

#### **Inspection and Supervision of Food**

#### Ice Cream

Under Section 16 of the Food and Drugs Act, 1955, all premises used for the manufacture, sale and storage of ice cream have to be registered by the Local Authority. The number registered for the storage and sale of pre-packed ice cream is 51. There is one cold mix ice cream manufacturer in the district. Regular routine inspections have been carried out during the year.

#### Food Poisoning

No outbreak of food poisoning has been notified during the year.

#### Bakehouses

There is one bakehouse in the district. 6 inspections and visits were made.

#### Fish and Chip Shops

There are eight fish frying premises in the district. These were inspected on 16 occasions.

#### Food Hygiene Regulations, 1955

159 inspections have been carried out during the year and informal action was taken on five occasions, the requirements asked for being provided.

#### **Food Retail Premises**

6 premises are licensed under Section 16 of the Food and Drugs Act, 1955, for the manufacture of sausages, brawn, pies, etc. Regular visits of inspection were made during the year and 110 tins of various foodstuffs weighing approximately  $211\frac{1}{4}$  lbs. together with 90 lbs. Home Killed Beef, 26 lbs. Liver, 5 lbs. Kidneys,  $24 \times 56$  lbs. potatoes and 1 x 28 lbs. Dried Milk and a quantity of frozen foodstuffs were voluntarily surrendered as unfit for human consumption.

#### **Licensed Premises**

There are 19 licensed premises in the area: 18 inspections were made to these.

#### **Meat Inspection**

100% inspection of all animals slaughtered for human consumption has been carried out during the year and for this purpose 268 visits were made. 148lbs. of meat and offal were condemned as being diseased or otherwise unfit for human consumption and the whole of this amount was voluntarily surrendered.

# **ATMOSPHERIC POLLUTION TESTS**

#### Prevention of Damage by Pests Act, 1949-Rodent Control

During the year the Council's sewers were treated twice in accordance with the technique recommended by the Ministry of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food. Routine surveys have been carried out in connection with farms, business premises, dwelling-houses, etc. and at the year end 41 non-agricultural properties had been treated. The poison used has been 'Warfarin'.

#### Caravan Sites and Control of Development Act, 1960

There are 2 licensed sites for the stationing of 1 residential caravan only. These were inspected on two occasions.

#### **Public Swimming Baths**
