To the Chairman and Members of the Health Committee.

GENTLEMEN,

I have great pleasure in submitting my Fifth Annual Report on the health and sanitary condition of your district for the year ending 1909.

Seven Tables are included in the Report as to the Vital Statistics of the District. Five of the Tables are required by the Local Government Board, one by the Home Office, and Table C by the County Medical Officer of Health.

Table I. deals with the Vital Statistics for the Whole District in 1909, and the past 10 years.

Table II. deals with the Separate Localities of the District in 1909 and the past 10 years,

Table III. deals with Infectious Cases notified during 1909.

Table IV. shows Causes of and Ages at Death during 1909.

Table V. deals with the Infantile Mortality during

Table VI. is a Summary of the Work done under the Factory and Workshop Act.

Table C is a Summary and Report required by the County Medical Officer,

VITAL STATISTICS.

BIRTH RATE.

One hundred and ten births were registered during the year 1909, 51 boys and 59 girls. This gives a birth rate of 171 per thousand. This is a slight decrease from last year.

DEATH RATE.

The nett deaths at all ages belonging to the district is 62, which gives us a death rate of 9.6 per 1000. This is a slight increase, but is well below the average for the last 10 years.

INFANTILE MORTALITY.

The number of deaths of infants under one year is 11, which is a slight increase from last year.

INFECTIOUS CASES.

During the year 22 Infectious Cases were notified to me, none of which proved fatal, two cases only being removed to hospital at Bootle.

This shows a gradual decrease from last year.

SCARLET FEVER.

Ten cases occurred during the year. No cases were removed to hospital.

DIPHTHERIA.

Five cases were notified to me. Two cases were removed to hospital.

ENTERIC FEVER.

One case only was notified to me.

ERYSIPELAS.

Six cases were notified to me.

PUERPERAL FEVER.

No cases were notified.

INFECTIOUS HOSPITAL.

Arrangements have been made with Bootle to take any of our cases.

INSPECTION OF THE DISTRICT.

During the year I have accompanied your Sanitary Inspector on many occasions to houses, dairies, shippons, bakehouses and workshops in the district, and I am pleased to note the improvements made to the shippons and Dairies.

SANITARY STATE OF THE DISTRICT AT THE END OF THE YEAR.

I consider the sanitary condition much improved This is no doubt due to the sewer working satisfactorily. At the same time I should like to see all the houses on the sewer area, not only connected to the main sewer but to the soil pipes and privies as well

In districts in which large public institutions seriously affect the statistics, the rates in Column 13 may be calculated on a nett population, obtained by deducting from the estimated gross population the average number of inmates not belonging to the district in such institutions. * Rates in Columns 4 and 8 should be calculated per 1,000 of the estimated gross population.

Nore.-The deaths to be included in Column 7 of this table are the whole of those registered during the year as having actually occurred within the district or division. The deaths to be included in Column 12 are the number in Column 7, corrected by the subtraction of the number in Column 10 and the addition of the number in Column 11.

By the term "Non-residents" is meant persons brought into the district on account of sickness or infirmity, and dying in public institutions there; and by the term "Residents" is meant persons who have been taken out of the district on account of sickness or infirmity, and have died in public institutions elsewhere.

The "Public Institutions" to be taken into account for the purposes of these Tables are those into which persons are habitually received on account of sickness or infirmity, such as hospitals, workhouses, and lunatic asylums. A list of the Institutions in respect of the deaths in which corrections have been made should be given on the back of this table.

- (a) In Table IV., all deaths of "Residents" occurring in public institutions, whether within or without the district, are to be included with the other deaths in the columns for the several age groups (columns 2-8). They are also, in columns 9-15, to be included among the deaths in their respective "Localities" according to the previous addresses of the deceased as given by the Registrars Deaths of "Non-residents" occurring in public institutions in the district are in like manner to be excluded from columns 2-8 and 9-15 of Table IV.
- (b) See notes on Table I. as to the meaning of "Residents" and "Non-residents," and as to the "Public Institutions" to be taken into account for the purposes of these Tables. The "Localities" in Table IV, should be the same as those in Tables II. and III.

(c) All deaths occurring in public institutions situated within the district, whether of "Residents" or "Non-residents," are, in addition to being dealt with as in note (α), to be entered in the last column of Table IV. The total number in this column should equal the figures for the year in column 9, Table I.

(d) The total deaths in the several "Localities" in columns 9-15 of Table IV. should equal those for the year in the same localities in Table II., sub-columns c. The total deaths at all ages in column 2 of Table IV, should equal the gross total of columns 9-15, and the figures for

the year in column 12 of Table I.

(e) Under the heading of "Diarrhea" are to be included deaths registered as due to Epidemic diarrhea, Epidemic enteritis, Infective enteritis, Zymotic enteritis Summer diarrhea, Dysentery and Dysenteric diarrhea, Choleraic diarrhea, Cholera (other than Asiatic or epidemic). and Cholera Nostras.

Deaths from Diarrhea secondary to some other well-defined disease

should be included under the latter.

Deaths from Enteritis, Muco Enteritis, Gastro-Enteritis, and Gastritis (see under the heading Diarrheal Diseases in Table V.) in Tables IV and V. should be placed immediately below, but separately from those enumerated under the heading Diarrhea as defined by enumeration above. This is particularly important for deaths under one year of age, as many of the deaths in infancy returned as due to Enteritis are really caused by Epidemic Diarrhea. In the course of years, by the adoption of this recommendation, it will be practicable to ascertain the probable amount of transfer between these different headings.

(1) Under the headings of "Cancer" and "Puerperal fever "should be included all registered deaths from causes comprised within these general terms. Thus: Under "Cancer" should be included deaths from Cancer, Carcinoma, Malignant disease, Scirrhus, Epithelioma, Sarcoma, Villous tumour, and Papilloma of bladder, Rodent ulcer. Under "Puerperal Fever" are to be included deaths from Pyæmia, Septicæmia, Sapræmia, Pelvic peritonitis, Peri- and Endo-Metritis

occurring in the Puerperium.

(g) Under "Congenital Defects" in Table V. are to be included deaths from Atelectasis, Icterus neonatorum, Navel hæmorrhage, Malformations, and Congenital hydrocephalus

(h) Under "Tuberculous Meningitis" are to be included deaths from

Acute hydrocephalus.

(i) Under 'Other Tuberculous Diseases' are to be included deaths from Tuberculosis, Tuberculosis of bones, joints and other organs, Lupus and Scrofula.

(j) All deaths certified by registered Medical Practitioners and all Inquest cases are to be classed as "Certified"; all other deaths are to be regarded as "Uncertified."

In recording the facts under the various headings of Tables I., II., IV., and V., attention has been given to the notes on the Tables.
