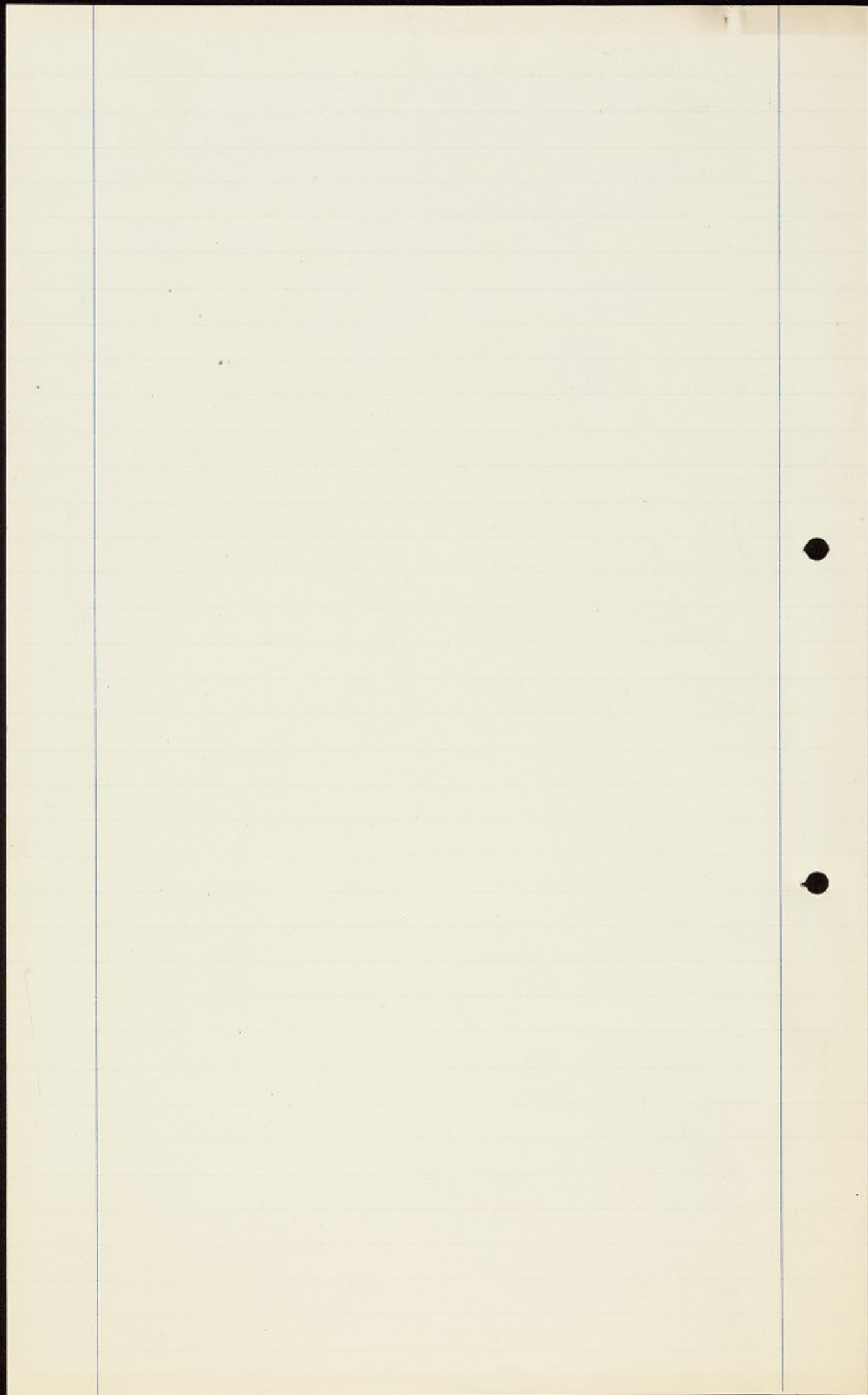

