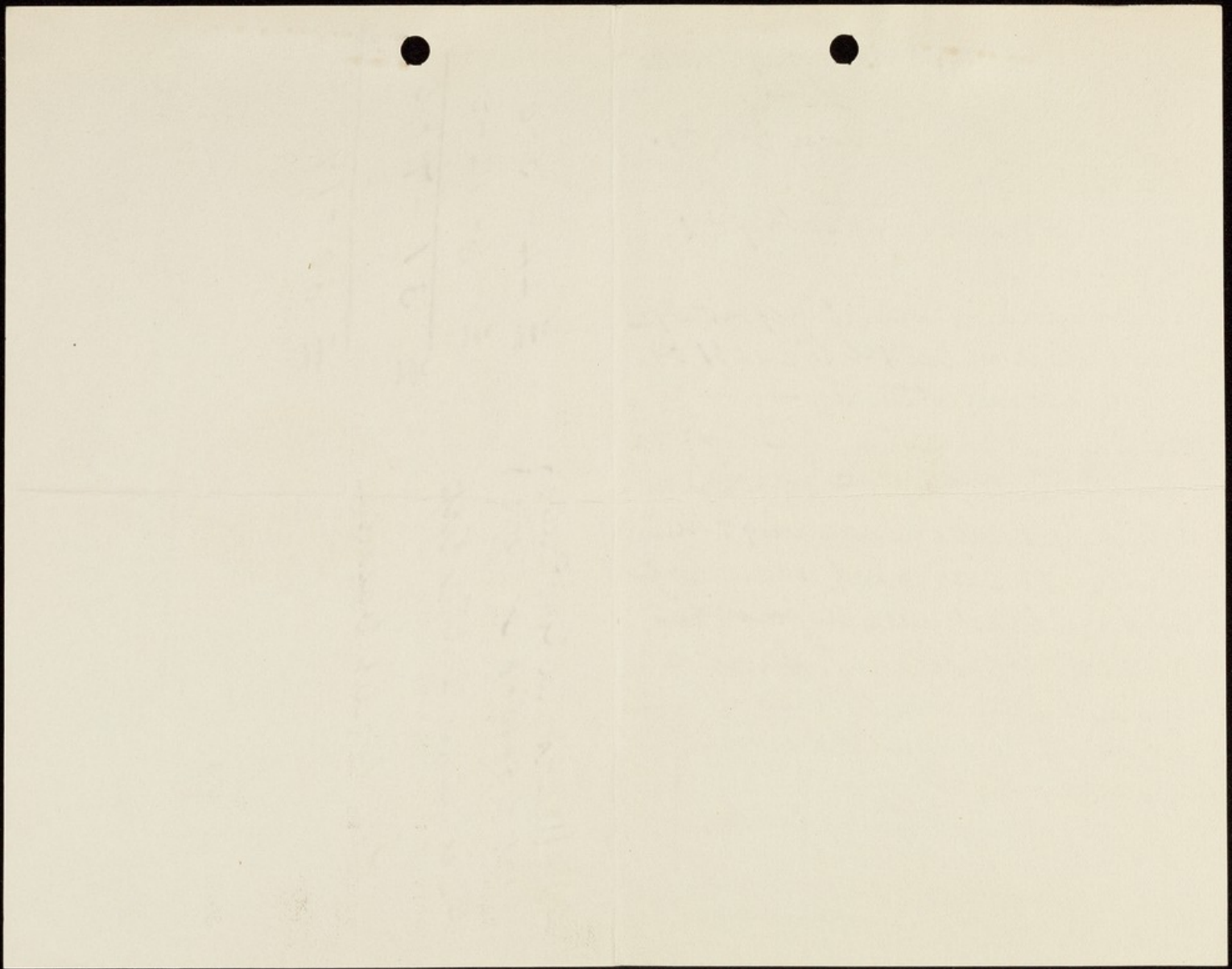

