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
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

The estimated population at the middle of the year shows an increase of 30 on last year's figure.

30 fewer babies were born to Ashby residents than in 1969, and the birth rate of 12.7 was appreciably lower than that for England and Wales (16.0) and for Ashby in 1969 (16.5).

The percentage of illegitimate live births was 9, that for England and Wales was 8, and that for Ashby in 1969 was 5.

Last year there were no stillbirths, this year 3 were registered.

Last year no deaths of infants under one year were registered, this year 2 were registered (one due to congenital abnormality and the other to prematurity - both as a matter of fact occurred in the first week of life). The infantile mortality rate was 20, 18 for England and Wales, whilst for Ashby in 1969 it was nil.

We are dealing with small numbers and one death or birth more or less makes an appreciable difference in the particular rate being calculated.

There were 13 fewer deaths than in 1969 - the death rate for 1970 being 9.4 compared with 11.7 for England and Wales as a whole, and 10.9 for Ashby in 1969.

Prevalence of, and Control over, Infectious Disease


6 cases of infectious disease were notified with an age and sex distribution as below.

Two pail closets were abolished during the year.

In an attempt to get rid of the few remaining pail closets in the istrict the Council decided to offer the owners of the remaining houses aving pail closets a grant of 50% of the cost of converting to water losets under Section 47 of the Public Health Act, 1936. Unfortunately, nly one owner has so far taken advantage of this grant.

ublic Cleansing

A weekly refuse collection service was maintained throughout the istrict except during the Statutory Holidays - a total of six days per ear when about 600 householders do not have their refuse collected for 14 ays. The refuse collection service has not closed down for annual holidays ince 1966.

The number of dustbins collected per week has increased from .625 on the 1st January, to 3,684 on the 31st December.

The bulk of the refuse is collected by a Dennis Paxit 111A continuous loading vehicle with a crew of five loaders and driver. The helvoke and Drury Lorry is now nine years old and is kept on standby luties and for the collection of refuse and pails in the outlying areas of the Urban District on one day per week.

Trade refuse is collected by arrangement from shops and offices and a charge of £1.00 per year is made for the weekly collection of each bin.

All refuse is disposed of on the tip in Smisby Road which is leased by the Council from the British Transport Commission. Land has been purchased at Lount which will be used jointly as a refuse tip by the Coalville U.D.C., Ashby-de-la-Zouch R.D.C. and Ashby-de-la-Zouch U.D.C. This tip is estimated to have a life of 10 years and should be brought into use in 1971.
