- (a) Laboratory facilities. There is an Emergency Public Health Laboratory in Lincoln which serves the County Council and also the District Council.
(b) There are District Nurses in several villages.
(c) Isolation. Cases of infectious disease are admitted to the Urban District Council Isolation Hospital.

SECTION C.

WATER SUPPLY.

This is improving and more of the district is getting the water mains connected up.
10 samples of water were taken for analysis during the year.

DRAINAGE AND SEWERAGE.

Four drains have been examined and repaired.

OFFENSIVE TRADES.

The only existing premises have been regularly inspected and are free from blame.

SECTION D.

HOUSING.

24 houses inspected during the year. Inspections have only been made where complaints have been received.

16 defects were remedied in consequence of informal action.

10 new Houses have been built.
