It is the Exhibition of a child named James Paine, who was born in Marshall Street, a distance of about 200 yards from the Hall. He is in his 9th year, and bids fair to be known as a second Daniel Lambert. He stands about five feet high, has rather a pleasing countenance, indicating good temper, and absence of all bodily pain or inconvenience. He was dressed in a costume which was partly Scottish, leaving his legs, arms, and chest, perfectly free. The age of the child was questioned by one or two gentlemen present, but in addition to the testimony of Mr Donald, of St. James' Hall, other neighbours satisfied us that he is really what he is described to be. He has added 10 inches to his height since Christmas last. He weighs 19 stone and a half; measures one yard and three-quarters round the waist, 24 inches round the calf of the leg, and 34 inches round the thigh.