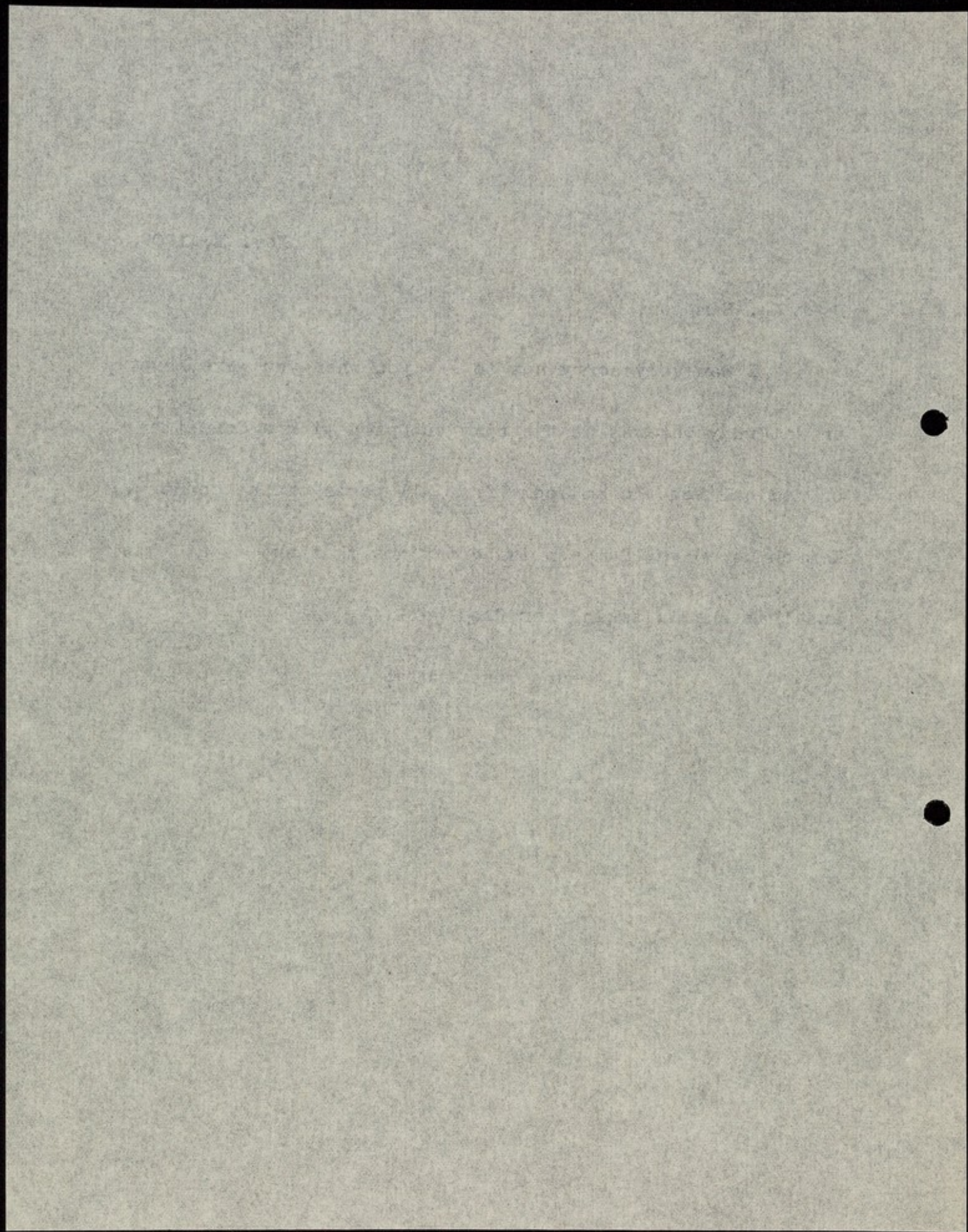
Nov. 1, 1909

