Frequently complains of pain in her head, also in her leg & foot. but walks quite comfortably. Employ herself with needlework, & occasionally writes a letter. Soil rather fecally. Urine passed frequently in very small quantities.
- Sept 5th Condition much the same. Depressed at times. Visited by her Sister & Brother yesterday.
- " 12th Pt. has been very irritable & worrying during the week. Is full of fears about herself & constantly complaining about peculiar feelings in her head.
- " 26th Delusions seem to be developing. Constantly says she is being poisoned & asking to be spared. Is very agitated & worrying. & says something is going to happen to her. Visited by her Brother & two friends. Went into Town & had lunch with them.
- Oct 3rd Pt. continues most worrying, agitated & deluded. Has been troublesome over her food the last few days & says there is poison in it. Quantity of urine increased. 1 to 2 pts in 24 hrs.

When food is placed in front of her pt does not feel inclined to take it often leaving it unless spoon fed.

To day pt has answered quite sensibly when spoken to. Becoming restless & deluded to wards night.

Slept 1 hr very restless & muttering the whole night.

24th

A fairly good day. quiet.

Slept well - 5 hrs.

25th

Confused and restless all day complains of her feet being on fire

Slept 5 hrs.

26th

Rather confused all day.

Apr 1st

Pt has been very trouble some for a few days, & often pays no attention to the calls of nature.

Often is very excited and noisy and is very resistive when attended to.

Sleep is disturbed and scanty, frequently not more than two hrs during the night.

3rd

Pt still is very trouble some and looks very ill. Back is very sore but pt does not complain. Dressings cannot be kept on back owing to the extreme restlessness of patient.

April 11th

Pt continues to be excited and confused alternately, and for some days has been kept in bed.

During the day pt frequently asks to be taken home, and when told she is not well enough becomes excited.

On April 3rd pt was very troublesome and noisy. Gr^{ss} of Chloralamide was given with fair result.

April 5th Gr^{ss} Chloralamide was again given to pt with good result. also on the 8th pt was again very troublesome. Chloralamide Gr^{ss} given.

April 17th

To-day the 11th patient has been very quiet and fairly sensible. Tried to feed herself, but has become too shaky to do so, now, without assistance.

April 23rd

Pt is up and dressed, but is very confused. Does not often speak, unless questioned and it is with difficulty, and usually broken and incoherent sentences.

Slept 6 hrs

" 29th

Pt had a quiet day but is very confused, and taking very little notice of surroundings.

May 5th

Since April the 29th pt has been much quieter, to-day, however, has been very excited and troublesome trying to throw herself out of bed & when held became extremely violent.

Brought into the sitting room to tea & seems a little more settled and comfortable.

Pt. much quieter today, & takes food well. was restless early part of last night, since slept 5 hrs.

May 7th

Fairly quiet most of the day, inclined to be restless & trying to get out of bed, taking food fairly well, has a sore on back which cannot heal owing to Pt's restlessness & the difficulty of keeping dressings on.

- 8th Had 6 hrs quiet sleep, is quieter today.
- 9th Has been very noisy again today & could not be kept in bed, so brought into the sitting room for 3 hrs. Cried bitterly when the piano was played, but could give no reason for doing so. Talking most of the day but difficult to understand. Pt. has had a much quieter day, content to stay in bed, is taking food well, back much the same.
- 13th Pt. visited by her brothers & sister-in-law, talked very well to them, asked for cakes & fruit as she did not have enough to eat. was very excited after their visit & wanted to go out to them.
- 16th Days much the same usually Pt. very excited & noisy one day & night, then a quieter day & night. is taking food very well, & seems always ready for it.
- 17th Had a restless night & has been noisy today. Had a bath this afternoon which she always dislikes very much so screamed & cried all the time. Is out on the balcony most days.
- 19th Slept for 5 hrs last night, was visited yesterday by Mrs Bee & two friends, seemed pleased to see them & talked well to them, quieter after their departure, has been more restless today & very noisy at times, on the balcony most of the day.
- 20th Pt. continues very much the same, some days very restless & will not stay in bed.

Pt continues much the same, still restless June 2.
& at times very excited

Back is very slowly improving, if well enough sits up for a few hrs in the afternoon

10th

Visited by her Brothers, but Pt was inclined to be drowsy & did not talk much to them.

Pt is inclined to be very greedy over food, & has much difficulty in swallowing it.

Visited by her brother, Pt was very confused.

24th

28th

Pt had a fairly good day.

Troublesome towards night, trying to get out of bed. Slept 5 hrs

Fairly quiet day. Pt very drowsy.

30th

Very troublesome and restless.

July 2nd

Drowsy and quiet, rather difficult to feed. Comfortable night (wet)

6th

Excited and very restless.

7th

No sleep

8th

Troublesome and restless.

Slept well 8 hrs. pulse & feeble

14th

To day Pt has been very restless and fell out of bed & bruised her eye with knocking it against the commode

On the 15th Pt looked very poorly and there was much twitching of her limbs

17th

Visited by her sister and seemed to be much brighter by the visit.

Pt appears to be none the worse for her fall on the 14th.

Back is looking much better.

July 24th. Pt is looking very ill indeed, swallowing becomes more difficult - and there is much twitching of muscles of the face and limbs.
Temp is generally over 99° in the evening
Back still improving.

27th. Pt sitting up in chair most of the day very restless and excited, had to be held to prevent falling out of chair.
Has taken her food well to-day.
Pt looks very ill indeed, back is almost healed up.

In consideration of the Directors of the York Retreat Hospital for the Insane agreeing to receive Olive M. Palfrett of

as a patient in the said Hospital, I HEREBY UNDERTAKE AND AGREE with Richard Thompson of Dring etc, The Mount, York the Treasurer of the said Hospital, to pay or cause to be paid, to the said Richard Thompson as such Treasurer, or to the Treasurer for the time being of the said Hospital, all such Sum or Sums of Money as shall from time to time be or become due and payable for the Lodging, Maintenance, and care of the said patient in the said Hospital, or whilst under the charge of the Authorities of the said Hospital, and all such Sum or Sums of Money as shall be paid or disbursed by or on behalf of the said Institution for any articles of Wearing Apparel, or other necessities, or extras supplied to, or provided for the said Patient, or the repairing or mending and washing of the articles of Wearing Apparel of the said Patient, so long as the said Patient shall continue in the said Hospital, or be under the charge of the Authorities of the said Hospital, and also to pay or cause to be paid the expenses in respect of the Funeral of the said Patient, in case the said Patient shall die in the said Hospital, or whilst under the charge of the Authorities of the said Hospital. AND I FURTHER AGREE to pay interest at the rate of five per cent. per annum on any accounts due from me as above, which shall not have been discharged within Twenty-eight days from the receipt of such account from the Treasurer, Secretary or Clerk of the said Hospital. AND I ALSO UNDERTAKE AND AGREE, at my own expense, to remove the said Patient from the said Hospital within Fourteen days after receiving Notice in writing from the Treasurer, Secretary or Clerk for the time being of the said Hospital, requiring such removal.
