DIPHTHERIA

1023 children were fully immunised in 1942 making a total of 3509 since February 1941.

Facilities have been afforded by the Notts. County Council to do this work at the Clinic at Park House with the help of the Health Visitors.

61.5% of the child population are now protected - but it should be 75 to 80% before the public safety is secured.
Only 8 cases of Diphtheria were notified and there were no deaths.

SCABIES

147 cases were notified and of these 70 received baths under the Authority's arrangements. Soap, eintments, lotions and disinfectants were supplied by the Sanitary Department. Clothing and bedding were sprayed or funigated and washed at home.

Each case is entered on a card and the home visited.

All cases are seen by the Medical Officer of Health who directes the treatment and gives a certificate when cured.

The Registrar General has reduced the population by 770 although the natural increase of the population is 245. This is supposedly done on account of the abstraction of people on Military and other Services and is arrived at by a common factor applicable to all centres of population.

Of the 17 Infantile Deaths 12 occurred during the first month and this is known as the neo-natal mortality - and until this is scientifically tackled - the infantile mortality as a whole will not be reduced to a minimum figure.

It is in this respect that the Ante-natal Clinic plays an important role.