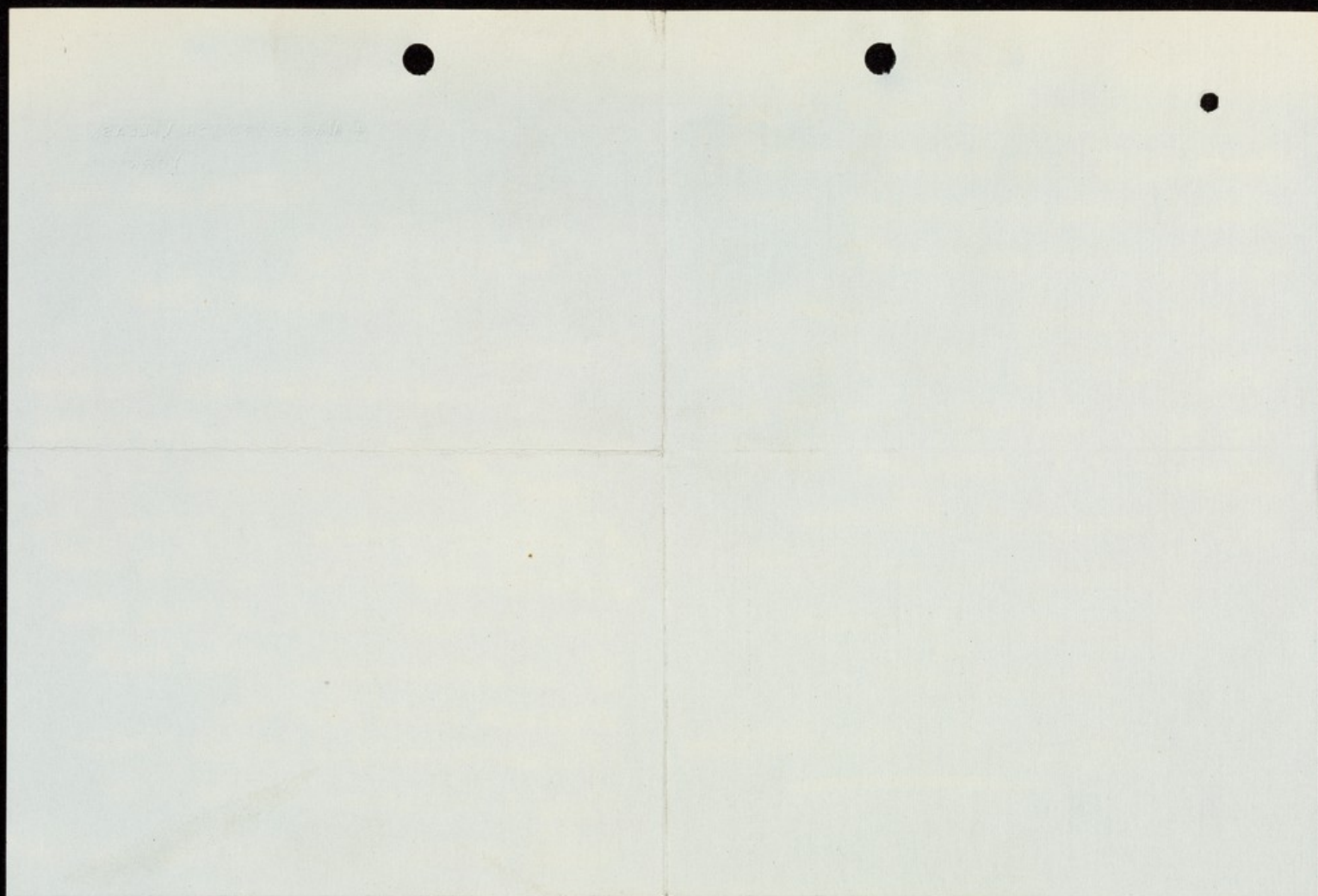

