Sir, Madam and Gentlemen,

I beg to present my annual report on the Health and Sanitary Conditions of your district during the past year.

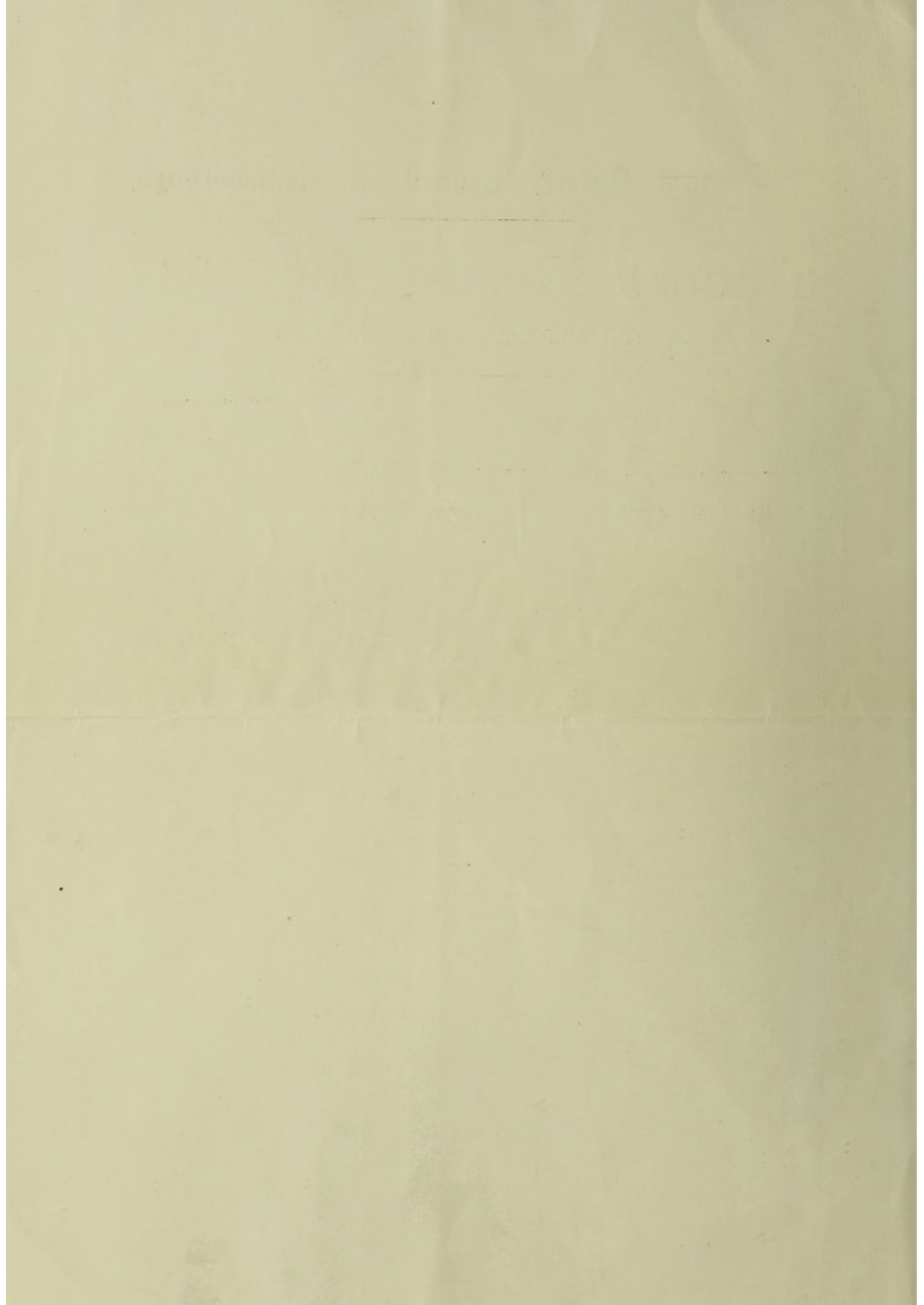
The birth rate is 14.9313.

