HIGHLAND DWARFS.

Tusse three "wee" personages, accompanied by Mr. Mackenzie, had the hencer of performing their national dances and songs, on Thursday evening (the 21st inst.), at Backlingham Palsee, in the presence of the Queen, Prince Albert, the Duchess of Kent, and a select circle. Her Majesty was gradously pleased to express her approbation of the performances.

The three Highland Dwarfs are named Mackinlay, and are natives of the county of Ross; they were born in the partie of Lechcarron, and their father was a berd upon the hills of the district. The eldest Dwarf, Finlay (the central figures in the Engraving), is 23 years old, 44 inches high, and a stone 3 lb. weight; and, to the right, as Mary, 19 years of age, 44 inches in height, and 5 stone 3 lb. weight; and, to the right, is Mary, 19 years of age, 44 inches in height, and 5 stone 10 lb. weight. The lads, in their native country, were employed in herding, collecting eggs, &c.; and the girl in knitting, swing, &c. They wear the full dress of the clan of Ross—a tarten of dark green, and white and red sarrow stripes; and the young meil bear broadwords and steel targets. They give their very amusing performances daily, at the Cosmorama Ecoms, in Regent-street.