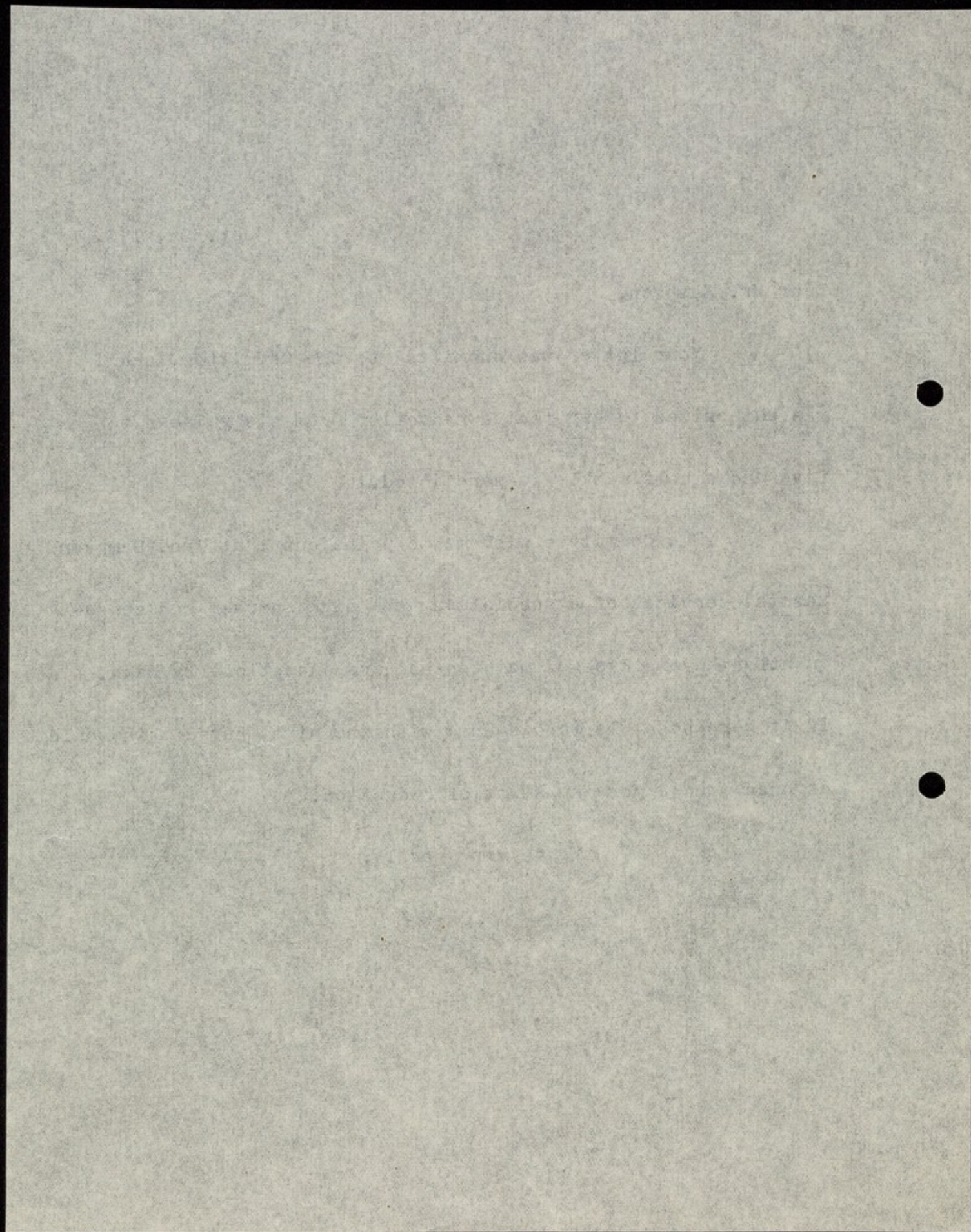
Dear Mr. Sampson,

