COMPARABILITY FACTOR

The variety and magnitude of local population movements and the uneven incidence of civilian war deaths have together combined to frustrate the attempt to secure comparability between local death rates by the use of the Areal Comparability Factors and the preparation and issue of such factors are being suspended under present conditions by the Registrar General.

It is satisfactory to note that there were again no deaths from Puerperal Causes during 1943.

INFECTIOUS DISEASES

During the year under review there were 177 cases notified, and were as follows:-

It is interesting to note that of the 18 cases of Diphtheria notified 8 occurred in adults of 15 years or more. The one death recorded from this cause was in a child of 9 years who had not been immunised. The number of cases immunised against Diphtheria during the year was 130, of this total 83 were in the 5 - 15 age group and 47 in the 0 - 5 age group. The percentage of immunised children in the area is 88% in the 5 - 15 age group and 44% in the 0 - 5 age group.

TUBERCULOSIS

There were 5 new cases of Pulmonary Tuberculosis and 2 of non-Pulmonary Tuberculosis notified.

It is interesting to note that of the 177 cases

of which the notified 9 occurred in males of 15 years
or more. The one death recorded from this group was in
a child of 3 years who had not been vaccinated. The number
of cases recorded against the notified 9 during the year was
100. Of this total 95 were in the 15 - 19 age group and 47
in the 20 - 29 age group. The percentage of vaccinated
children in the 15 - 19 age group is 88% in the 20 - 29 age group and
88% in the 30 - 39 age group.
