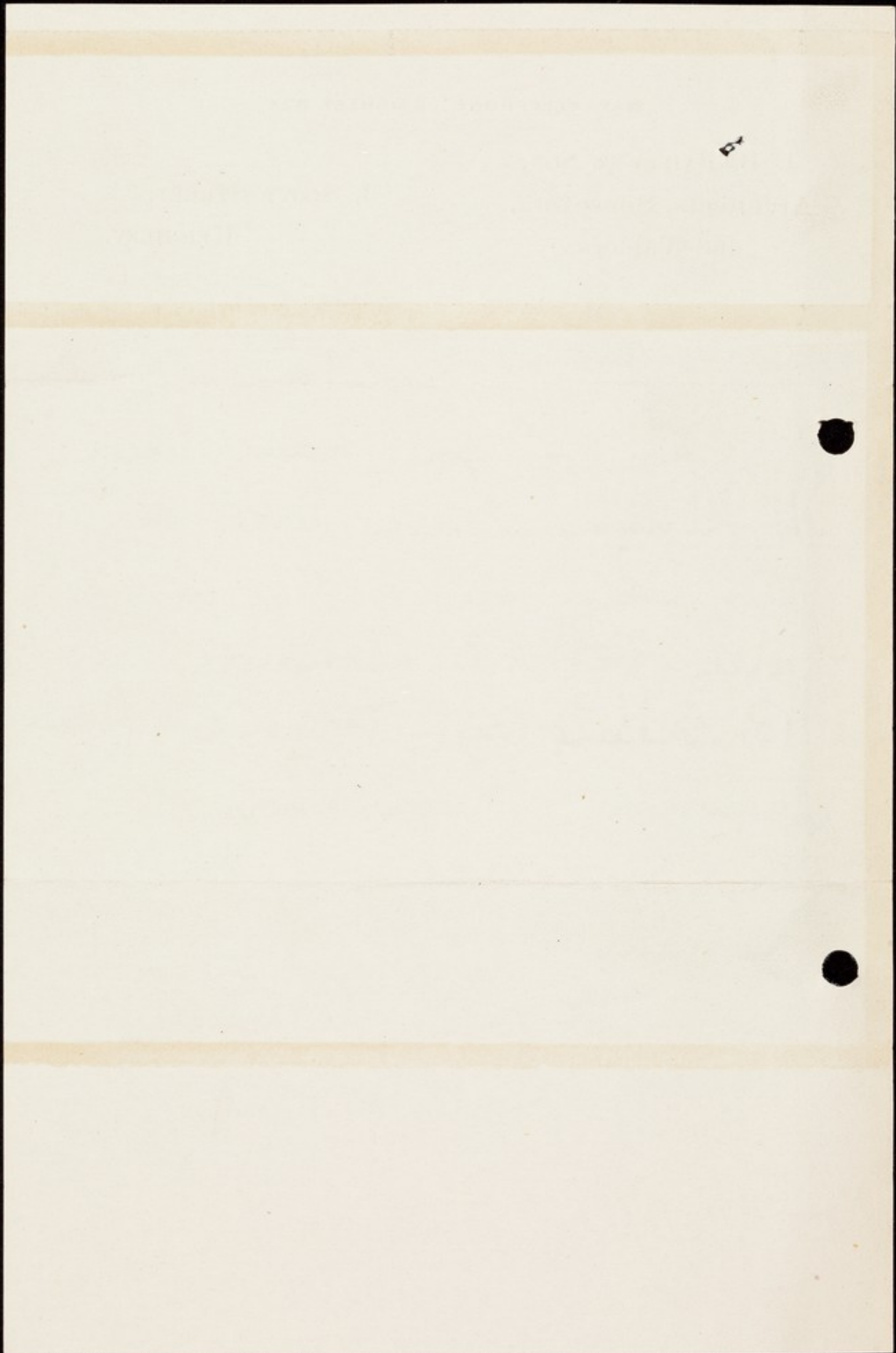

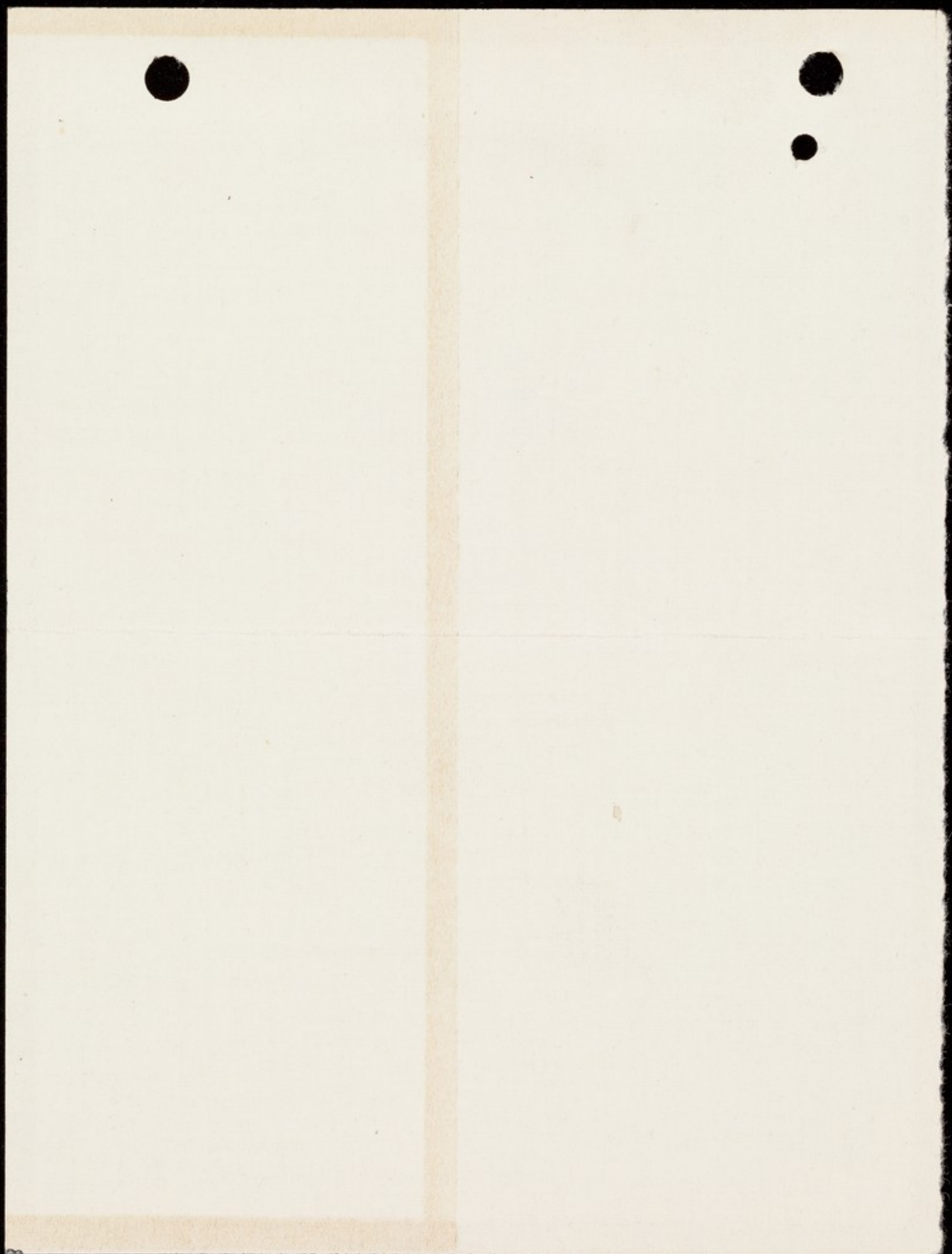

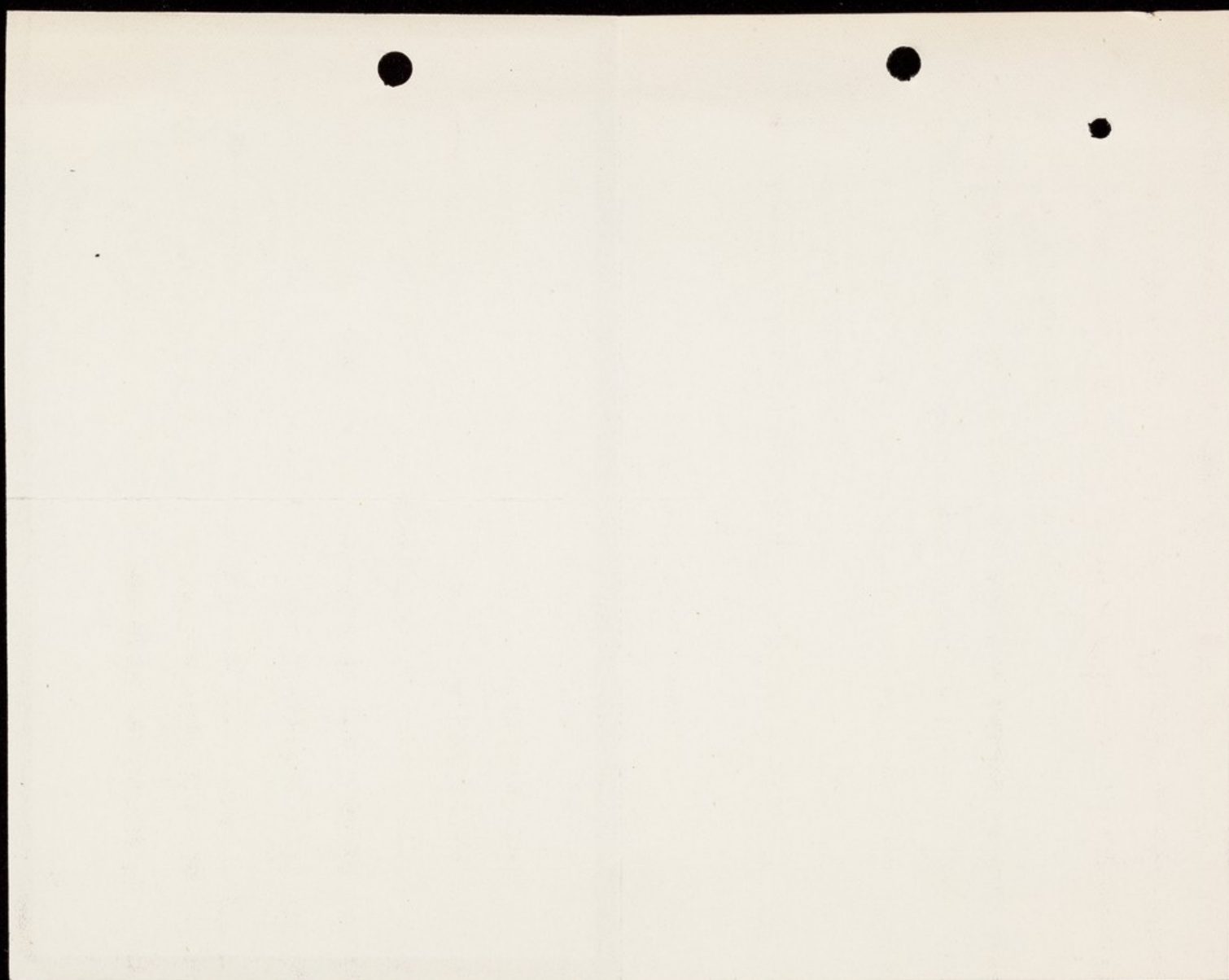

Dear Sir,

I am sorry to trouble you with reference to your certificate for Mr. Bailey, but I am satisfied that the Commissioners will take exception to it. I am therefore sending it back to ask you to make some additions. The essential part of the certificate consists of those facts observed at the time of the examination, and all you say is "He is very quiet and looks at one in a suspicious manner", which does not appear to me sufficient evidence of insanity. The observations relative to your previous visit are of no value except in a supplementary way. Can you not therefore add something observed at your interview on Nov. 28th which more clearly indicates insanity than the words you have used?

As you will see on the marginal notes, the full name, address and description of informants must be given. These are omitted in your certificate.

I hardly like to appear critical, but your statement that he is suffering from delusions "such as fighting with his son" is not very clear. Could you not say the nature of the delusions which led him to fight with his son?

I am very sorry to trouble you, but in these matters the Commissioners are necessarily particular as they form part of the legal authority for depriving a person of his liberty.

