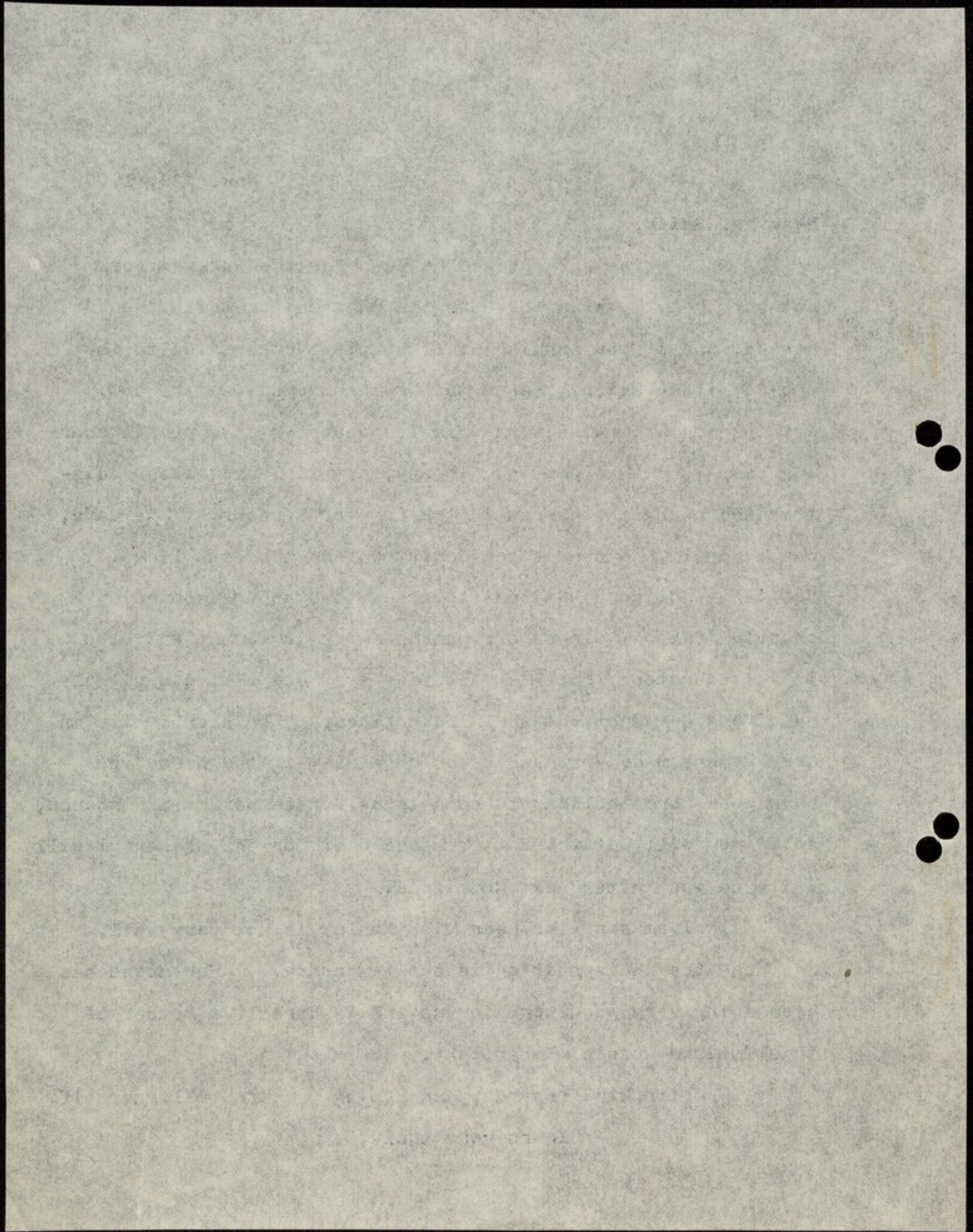
Dear Mr. Smith,

I quite agree that the fees for the Nurses* work out very heavily when the Nurse is engaged for a lengthened period, and if you permit I will submit the question to the Sub-Committee which manages the Trained Nurses Department. I think you are aware that this is conducted on a profit sharing basis and that profits, if any, are in large measure distributed among the Nurses in the form of a bonus. We have, consequently, to manage the department on business lines. But it is not good business to alienate a good customer by charging fees in excess of what the work is worth; and also it is understood that when the fees are more than can rightly be afforded reductions shall take place. We should like an arrangement made so that it would be easy if the Nurse you have goes for a holiday to come to us for temporary assistance, so if you will let the matter stand over for the present I will write to you after next Committee.

I am sorry to hear Miss Manley is not very well, and hope the indisposition is but temporary. Her nurse has been doing very good work for us and is herself a member of this Trained Nurses' Department.