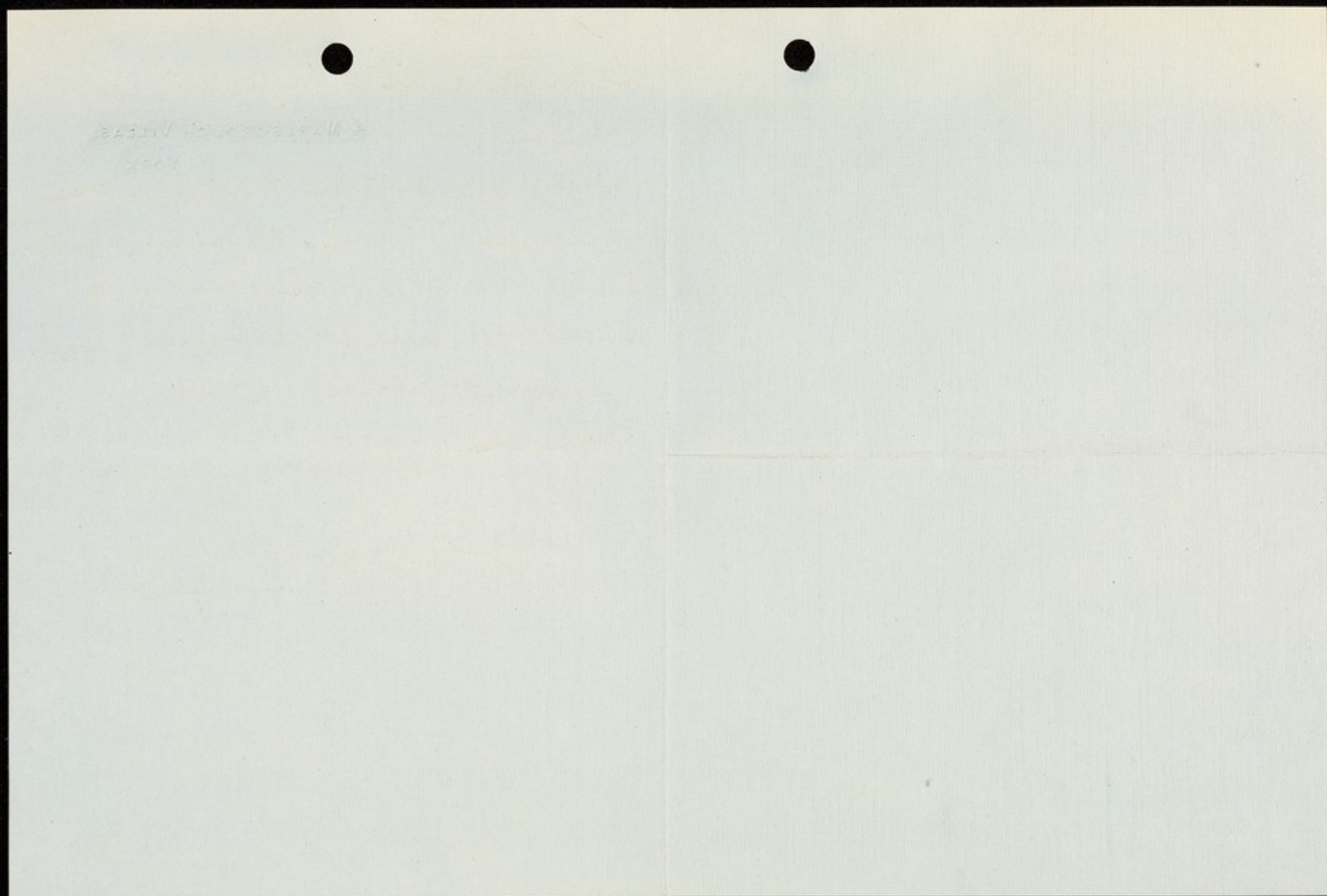

