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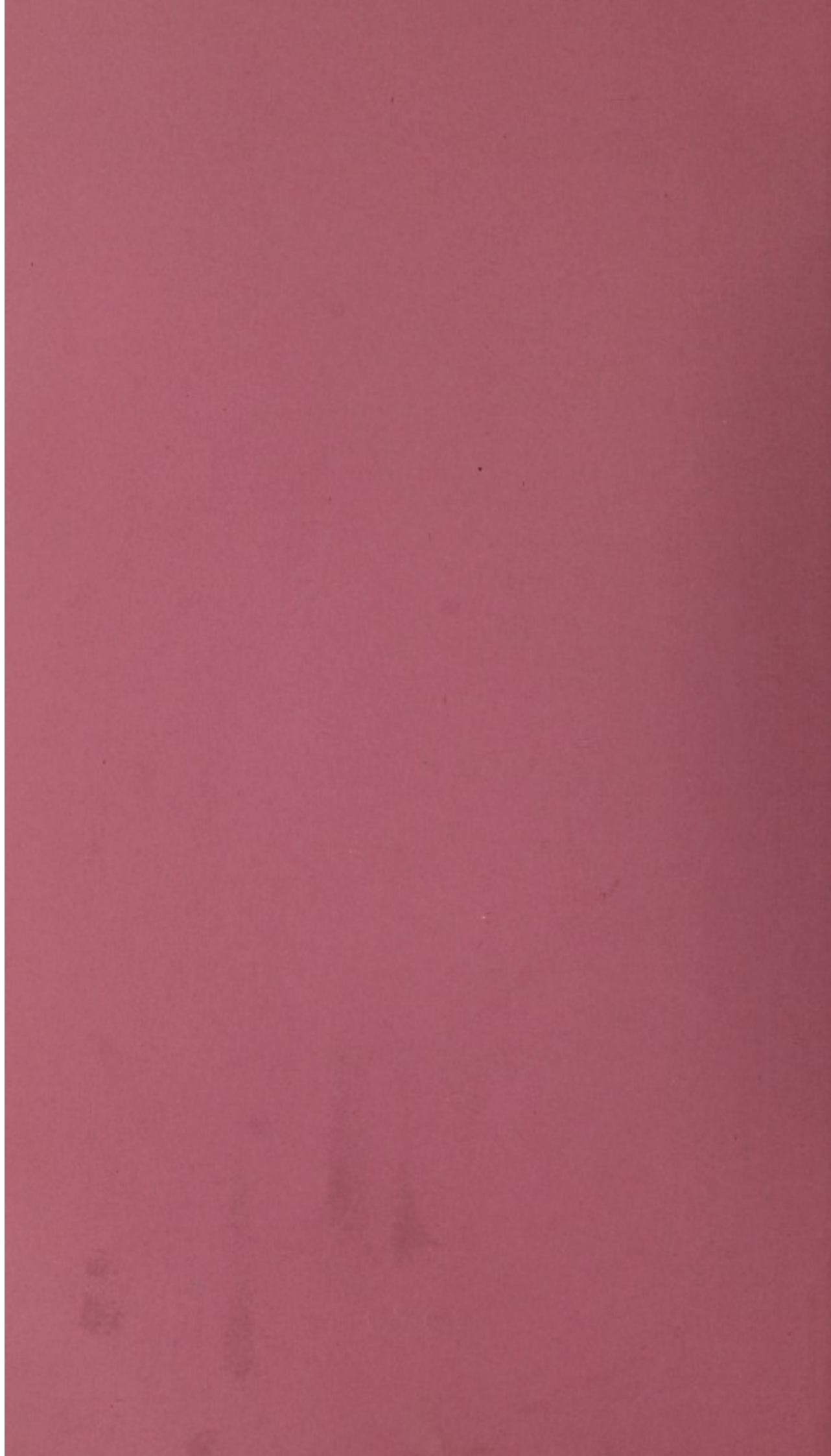

The adjusted death rate of 11.7 per thousand population is the same as the national death rate. The high crude death rate in Filey (17.4 per thousand) is due to the high proportion of old people in the population.

Causes of death follow the expected pattern, with diseases of the heart and circulation and cancer predominating. There was one stillbirth, and no deaths of infants under one year of age.

No infectious diseases were sufficiently prevalent to merit special mention.

On housing, 67 new buildings were completed during the year on the Church Cliff Farm and Grove Hill Estates. A note-worthy achievement was the improvement of the potentially derelict property in Queen Street.
