

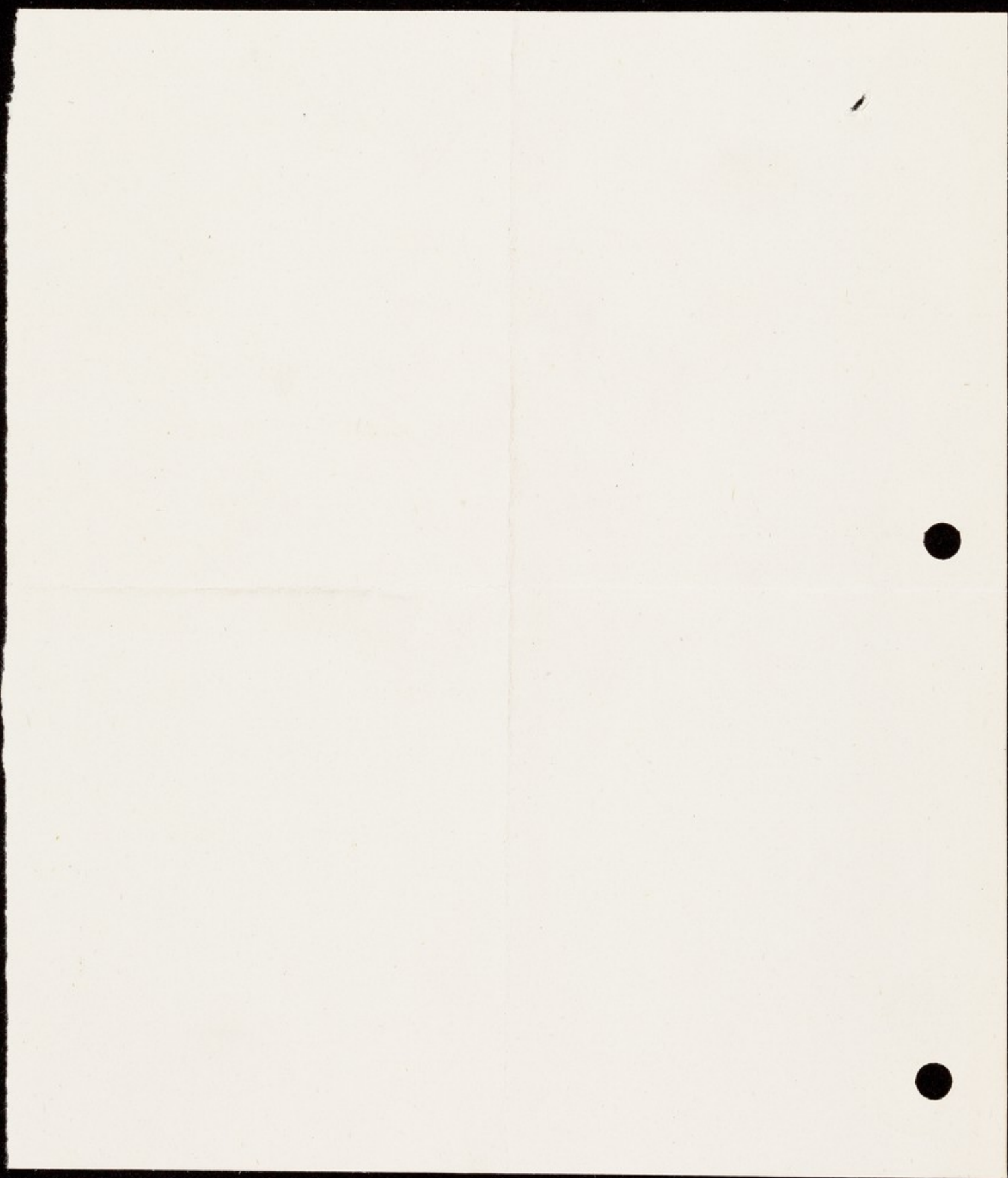

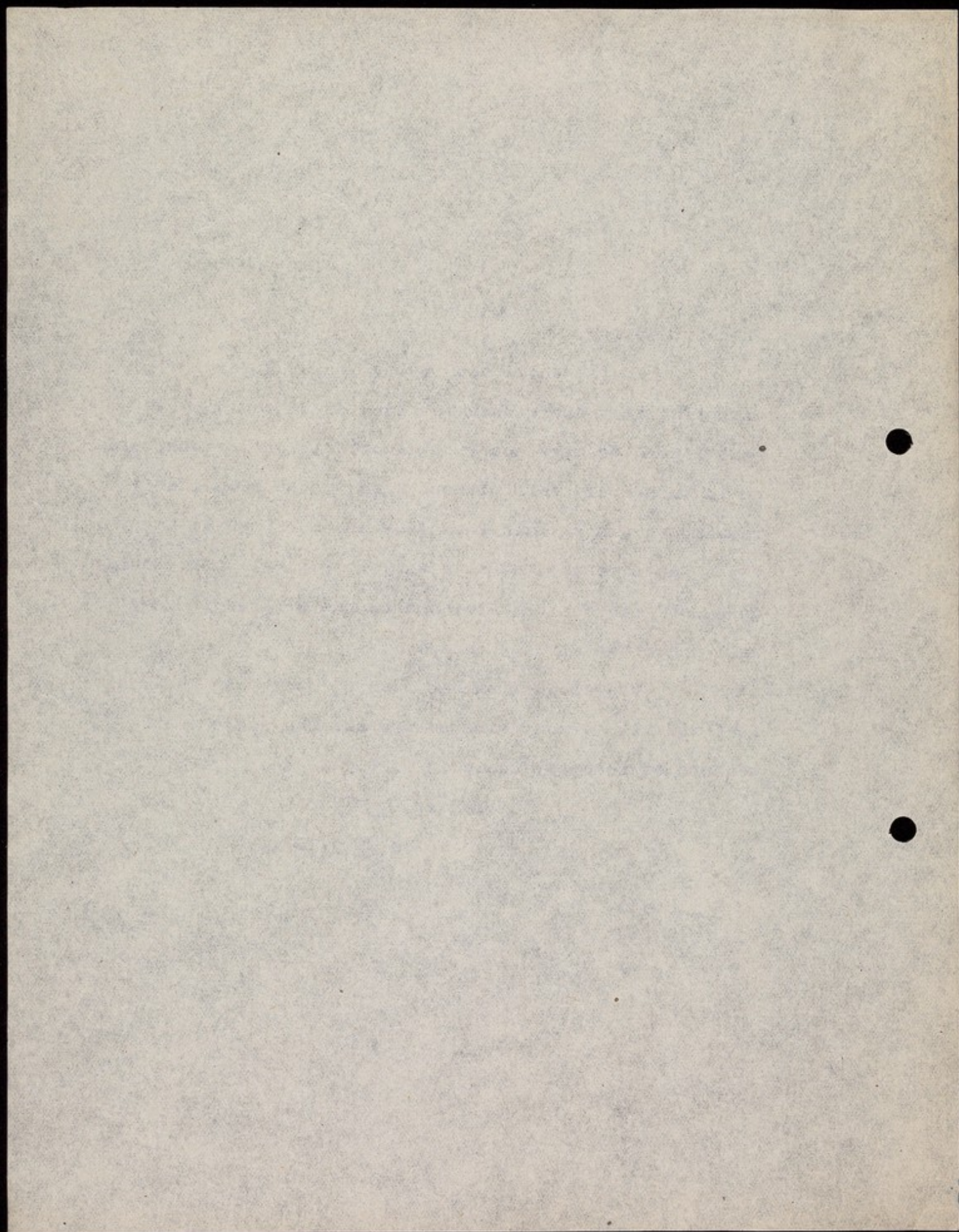
Dear Mr. Boulby,

The delusions remain; we can explain them away and he is quite happy for a few moments, and then they come back. Mr. Boulby does not give any trouble, and he has settled in very well under the circumstances.

The alcoholism has been of such long duration that it will be some time before one can judge what measure of recovery there is likely to be.
