The estimated population at the middle of the year increased from 8,300 to 8,470.

The birth rate at 14.3 is just below that for England and Wales (14.8) and is lower than last year (15.8).

The percentage of illegitimate live births this year is 2, compared with 9 for the country as a whole and with 5 for the district for last year.

2 still-births were registered (1 last year) with a rate per 1,000 live and still-births of 17 for the district compared with 12 for England and Wales and 8 for the district in 1971.

The deaths of 3 infants under 1 year occurred -2 of them were less than a week old giving an infantile mortality rate of 25 per 1,000 live births compared with 17 for England and Wales and 8 for Ashby last year. Two of the deaths were due to prematurity and the other to pneumonia.

35 of the deaths recorded occurred outside the district and 68 within the district, whilst there also occurred within the district the deaths of 25 non-residents which, of course, are not included in our figures. The death rate at 13.1 per 1,000 is higher than that for England and Wales (12.1) and slightly higher than last year's rate for . Ashby (12.4).

#### General Provision of Health Services

In my last two reports I have referred to the likelihood of a Health Centre being provided by the County Council. Building commenced in the autumn and it is hoped that it will be in use by the end of 1973.

#### Meals on Wheels

11 visits involving 14 persons were paid, to ascertain whether the service was required. All the applications received and investigated were granted.

#### National Assistance Acts, 1948 and 1951

No formal action was necessary under the above Acts.

#### Examination of Employees

3 prospective employees were examined with a view to assessing whether they were fit for admission as contributors to the Superannuation Fund, and all were considered to be fit.

#### Prevalence of, and Control over, Infectious Disease

Only 9 cases of infectious disease were notified during the year, comprising 5 measles, 2 whooping cough, 1 infective hepatitis and 1 respiratory tuberculosis.

The case of infective hepatitis occurred in a female in the 45-54 age group, and the case of tuberculosis occurred in a male in the 65-74 age group. The age and sex distribution of the cases of measles and whooping cough are shown in the attached tables.

3 possible contacts of food poisoning in another part of the County were followed up with negative results, and 2 persons, resident in the area, who had been on holiday in a declared smallpox locally infected area of Europe were also followed up, again with negative results. In presenting this report, I wish to place on record my thanks to all members of the Council for their help and understanding, for the willing help of the staff, and for the help and co-operation given to me by Dr. Hamilton and the other officers of the Council.

#### Water Supply

Water is distributed to property in Heath Lane and Ashby Road, Boundary by the South Derbyshire Water Board. In the remainder of the area water is distributed by the North West Leicestershire Water Board. Neither water supply is liable to plumbo-solvent action and the fluoride contents are as follows:-

North West Leicestershire Water Board - 0.27 parts per million.

South Derbyshire Water Board - 0.10 " " "

#### Public Cleansing

The number of dustbins collected per week increased from 3,752 on the 1st January to 4,017 on the 31st December.

This increase in the work load together with a labour dispute early in the year caused some delays in the refuse collection service, the first disruption of a weekly service except for statutory and annual holidays, since 1962.

A new Seddon Collectomatic vehicle of 50 yards nominal capacity was delivered in December and was brought into use early in 1973. This vehicle is being used in addition to the Dennis Paxit vehicle.

The 5 cubic yard containers with hinged lids which are hired to large stores and hotels are proving very satisfactory and provide a hygienic method of storing and removing trade refuse.