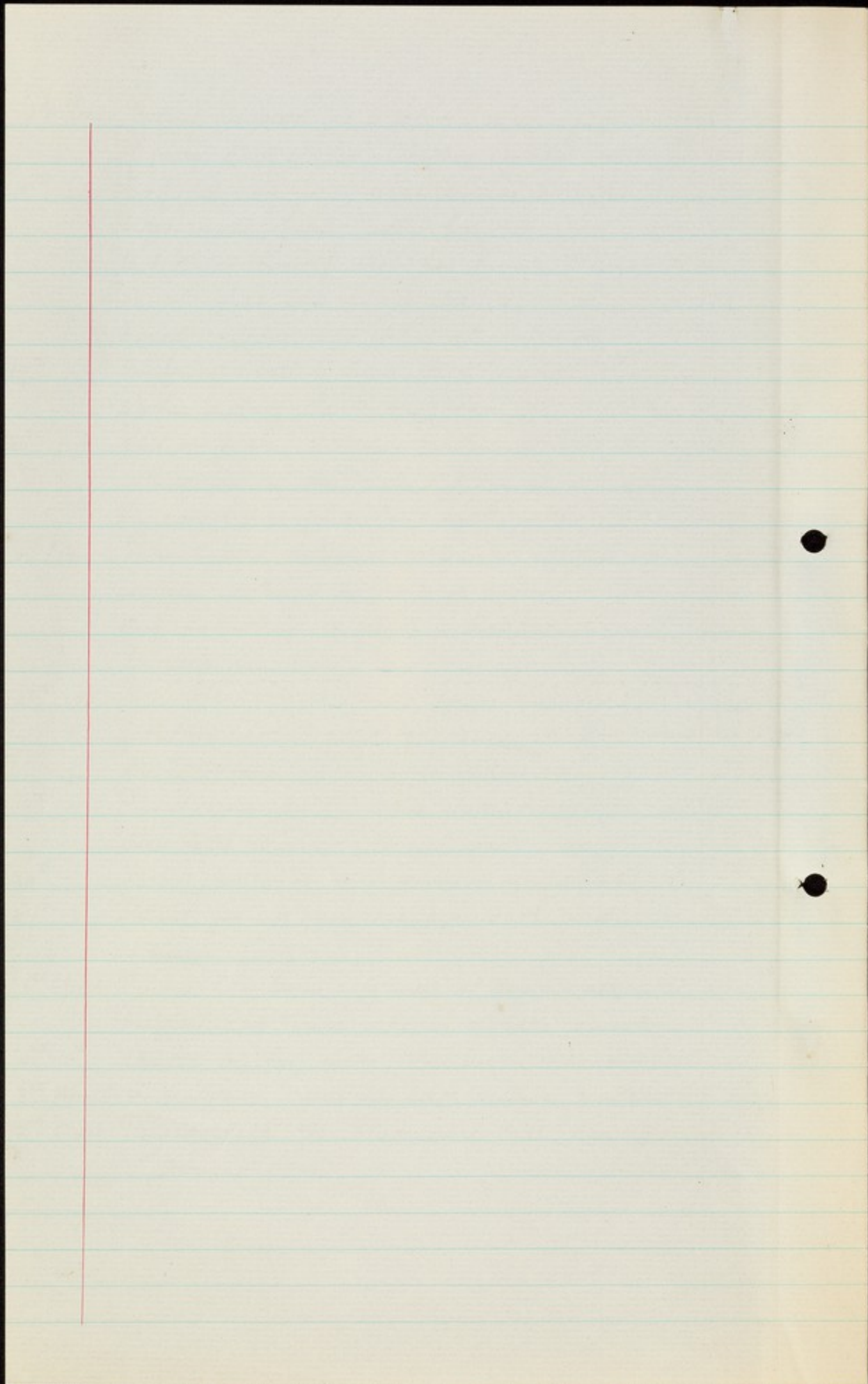
Abstract of Certificates.

