Dear Sir,

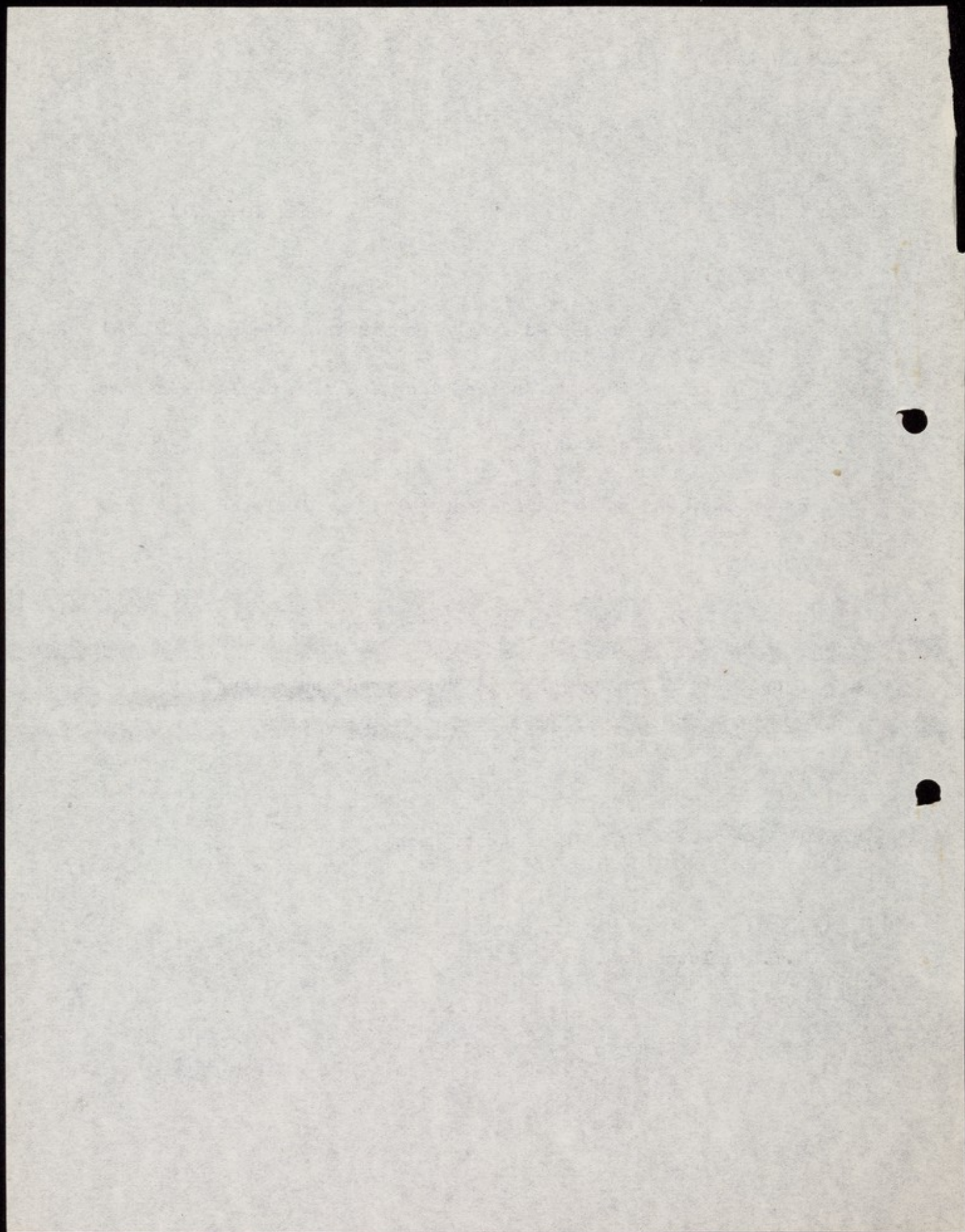

Dear Dr. Blackburn,

We think the time has come for Mr. Middleton to leave Throxenby Hall. He is very much better mentally, but is becoming indolent, and, evidently, knows he is comfortable. He is, moreover, getting fat, and weighs 12 st. He says, himself, that he is not able to return to his work. This may be so, but I should think he is now well enough to be turned out on the land, somewhere or other, and do some hard work of a mechanical nature. He is not altogether idle, but the atmosphere of Throxenby is, I fear, not sufficiently active, especially as, at the present time, the place is largely given over to women patients, who are on a visit from the Retreat.