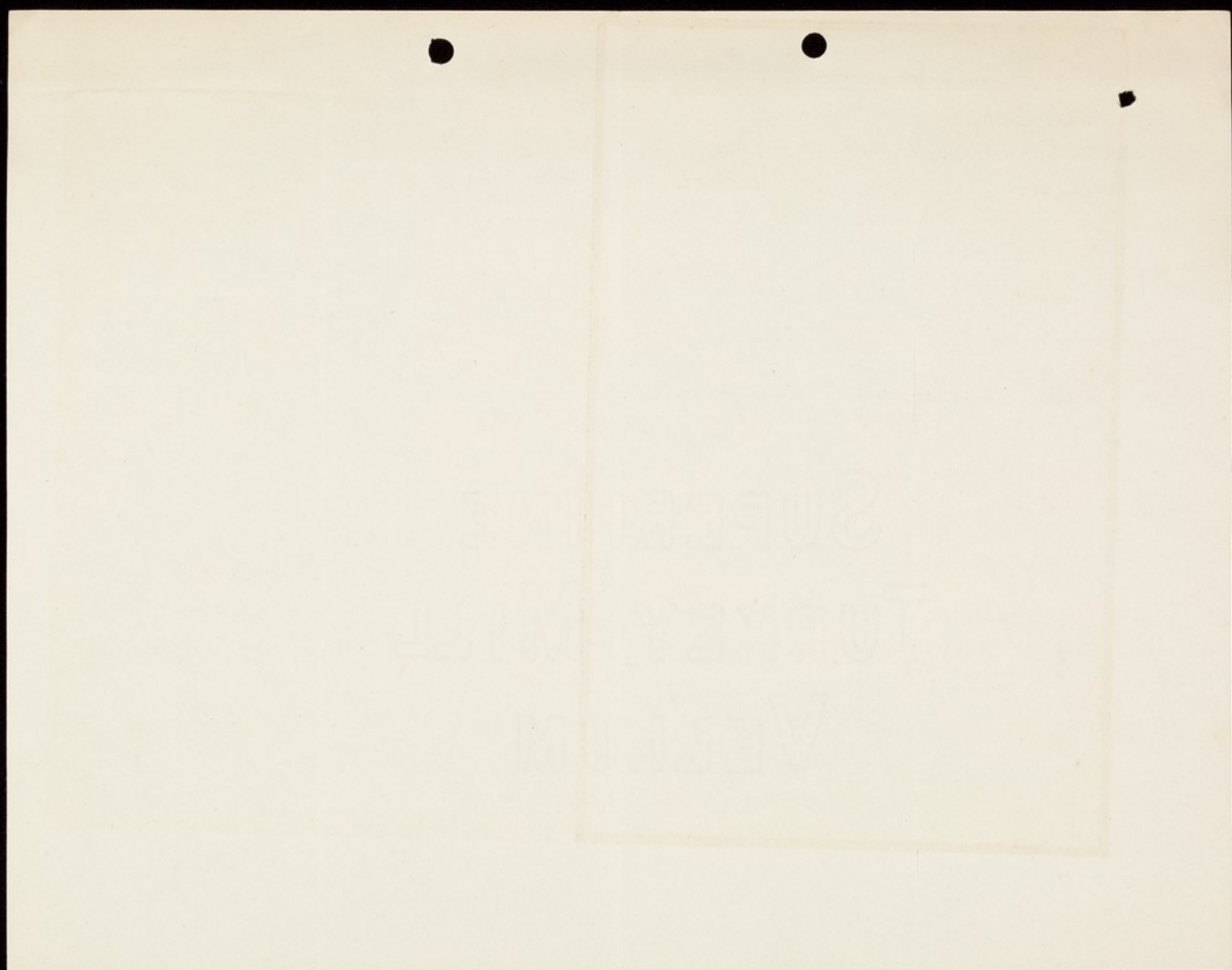

I could not undertake.

