expiries.

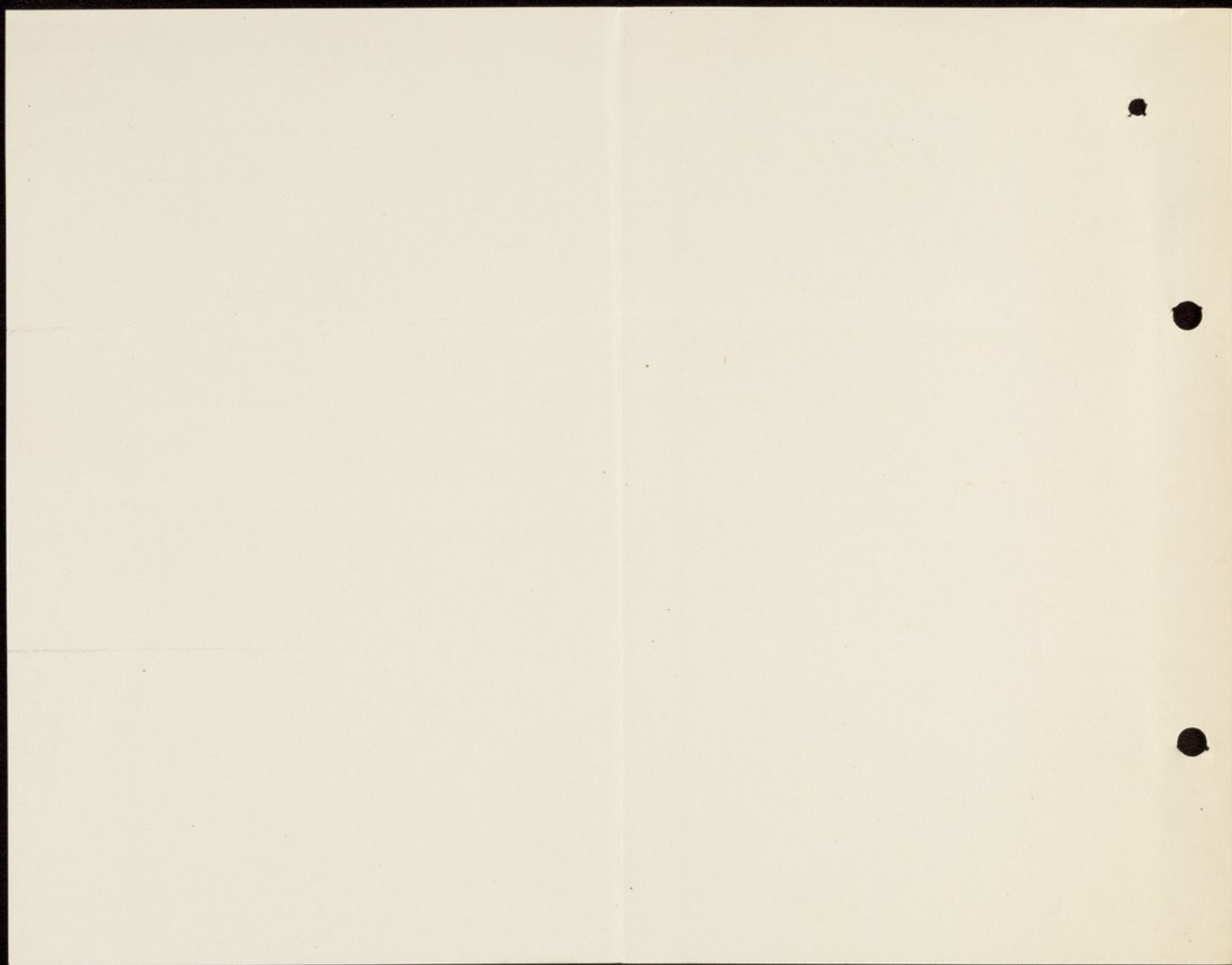

