Dear Madam,

I have received your letter and note that you are unable to continue to pay for the maintenance of your sister. Before taking steps as to this I had better inform you that Miss Hughes must be transferred to the locality to which she is chargeable, and this means that she will be transferred to the Carmarthen Asylum. I have no doubt the Guardians of the Poor will call on Mrs. Hughes and arrange for her to defray the cost of Miss Hughes's maintenance. It seems to me that this course cannot possibly be avoided. The only alternative that I can see is for you to send us £65 for what is owed to the Retreat to the end of the quarter. If these arrears are paid I shall then be better able to ask the Superintendent at the York City Asylum to receive Miss Hughes, but I could not do so unless I could assure him that there was no difficulty on the score of payments. No doubt they would require payment in advance. This practically means that unless you can send \$80 at once I must act upon the letter received and arrange for Miss Hughes's transfer to the Carmatthen Asylum. The latter would seem to me much the better course. The Carmarthen Asylum is a thoroughly good institution, quite up to date in its methods, and you can be satisfied that Miss Hughes would receive every possible care and attention there.

I enclose a telegraph form for immediate reply as to which course is to be taken. Please understand that there must be no delay in the matter.

I am sorry that you are in such an awkward position. It, however, seems quite clear that you will only add to your difficulties if the cost of maintenance for your sister continues to be beyond your means.

Dear Madam,

Dr. Pierce, who has been called away today, wishes me to reply to your letter and say he is very sory to hear of the awkward position in which you are placed, and he would suggest that you should consult a first class solicitor, who would no doubt help you to arrange your affairs.

In the meantime it will not assist you to get more and more into debt, and it is therefore desirable that Miss Hughes should be moved from the Retreat at the earliest possible moment.

Two courses are open to you. First, that you write formally to Dr. Pierce, saying that no more money is forthcoming for her maintenance. He will then take the necessary steps for her being removed into a public institution.


The second course is that she should be transferred as a private patient to another institution; and the best suggestion we can make is that she should go to the City of York Asylum, Fulford, York, where we have ascertained she might possibly be received at the rate of 21/- a week provided the money is paid in advance.

In the latter case you must apply to the Commissioners in Lunacy, 66 Victoria St., Westminster, London W., for permission to transfer her.

Dr. Pierce wishes you to know that a transfer of this kind will not be in any way deleterious to the patient, and he sees no reason why it should not be carried out.




The arrears of the account already furnished to March 31st amount to £64.13.1. This must be paid at once. There will, of course, be another small account in addition for disbursements.
