Infectious Disease

The number of cases notified continued to fall considerably below the figures of 1946 and 1947. 63 cases only occured of which whooping cough accounted for 31, Heasles 14 pheumonia for 12 Scarlet fever for 5 and meningo coccal meningitis for 1.
