The first and principal group represents the History of

SAMSON

Being the only Anatomical Figure ever seen in Europe, and executed by the celebrated Artist, CABALLI, which Figure was seen by Buonaparte, in the Year 1813, and so much admired by him, that he honoured the Artist with the Medal of Belles Arts, for having produced such a Master-piece. SAMSON is represented as SLEEPING ON A SOFA, surrounded by a group of Four Philistines, the principal of whom offers a Purse of Money to DELILAH to induce her to betray SAMSON, and she cuts the Hair, whereby he is deprived of his strength.

The Head, Breast, and Stomach of Samson,

ARE OPENED, AND EXPOSED TO VIEW;

And the Animal, Vital, and Natural Cavities are shown, as well as the MUSCLES, VEINS, and ARTERIES of the Left Arm, of which an Anatomical explanation will be given. Two other Philistines examining Samson. Another holds a Cord to bind him. There is likewise an

Old Woman, Servant to Delilah.

This Figure is worthy of attention. There is a small Figure at Samson's Feet, holding the Jaw-bone of an Ass, the Weapon with which he slew the Philistines.

He has been admired in all the principal Cities in which he has been seen, especially in London, where he received much honour and applause from his Majesty and all the Royal Family, not only on account of his diminutive figure, and disembarrassed manners, but for his exact symmetry and proportion, as crowds witnessed in Dublin at the time of his landing, who immediately surrounded the Coach to see and speak to him, and during his late visit at Sheffield, was carried on a small Dish by the Waiter of the Angel Inn, into the Room, where a Party of Gentlemen were dining, to whom he afforded much amusement.