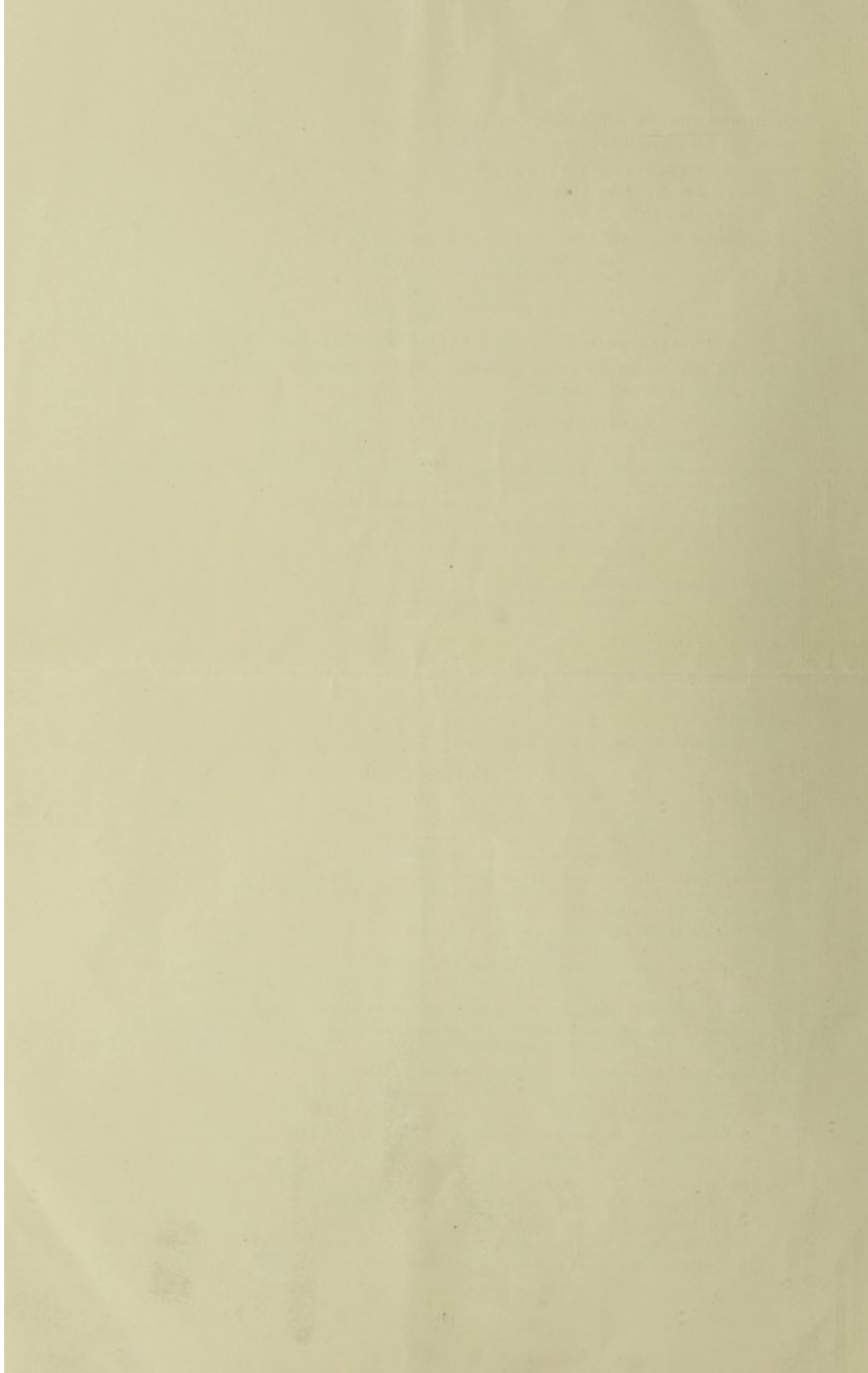