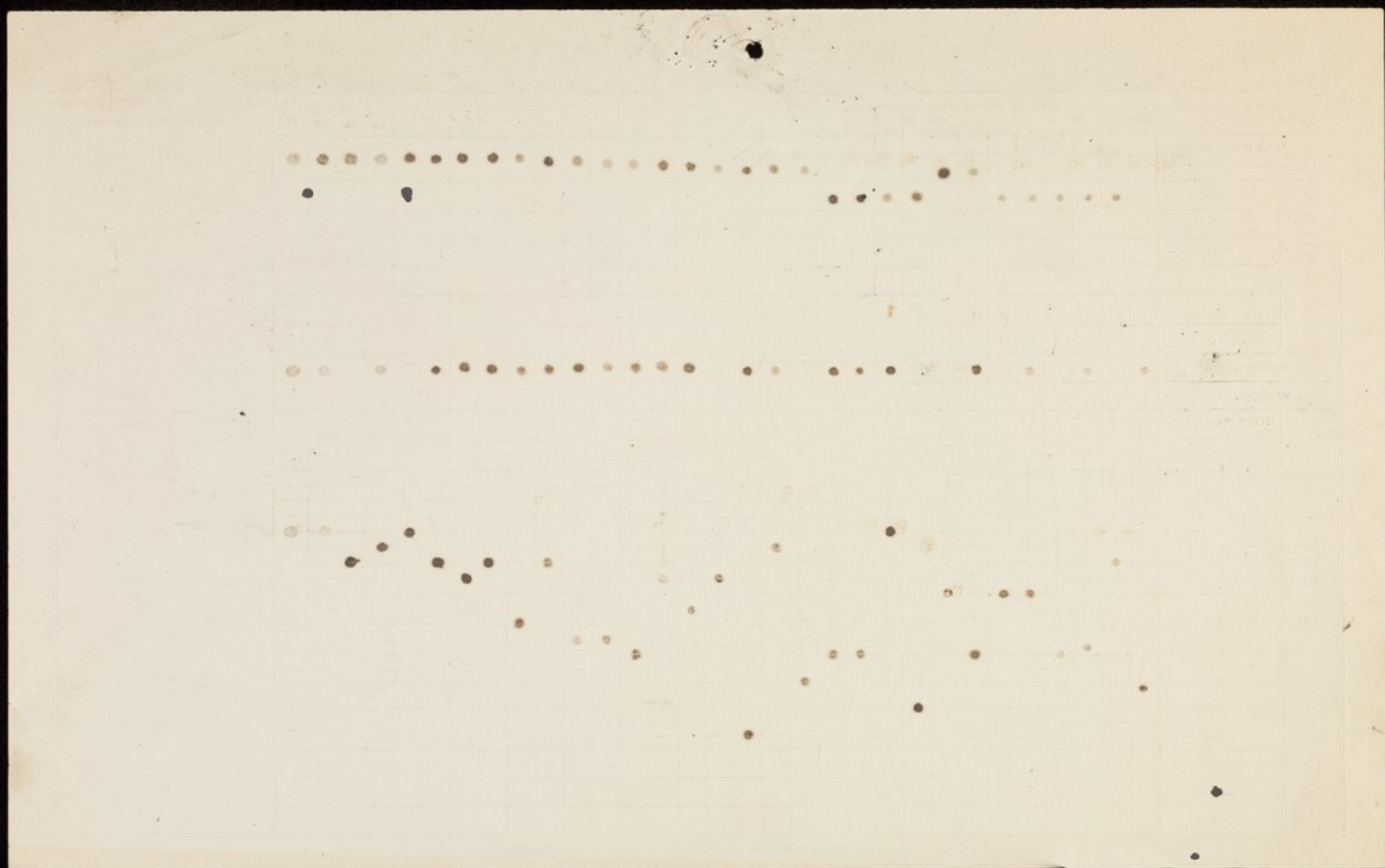

Thinks the other inhabitants of the house are hatching mischief and that the house is going to be burnt. Refuses food, and has spat in her sister's face.

Miss Stevens.

- 14th Feb: Patient admitted at 6.30 p.m. - very agitated & full of fears. Slept $1\frac{3}{4}$ hrs - restless, agitated & confused. B.W.O.
- 18th " Confused & agitated, dozed during the afternoon - has taken meals fairly well - fed by nurse - willing to take it herself but her hand trembles so much that she is unable to do so.
A quiet night - slept 6 hrs at intervals.
- 19th " Confused & full of fears. B.W.O. Slept at intervals $3\frac{1}{4}$ hrs during the night, confused & agitated.
- 20th " Still confused. Talkative restless during the night getting out of bed - slept 3 hrs at intervals.
Has asked once for a knife with which to kill herself.
- 4th March Patient still continues confused & agitated - is very restless - wishes to get up & go away - is full of fears that something is going to happen - nursed in bed.
For sleep see chart.
- 11th " Patient is deluded - she says that by giving her food we are making her deny the Lord Jesus Christ. She is agitated at times & is restless - wishes to go home.
- 19th " Patient continues the same - takes her meals well & is very little trouble. Will not write, sew or read.
- 26th " Patient continues to improve - sleeps well.
- 24th " Patient got up today & went into the garden - miserable at times.
- 1st April Patient has been up out of doors - appears brighter, at times she is a little agitated.
- 2nd & 3rd " Visited by her sisters. Has begun to write letters.
- 8th April Improving, goes out with nurse & attends meeting.
- 2nd May. Patient left for Throebury Hall this afternoon.