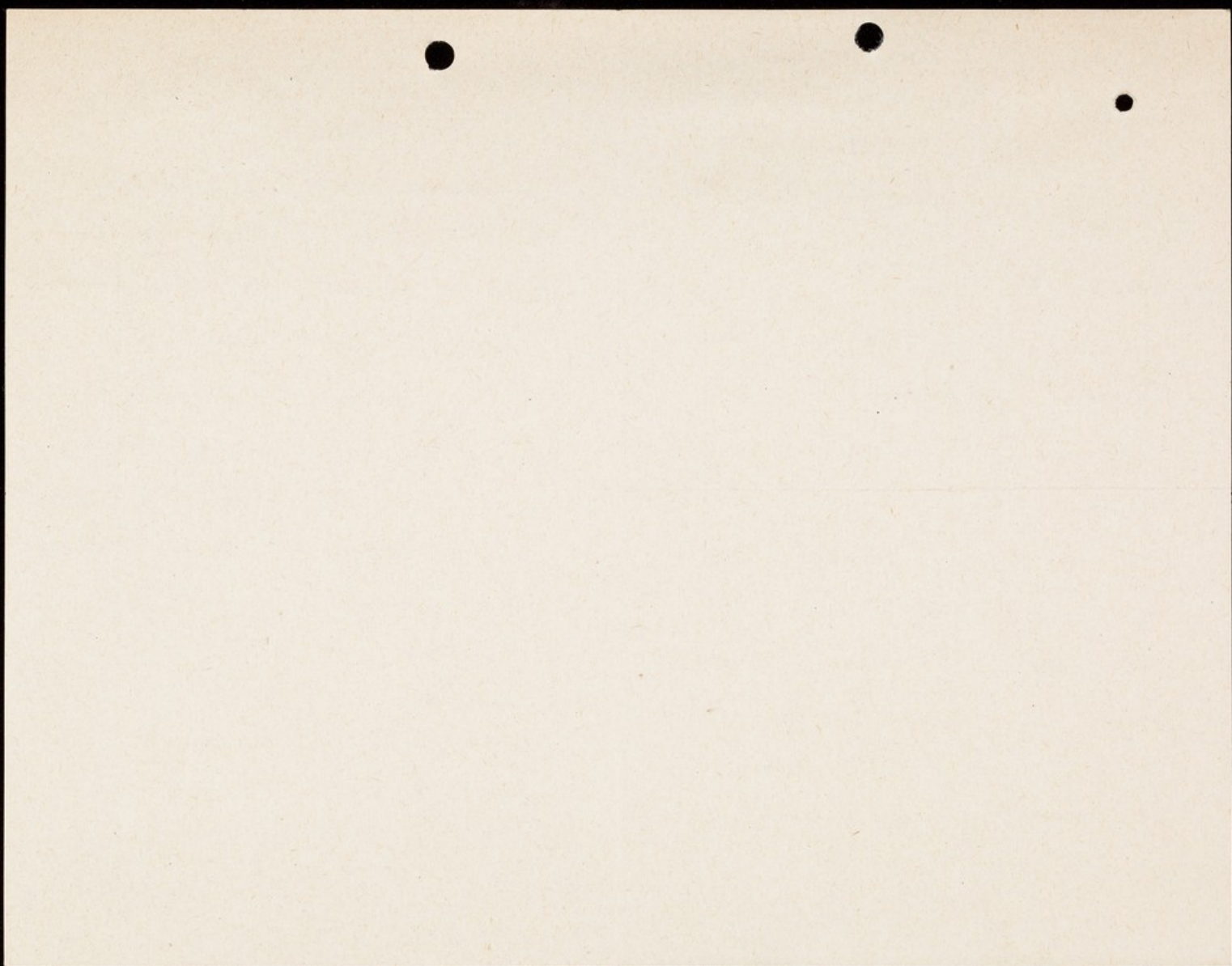
On hearing favourably

YORK RETREAT HOSPITAL FOR THE INSANE.

In consideration of the Directors of the York Retreat Hospital for the Insane agreeing to receive Joseph Roth Bailey of Keighley as a patient in the said Hospital, I HEREBY UNDERTAKE AND AGREE with Richard Thompson of Dringcliffe, The Mount, York the Treasurer of the said Hospital, to pay or cause to be paid, to the said Richard Thompson as such Treasurer, or to the Treasurer for the time being of the said Hospital, all such Sum or Sums of Money as shall from time to time be or become due and payable for the Lodging, Maintenance, and care of the said patient in the said Hospital, or whilst under the charge of the Authorities of the said Hospital, and all such Sum or Sums of Money as shall be paid or disbursed by or on behalf of the said Institution for any articles of Wearing Apparel, or other necessities, or extras supplied to, or provided for the said Patient, or the repairing or mending and washing of the articles of Wearing Apparel of the said Patient, so long as the said Patient shall continue in the said Hospital, or be under the charge of the Authorities of the said Hospital, and also to pay or cause to be paid the expenses in respect of the Funeral of the said Patient, in case the said Patient shall die in the said Hospital, or whilst under the charge of the Authorities of the said Hospital. AND I FURTHER AGREE to pay interest at the rate of five per cent. per annum on any accounts due from me as above, which shall not have been discharged within Twenty-eight days from the receipt of such account from the Treasurer, Secretary or Clerk of the said Hospital. AND I ALSO UNDERTAKE AND AGREE, at my own expense, to remove the said Patient from the said Hospital within Fourteen days after receiving Notice in writing from the Treasurer, Secretary or Clerk for the time being of the said Hospital, requiring such removal.

N.B.—The charge for Board, Lodging and Medical care is payable quarterly, in advance. Disbursements by the Institution on behalf of patients, and other exceptional expenses, are charged in the following quarter's account. A residence of less than a month is charged as a month.

In the event of the death, removal, or discharge of a patient before the expiry of the quarter covered by the last payment, the surplus amount is returned by the Retreat.



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
