Dear Sir,

I send you a copy of the Retreat Report which will give you some particulars of the Institution, and I think we could receive Mrs. Kenny if it be necessary in the course of a few days. Just at the present moment we are very full at the Retreat. I send also the necessary forms for admission.

With regard to terms, the lowest rate is 48/- a week, but many of our patients pay higher rates, especially when special care and supervision are necessary. The Committee meet on Tuesday next, and the question of terms can be considered if in the mean time you will let me know whether there are any specially anxious circumstances attending the case and whether special care and supervision will be necessary.

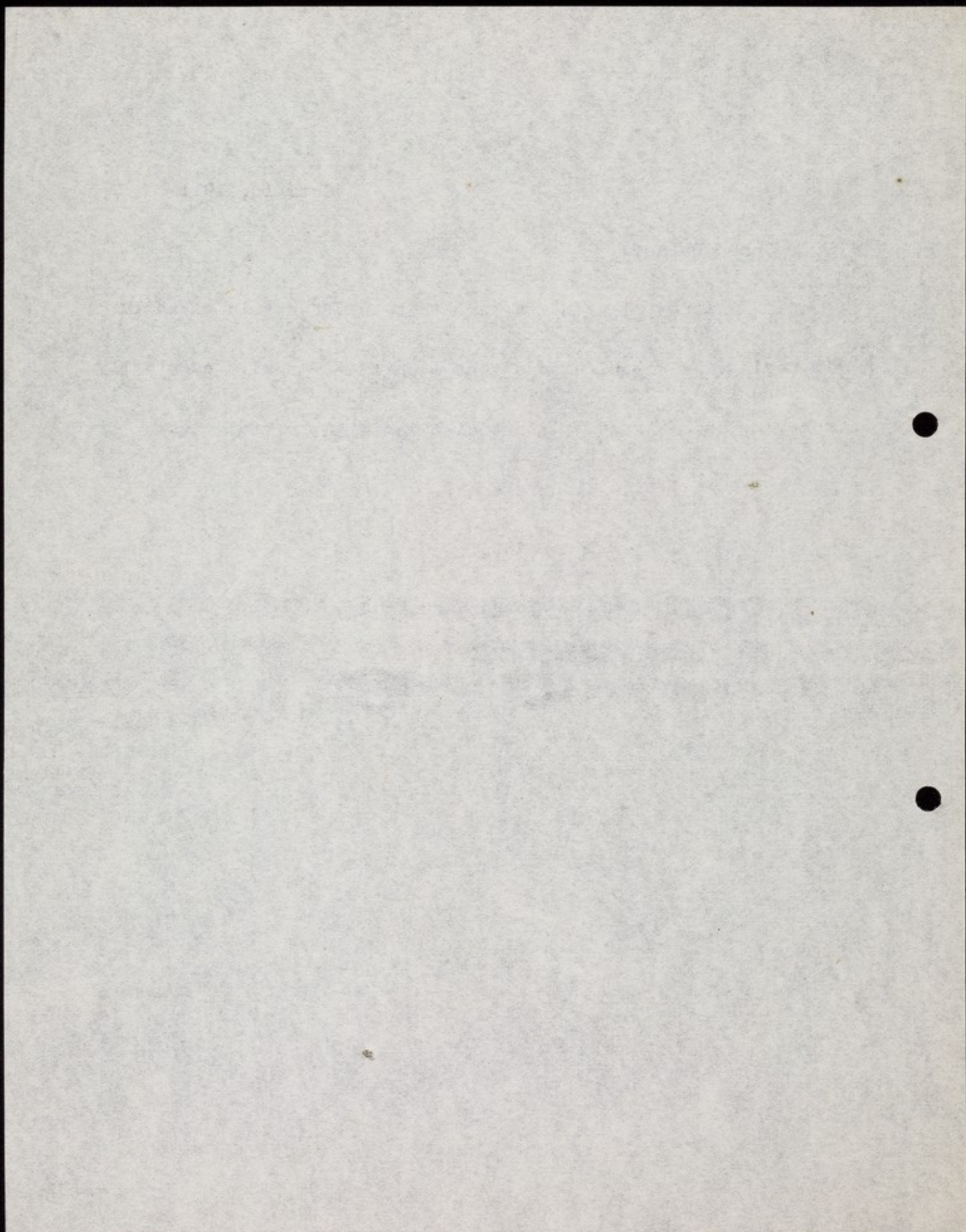
Dear Canon Dolan,

Dear Sir,

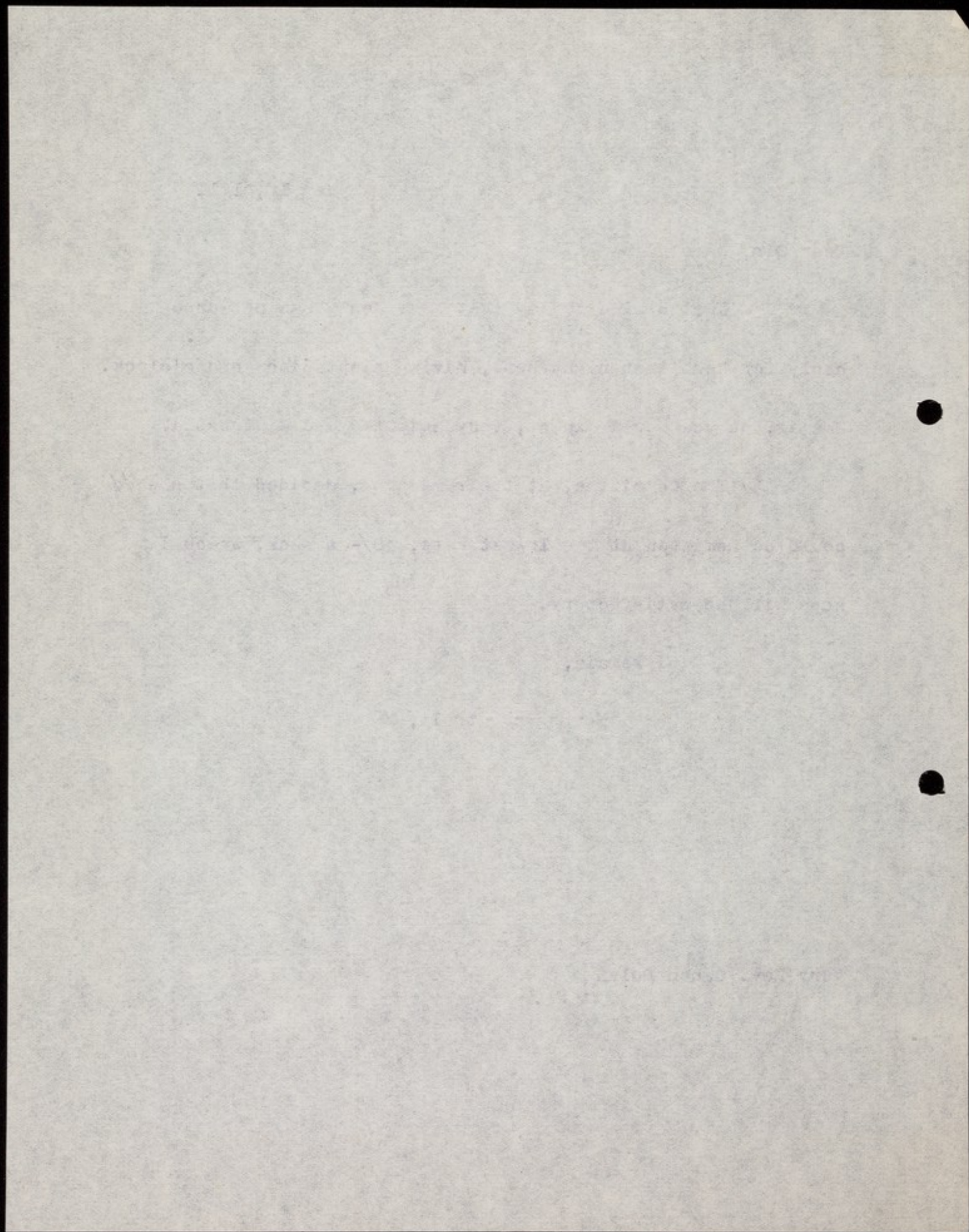
Just a line to say that Mrs. Kenny has not done badly for her first night here, having slept since one o'clock. She is, as you would expect, very agitated and distressed.