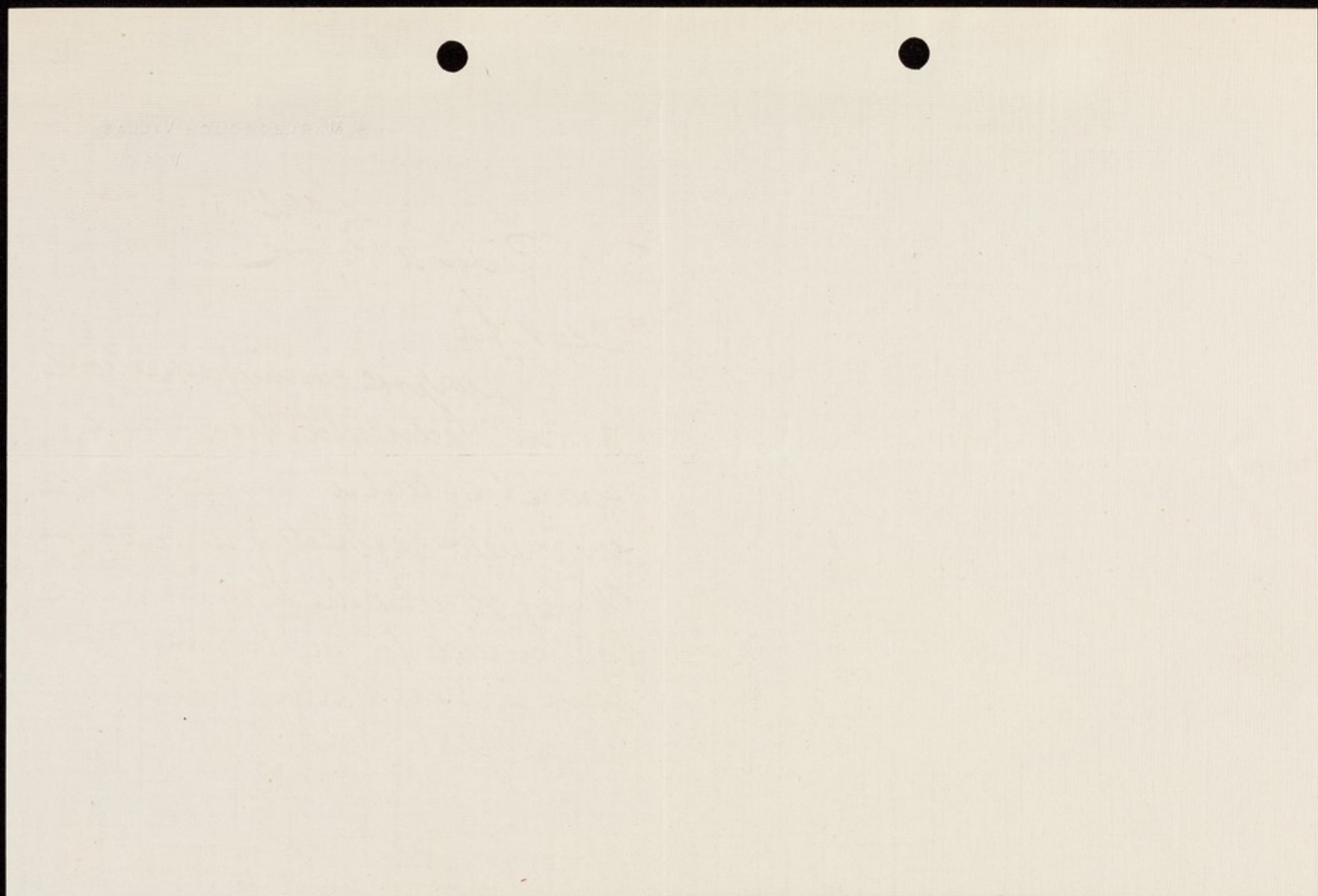

