I have the honour to present my Health Reports for the years 1960, 1961 and 1962.

Population: The population increased during the three years from 23,460 in 1960 to 26,480 in 1962.

Infectious Diseases: The Borough was free from the more serious infectious diseases during the three years. Measles was very prevalent in 1960 and 1962; in all 740 cases were notified during the period.

Cancer: Cancer as a disease is not notifiable and there is no record of the number of cases in the Borough. Also there is no record of the number of cases cured. Cancer deaths during the three years were as follows:

(of which 31 were cancer of the lung)

## POPULATION

The population as estimated by the Registrar General for 1960 was 23,460 for 1961, 25,740 and 1962, 26,480; and the table below shows that there has been a total increase of population of 9,210 in the last ten years.

"Natural Increase" shows the difference between the birth and death rates.

The average yearly increase in the last five years is 1,266.

### Birth Rate

Birth Rates between different areas cannot be compared unless allowance is made for the number of women residents of child bearing age.

The Registrar General supplied a "comparability factor" to all areas so that an adjusted Birth Rate can be made. The "factor" for this Borough for the year 1960 was 0.92, for 1961 was 0.89 and for 1962 was 0.89.

The Birth Rate for 1960 was 19.96 after multiplying the "crude" Birth Rate of 21.7 by the "comparability factor". The Birth Rate for England and Wales as a whole was 17.1.

The total number of live births was 508.

The Birth Rate for 1961 was 20 after multiplying the "crude" Birth Rate of 22.5 by the "comparability factor". The Birth Rate for England and Wales as a whole was 17.4

The total number of live births was 580.

The Birth Rate for 1962 was 19.13 after multiplying the "crude" Birth Rate of 21.5 by the "comparability factor". The Birth Rate for England and Wales as



a whole was 16.9

The total number of live births was 579.

#### Still Births

The number of Still Births in 1960 was 10 and the Still Birth Rate 0.4 per 1000 population. The corresponding Rate per 1000 Live and Still Births was 19.3

The number of Still Births in 1961 was 12 and the Still Birth Rate 0.5 per 1000 population. The corresponding Rate per 1000 Live and Still Births was 20.3.

The number of Still Births in 1962 was 12 and the Still Birth Rate 0.45 per 1000 population. The corresponding Rate per 1000 Live and Still Births.

#### Death Rate

The uncorrected Death Rate for 1960 was 7.9. To make allowances for age and sex constitution the Registrar General has allowed correction of this figure by the "comparability factor" of 1.23, by which a corrected Death Rate of 10.2 is obtained. The rate for England and Wales was 11.5.

The uncorrected Death Rate for 1961 was 8.5. To make allowances for age and sex constitution the Registrar General has allowed correction of this figure by the "comparability factor" of 1.38, by which a corrected Death Rate of 11.7 is obtained. The Rate for England and Wales was 12.0.

The uncorrected Death Rate for 1962 was 8.1. To make allowances for age and sex constitution the Registrar General has allowed correction of this figure by the "comparability factor" of 1.38 by which a corrected Death Rate of 11.18 is obtained. The Rate for England and Wales was 11.8.

### Scarlet Fever

During 1960 six cases were notified compared with four in 1959. During 1961 and 1962 only one case was notified in each year.

### Whooping Cough

During 1960 there were forty-five notifications of this disease compared with nine in 1959. Only one case was notified in 1961 and there were no notifications in 1962.

### Measles

During 1960 two hundred and fifteen cases of measles were notified compared with two hundred and forty-three in the previous year. Ninety-five cases were notified in 1961 and four hundred and thirty cases in 1962.

### Diphtheria

No cases of Diphtheria were notified during 1960, 1961 or 1962.

### Dysentery

During 1960 sixty-four cases were notified compared with one in 1959. The Dysentery epidemic started in Dunstable in the early months of the year but did not develop to the extent that was expected. No cases of Dysentery were notified during 1961 and 1962.

### Poliomyelitis

The Borough was free from this disease during 1960, 1961 and 1962.

### Food Poisoning

No cases were notified during 1960 compared with five cases in 1959. Two cases were notified in 1961, but no cases were notified in 1962.

### Paratyphoid Fever

There was one notification of this disease during 1960, but no notifications during 1961 and 1962.

# NATIONAL ASSISTANCE ACT, 1948 - SECTION 47

## Persons in need of care and attention

This Section provides for the necessary care and attention of persons who:

- (a) are suffering from grave chronic disease or, being aged and infirm or physically incapacitated, are living in insanitary conditions, and
- (b) are unable to devote to themselves, and are not receiving from other persons, proper care and attention.

In no instance during years 1960, 1961 and 1962 was it found necessary to take legal action for compulsory removal.
