HERR JOSEPH DRASAL, the great Tyrolese Giant, measuring 8 feet 4 inches in height, was born in Holleschau, near the Tyrol, Austria, in 1850, and is consequently 32 years of age. His parents belonged to the Agricultural class; and he is himself a landed proprietor, being possessed of several freehold farms. He is also a Town Councillor in his native place.

A great deal of persuasion was necessary to induce him to leave his home and exhibit himself, but he has done so with greatest success, creating quite a *furor* in Vienna, Berlin, Paris, Brussels, etc. His intellectual capacities are fully developed, and he is a very shrewd business man. He is well-proportioned, and strong on his legs, and is undoubtedly the tallest man that has ever been exhibited. To give an idea of the enormous size of his finger, we may mention that a two-shilling piece will pass through the inside of his signet ring. He is fairly educated, and speaks the following languages well: German, Slavonic, Russian, Polish, Hungarian, and a little French. He will appear in his National Costume, in conjunction with Colonel Dietrich Ulpts, the Tyrolese Midget, who was born in Innsbruck, Tyrol, in 1860, (hence 22 years of age,) and is only 34 inches high. His parents belong to the bourgeoisie class, and occupy a very respectable position; they are ordinary sized people. The Colonel is a wonderful mimic, and good musician, and will give a specimen of his talents on the London stage. He is well educated, having been employed in an Insurance Office, as a Cashier; he speaks English, German and French, and is remarkably good looking, particularly bright and very intelligent, which makes him a great favourite amongst the ladies.