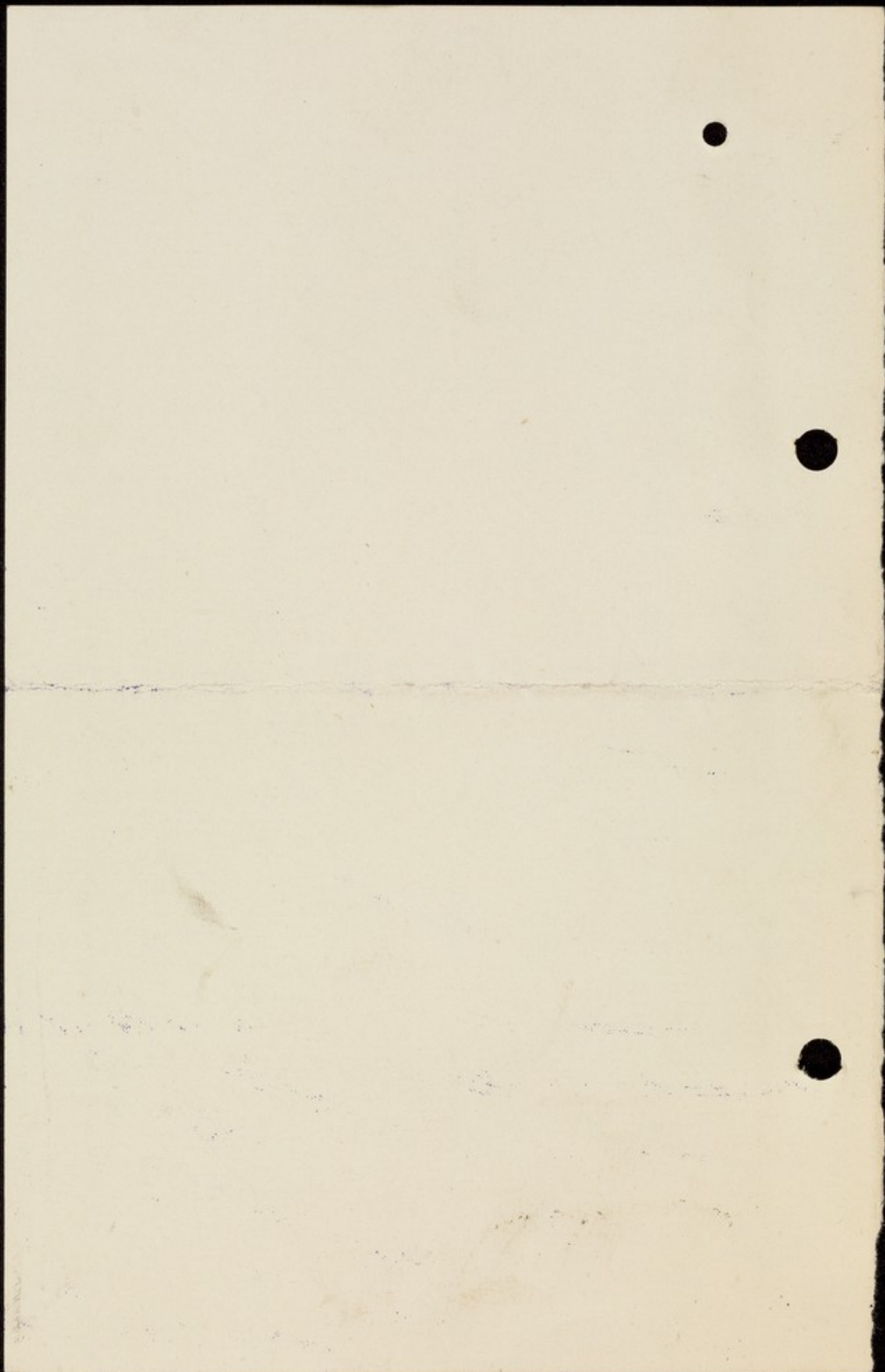

