13 DEATHS HAVE OCCURRED IN INFANTS UNDER THE AGE OF 12 MONTHS, GIVING AN INFANT MORTALITY OF 41.1 PER 1,000 BIRTHS.

ZYMOTIC DISEASE.

THERE HAVE BEEN 2 DEATHS FROM ZYMOTIC DISEASE IN THE DISTRICT GIVING A DEATH RATE OF .15. ONE DEATH WAS DUE TO DIARRHAEA, THE OTHER TO DIPHTHERIA.

INFECTIOUS DISEASES.

I HAVE RECEIVED 60 CASES OF INFECTIOUS DISEASE IN NOTIFICATIONS, OF WHICH 21 WERE SCARLET FEVER, ONE TYPHOID, 9 DIPHTHERIA & 29 WHOOPING COUGH.

28 OF THESE CASES WERE SENT TO THE SANATORIUM AT WEST HEATH, CONGLETON. ON RECEIPT OF THE NOTIFICATION EVERY CASE IS VISITED & IF REMOVED THE ROOMS WERE IMMEDIATELY DISINFECTED & INSTRUCTIONS GIVEN TO THE PARENTS AS TO THE BEST METHOD OF PREVENTING ANY SPREAD OF THE INFECTION.

IF THE CASES ARE EFFICIENTLY ISOLATED & KEPT AT HOME THE HOUSE IS DISINFECTED ON THEIR RECOVERY.

SCARLETINA. OF THESE CASES 14 OCCURRED AT ELWORTH, 2 AT MOW COP, 1 AT MORETON, 1 KENT GREEN, 1 ELTON, 1 BLACKDEN, 1 AT BRADWELL.

TYPHOID. ONE AT KENT GREEN.

DIPHTHERIA. 3 CASES AT BROOK HOUSE GREEN, 3 AT WHEELLOCK & 3 AT ELWORTH.

PURPURAL FEVER. TWO, BOTH AT LANTON.

WHOOPING COUGH OCCURRED CHIEFLY AT MOW COP, CRANAGE & LEESE.

ERYSIPELAS. 8 CASES WERE REPORTED TO ME.

WATER SUPPLY. SEVERAL PARTS OF THE DISTRICT ARE POORLY SUPPLIED. MOW COP IS STILL WITHOUT A SATISFACTORY SUPPLY BUT IS BETTER OFF THAN THE YEAR BEFORE AS THE PARSONS WELL HAS BEEN REPAIRED & IS GIVING A GOOD SUPPLY WHICH IS EXTENSIVELY USED.

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WATER SUPPLY (Contd).

HANSALL GREEN IS BETTER OFF THIS YEAR OWING TO AN IMPROVEMENT IN THE MAIN.

CRANAGE & ANSBURY ARE WITHOUT A GOOD SUPPLY. HOLMES CHAPEL IS SUPPLIED BY THE MIDDLEWICH URBAN COUNCIL BUT THE PRESSURE IS VERY POOR & THE SUPPLY CONSEQUENTLY UNSATISFACTORY.

SEWAGE DISPOSAL.

THE IRRIGATION GROUNDS ARE WORKING WELL & SATISFACTORY. THE ELWORTH SEWAGE SCHEME IS NOT SATISFACTORY OWING TO TRADE REFUSE GETTING INTO THE DRAINS & INTERFERING WITH THE ACTION OF THE BEDS. THIS OUGHT TO BE ATTENDED TO, AT ONCE.

MOW BANK & VILLAGE ARE NOT PROPERLY DRAINED & THE VILLAGE OF KENT GREEN IS IN A BAD STATE AS REGARDS ITS DRAINAGE.

THIRLWOOD IS ALSO VERY BAD, THE DITCH INTO WHICH THE SEWAGE FLOWS IS IN A FILTHY CONDITION.

BAKE-HOUSES. THESE HAVE BEEN INSPECTED & FOUND CLEAN & IN A GOOD CONDITION. NO UNDER-GROUND BAKE-HOUSES EXIST IN THE DISTRICT.

DAIRIES & COWSHEDS. THERE ARE 121 REGISTERED. THESE HAVE BEEN INSPECTED AT DIFFERENT TIMES & FOUND TO BE CLEAN & IN GOOD CONDITION. VARIOUS IMPROVEMENTS HAVE BEEN ADVISED & CARRIED OUT.

TUBERCULOSIS. 8 CASES HAVE BEEN REPORTED TO ME & HAVE BEEN VISITED & ADVICE GIVEN AS TO THE BEST METHODS OF DISINFECTATION. I PROVIDE SPUTUM FLASKS IF WANTED.

FACTORY & WORKSHOPS ACT. THERE ARE 73 ON THE REGISTER & ARE INSPECTED. THEY HAVE BEEN FOUND IN GOOD ORDER WELL VENTILATED & WITH GOOD LIGHT & AIR SPACE.
