TUBERCULOSIS: -

At the end of 1939 there were 20 cases of tuberculosis on the register, 10 pulmonary and 10 non-pulmonary. During the year 1940, 9 cases were added to the register, 6 pulmonary and 3 non-pulmonary. Five cases, all pulmonary, were removed from the register during the year, and on the 31st. December, 1940, 24 cases remained on the register, 11 pulmonary and 13 non-pulmonary.
