ANNUAL REPORT OF THE MEDICAL OFFICER OF HEALTH FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31st DECEMBER, 1945.

TO: THE CHARD RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL.

Mr. Chairman, Ladies and Gentlemen,

I have the honour to present a short Report of the Sanitary conditions of the Chard Rural District for the Year 1945.

Employment in the area continued at a high level during the year, men and women returning from the Services being rapidly absorbed into civilian occupations thus doing a little to relieve the labour shortage which has been so acute of recent years.

There was no unusual outbreak of Infectious Disease during the year. There was the usual seasonal occurrence of Influenza and Respiratory Catarrh during the early months of the year, but the cases were not unduly severe.

As regards Notifiable Infectious Disease, two cases of Diphtheria were notified, both were adults who had not been immunised. The cases were admitted to hospital and recovered. There was no spread. One case of Malaria was notified in a returned Service man. These cases are certain to occur from time to time as men return from countries where Malaria exists.

WATER SUPPLIES.

There were no extensions of water supplies carried out during the year. Great difficulty was experienced in maintaining supplies at Winsham during the summer months. Additional small springs have since been collected at the source, but the present yield is still insufficient.

Post-War proposals for Water Supplies:

- (a) Extension to Winsham from Forton with branches to Bridge, Ammerham and Golden Fleece;
- (b) Extension from Crewkerne Water Company's main to Clapton;
- (c) New mains at Ashill to replace corroded iron mains;
- (d) Extension of supply to Buckland St. Mary and Newtown;
- (e) Extension of Regional Scheme, including additional borehole at Pole Rue, Combe St. Nicholas, to connect to existing main at Pretwood, near Ilminster.
