To the Chairman and Members of the Crook and
Willington Urban District Council.

Ladies and Gentlemen,

Circular No. 2067 of July, 19th. states that in view of the increasing pressure of work in the Public Health Department of local authorities and the need of strict economy in the use of paper, the Minister considers that interim reports only should be made for the year 1939.
