To the Chairman and Members of the Clevedon Urban District Council.

I have the honour to present the Annual Report for 1967.

The figures relating to births this year, are of occurrences and not registrations, as in the past. There was a substantial rise in Clevedon's births last year, and the adjusted rate is well above the national average.

There is little change in the number of deaths registered in 1967, compared with the previous two years. Because there are so many elderly people, nursing homes and old persons' homes in Clevedon; although the number of deaths is high, the adjusted death rate is lower than the national average.

Only three closing orders were made on unfit premises during the year. This was the end of closures made on basement flats, subsequent to inspections in 1965 and 1966. A survey of nonbasement flats in the town was commenced at the end of the year. Only one was found unfit for human habitation and incapable of repair at reasonable cost.

I am indebted to Mr. Ashworth for much of the work done and in the preparation of this report.

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I welcome the continued cooperation of officers and Councillors.

WATER SUPPLY

All houses in Clevedon are supplied by mains water from the Bristol Waterworks Company. The water has been satisfactory in quality and quantity and no form of contamination has been detected.

SEWAGE DISPOSAL

A scheme has been drawn up for the provision of a new main relief sever. Work on the Yeo Valley Main Drainage Scheme has continued. A Public Inquiry was held in March, on the site of the proposed treatment works at Kingston Seymour, and the Ministry of Housing and Local Government approved the use of the proposed site. The principle of a trunk severage system to serve parts of Long Ashton Rural District Council and Clevedon was reaffirmed. Final agreement has not yet been reached on the exact construction of the works, but severage is likely to commence in 1968.

PUBLIC CLEANSING

House refuse is removed weekly, in two vehicles and tipped at Clapton Wick. Trade refuse from shops is collected weekly at a charge of 24/- per annum. A large proportion of business premises use this service.

CESSFOOL EMPTYING

Cesspools are emptied free of charge twice a year. If additional visits are necessary, then the owner is charged in accordance with the time involved.

PREVENTION OF DAMAGE BY PESTS ACT, 1949

As in previous years all treatments have been carried out on behalf of the Council by a contractor. In addition to the treatments given below, regular inspections of the fore-shore, river banks and open spaces have been made and treatment carried out whenever necessary. The Council's refuse tip has been treated regularly in an effort to keep it rat free. Two sewer treatments carried out during the year show that infestation in the sewers is very small.