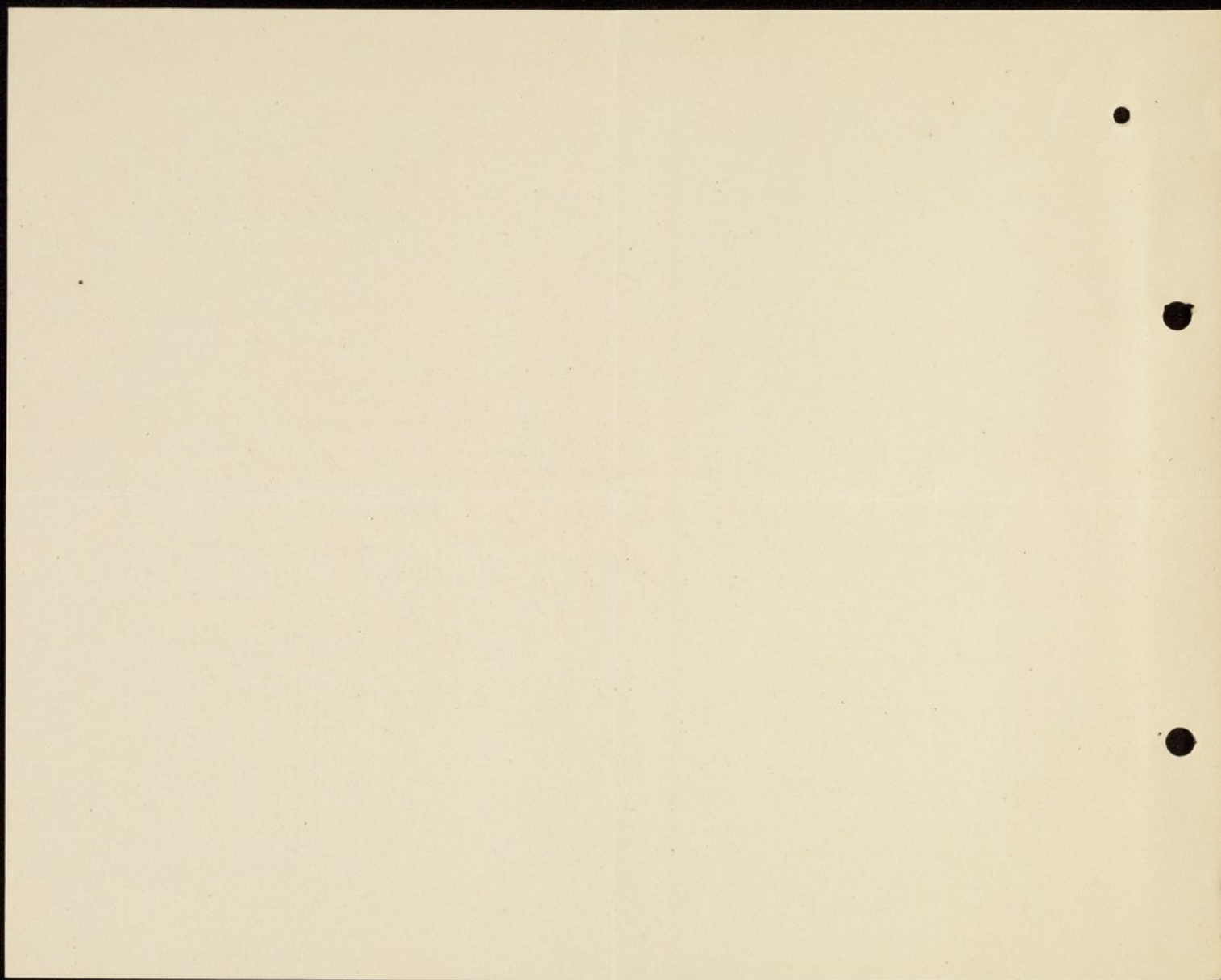
