Annual Report of the Medical Officer of Health for 1950

To the Chairman and Members of the Chester Port Health Authority.

GENTLEMEN,

I beg to submit my Annual Report for 1950.

Board.

The composition of your Board and the extent of its jurisdiction are the same as previous years.

Foreign Trade. During the past year Vessels arrived at Mostyn with Wood Pulp.

Coastwise.

This traffic has shown little change during the year.

No passengers entered the Port.

Inspection.

The usual systematic inspection of both Foreign and Coastwise Vessels has been carried out with regard to Sickness, Water Supply, Ventilation, Sanitary conditions of the Crews' quarters, and the presence of Rats. No cases of serious illness were detected, and no cases of Infectious Diseases were notified during the year.

A few minor defects were found on inspection in certain of the Coastwise Vessels, to which the attention of the Master was drawn with subsequent improvement.