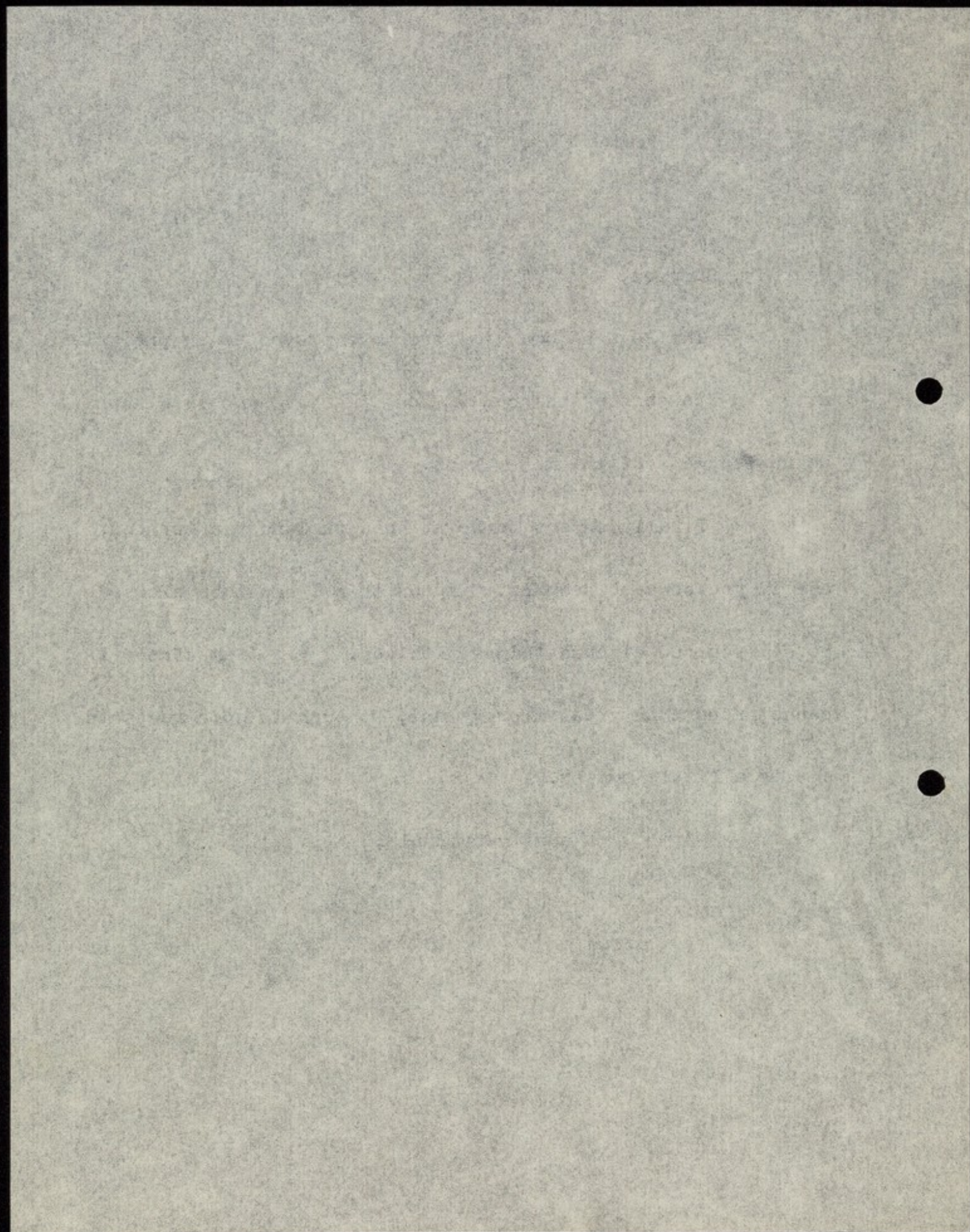
July 30, 1909
