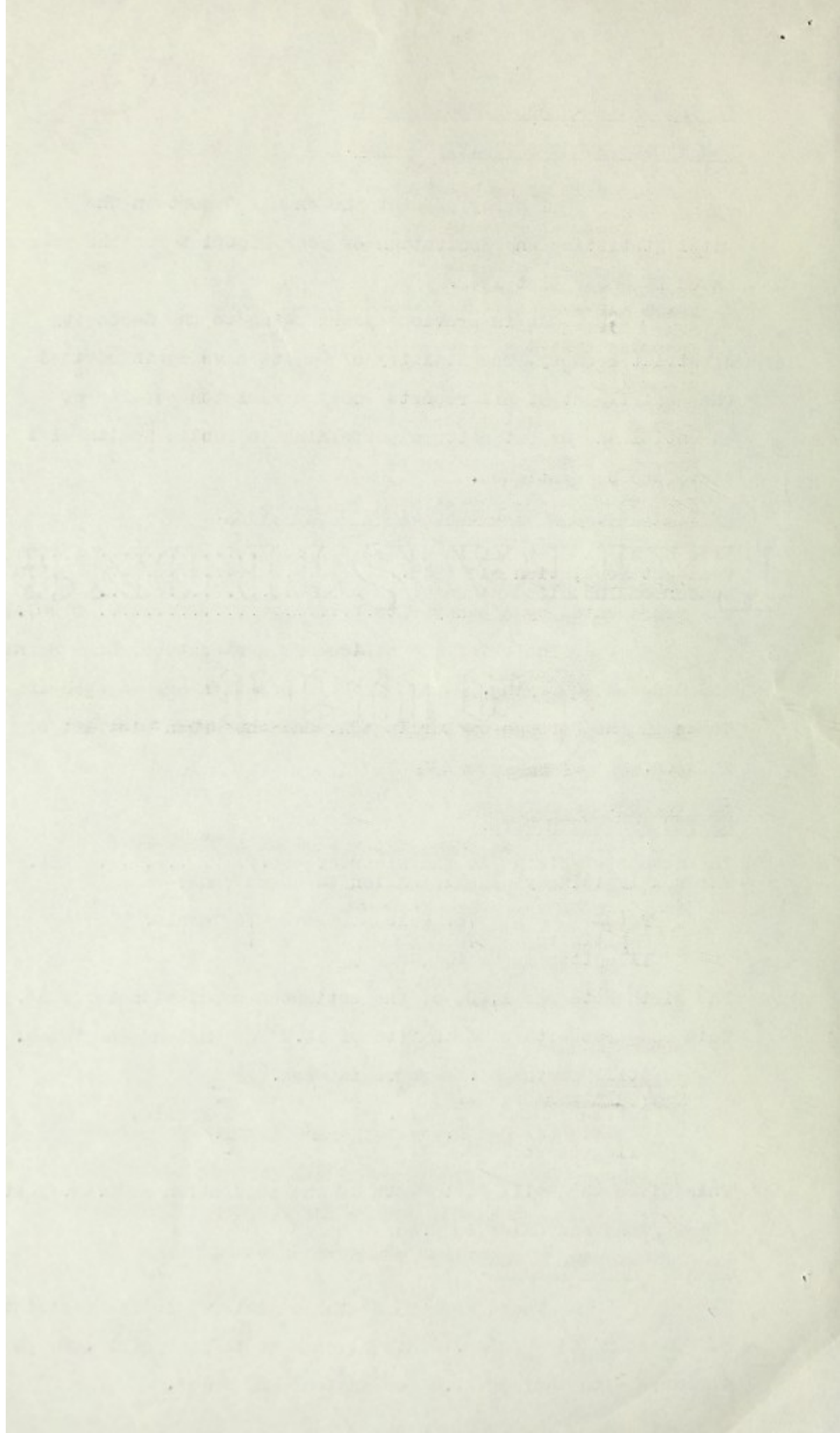

The number of cases immunised against Diphtheria during the year was 578 of this total 479 were in the 5-15 age group, and in the 0-5 age group 99. The percentage of immunised children in the area is ~~97%~~ 81% in the 5-15 age group and 34% in the 0-5 age group.

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WATER SUPPLIES.

The water supply in the Houghton le Side and Houghton Bank areas which is entirely from Wells, was again very short, many of the Wells going entirely dry.

A scheme is on foot to take a piped supply to a village in an adjoining Council's area, and an endeavour is being made to have the supply pass through this portion of the District, and so afford a much needed supply.

An extension of a main ^{has been made.} at Aycliffe which will permit water being laid into premises in place of a public stand pipe.

A scheme is on foot to take water into the village of Archdeacon Newton. This village belonging entirely to a single estate, the scheme will be a private one.
