The compilation has been difficult, because the State Library in the spring of 1911 was practically rendered useless by fire, and until recently has been closed to the public. Through the courtesy of the State Librarian, the Bureau, during the closed period, was supplied with a number of the best books on eugenics and heredity, and from that material, the necessity of a bibliography became apparent and the work of compilation was begun, and is now printed in order that it may be available to the Bureau's investigators, as they travel about the State. The subject of eugenics is related to many other matters which have to do with human welfare, and therefore the bibliography is arranged under twenty subdivisions, as shown in the table of contents. Only such books are entered under these subdivisions as throw some light on eugenics and cognate subjects. The titles do not always indicate that the volumes mentioned are representative books, for eugenics has only recently received the public attention it deserves. The bibliography is an effort to cover an important field which heretofore has not received much attention and there is reason to believe that it will be a useful work of reference to those engaged in the investigation of eugenics and allied social problems.

Thanks are due to Miss Edith N. Grout, of the State Library School, who has edited, carefully examined the titles compiled by the Bureau of Analysis and Investigation, and verified the references so far as possible, with the State Library. The value of the bibliography is greatly enhanced by her work.

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
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
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
