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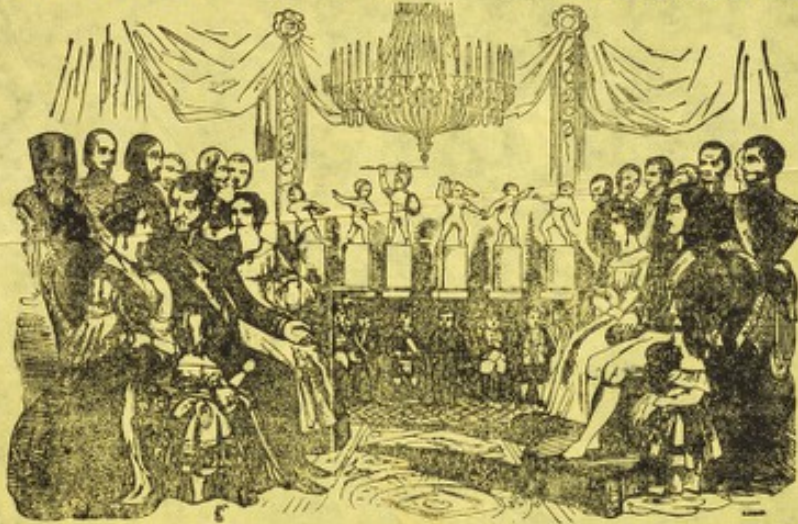

His SONGS which are numerous, include WILKINS and his Dinah (in Costume). He appears dressed as an OKONIAN! He gives numerous imitations of NAPOLEON BONAPARTE and FREDERICK the GREAT in full Military Costume. He represents (in Costume) THE GRECIAN STATUES. He gives a representation of a HIGHLAND WARRIOR in a beautiful SCOTCH COSTUME, armed with his trusty CLAYMORE, BIRD, PISTOLS, &c. He also appears in the Magnificent COURT DRESS in which he had the honour of appearing three times before HER MAJESTY and the Royal Family at Buckingham Palace in 1844; also before HER late MAJESTY the QUEEN DOWAGER, KING LOUIS PHILIPPE, and various Crowned Heads of Europe.
