The variety and magnitude of local population movements and the uneven incidence of civilian war deaths have together combined to frustrate the attempt to secure comparability between local death rates by the use of the Areal Comparability Factors and the preparation and issue of such factors are being suspended under present conditions by the Registrar General.

It is interesting to note that of the 18 cases of Diphtheria notified 8 occured in adults of 15 years or more. The one death recorded from this cause was in a child of 9 years who had not been immunised. The number of cases immunised against Diphtheria during the year was 130, of this total 83 were in the 5 - 15 age group and 47 in the 0 - 5 age group. The percentage of immunised children in the area is 88% in the 5 - 15 age group and 44% in the 0 - 5 age group.

TUBERCULOSIS

There were 5 new cases of Pulmonary Tuberculosis and 2 of non-Pulmonary Tuberculosis notified.