I was pleased to find Boddington so nicely: he is spending the week-end there.

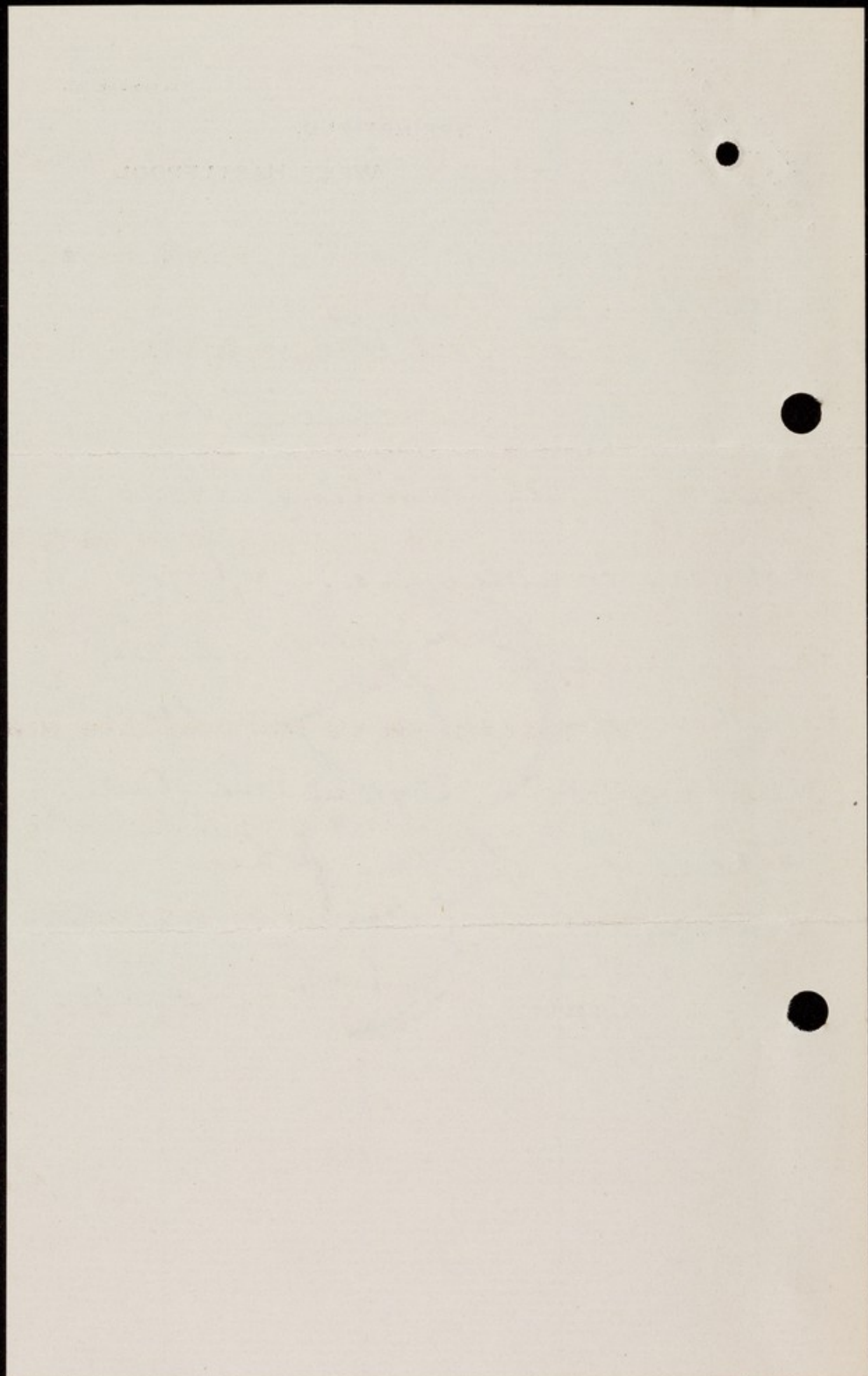

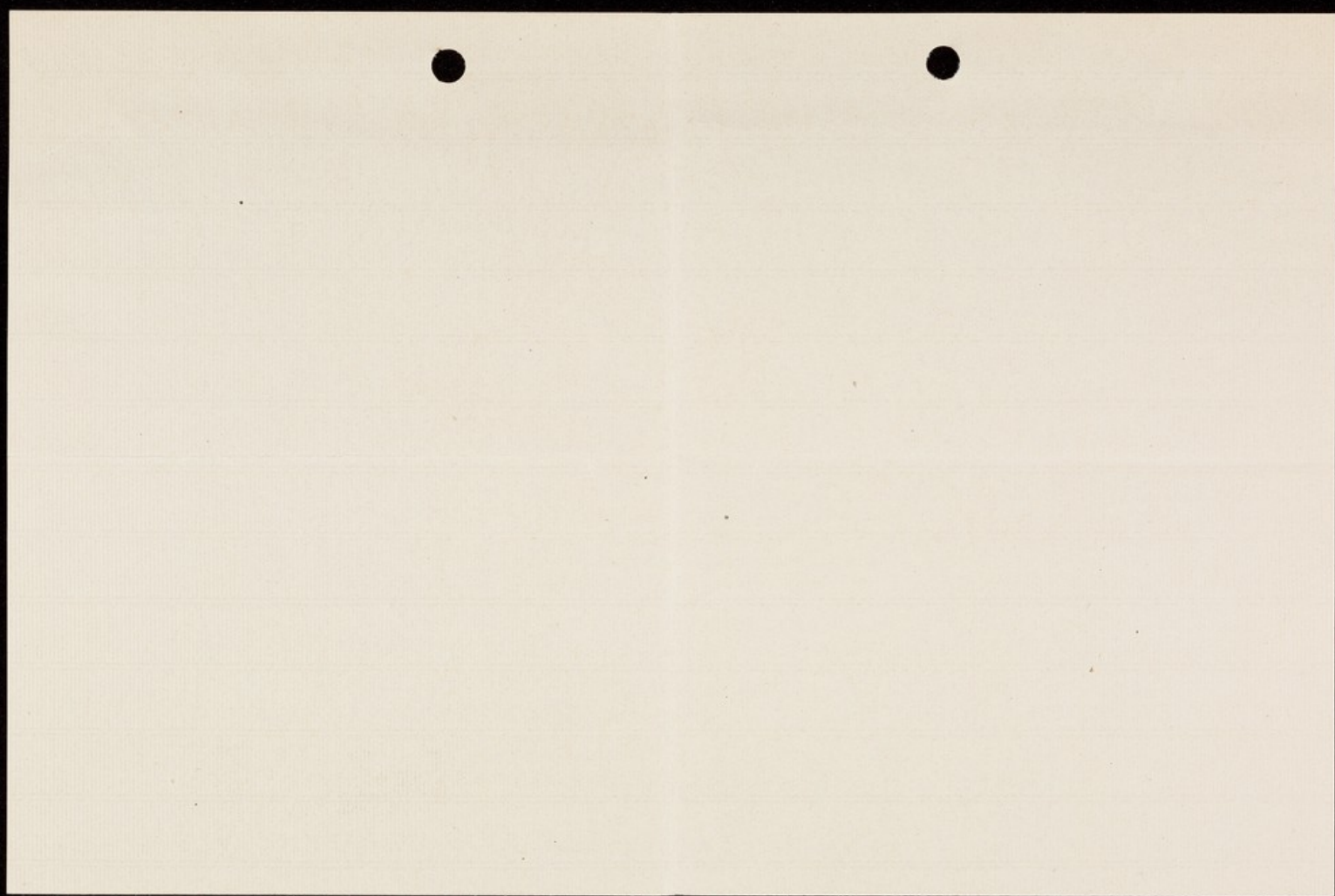
