I. The highest Bidder to be the Buyer ; and if any dispute arise between two or more Bidders, the Lot so disputed shall be immediately put up again and re-sold.

II. No person to advance less than 1s. ; above Five Pounds, 2s. 6d. ; and so on in proportion.

III. The Purchasers to give in their Names and Places of Abode, and to pay down 5s. in the Pound, if required, in Part Payment of the Purchase-money ; in Default of which the Lot or Lots so purchased to be immediately put up again and re-sold.

IV. TO

MR. JOHN FLETCHER,

ON THE SALE OF THE FOURTH PORTION OF
MR. BRITTON'S LIBRARY.

DEAR SIR,

Custom, and frequent repetition, reconcile the human eye and mind to many things, which at first were regarded with sorrow. *You* sell books and other objects—perhaps much endeared to the proprietor—without a moment's thought of producing pain. The Surgeon amputates a limb—the Dentist extracts a tooth—the Judge passes sentence of transportation or death on a felon, as matters-of-course—as common place affairs,—perhaps heedless of the heart-rending pangs inflicted.

In asking your official aid to dispose of Books, Drawings, &c. I am influenced by the conviction that you are strictly competent to the task, and that you will endeavour to do justice to me and your own character. I do not ask, or expect you to enter into, or sympathize with my feelings of regret, or sorrow, at parting with so many old associates, confidential friends, dear companions, as are, by the simple fiat of your hammer, to be severed from me for ever.—Many of them have done me “suite and service,” for more than half a century, and have therefore had much “wear and tear,” but they are still young, useful, serviceable, valuable; and contain that within which “passeth all show,” which serves to impart knowledge, pleasure, wisdom to others, without losing one atom of their own intrinsic strength and merit. Many of them are, like wine, the better, or rather more valuable for age. Unlike wine, however, or other things which merely administer to the pleasures of appetite, good books never pall, never satiate, never tire; but create “increase of appetite by what it feeds on.” The well selected Library is ever in season—abounds with viands ever nutritious, fruits ever ripe, and flowers that are always

perennial; that furnishes a banquet to all the senses, through the medium of one, that makes us wiser, better, happier; that tend to make man rational, good, generous: and, as it is exquisitely expressed by Shakspeare, thus render him "the paragon of animals."

"He, to my knowledge, had fed on the dainties that are bred in a Book. He had eaten paper as it were, and drunk ink. His intellect was replenished."—*Dr Parr*.

"The *Amenities of Literature*," is not merely an attractive title to the last of Mr. D'Israeli's excellent works, but is valuable, and replete with "useful knowledge." On the subject now under consideration, he writes. "To the privacy and silent labours of some *men of letters*, and some *lovers of the arts*, usually classed under the general designation of COLLECTORS, literary Europe for the most part, owes its public Museums and public Libraries. It was their ripe knowledge only which could have created them, their opulence only which could render them worthy of a nation's purchase, or of its acceptance, when in their generous enthusiasm they concentrated the intellectual gift for their countrymen."—*Amenities of Literature*, iii. 260.

The same author's "*Curiosities of Literature*," is full of curious and interesting matter, calculated at once to excite and partly gratify that curiosity which belongs to the "Book-lover." Boswell's "*Life of Johnson*" is a Cyclopædia of moral, critical, metaphysical literature; and therefore shews the lasting pleasures to be derived from this source, for Books were almost as essential to the erudite Doctor as food. They were the penates, or household gods of his domestic temple. "Books," he says, "should teach us the art of living"—yes, and the wisdom to die without a murmur: for they are the best counsellors, and monitors: the most trust-worthy friends. Whatever be our inclination or wishes; whatever mood, or tone of mind may predominate we can resort to them for solace in affliction; amusement, when gloom, or *ennui* assail us; for information on any and every subject on which man is rationally inquisitive. The writings of Shakspeare, Nature's and England's Poet, are boundless, endless, in the extent and variety of their aphoristical wisdom. His "fine fancy," not merely "exhausted worlds and then imagined new," but peopled those novel regions with rational, intellectual human beings.

But I must check the pen: for in this age of rapid motion, when the body is carried with hawk-winged speed

from place to place, and seven-leagued boots may be said to be worn by steam engines, it is expedient to economize time and space in our amusements, as well as business-pursuits. I may briefly tell you that I have been "*a collector*" from boy-hood;* and that the love of Books has grown with age: and, had fortune enabled me to indulge that passion, my library would have vied with a Bodley's, or a Spencer's: but, as I could not so easily build walls, or expand rooms, as I could purchase books, I have found it necessary to reduce my stock by three different public sales, and now submit, through your medium, a fourth: for age admonishes me to prepare for the FINIS of the volume of life; and I am desirous of protecting executors from unnecessary trouble and vexation.

The present sale is miscellaneous; but contains some choice books and illustrations on Topography, History, Antiquity, Architecture, the Fine Arts, Shaksperiana, &c. In self-justification it is proper to remark, that I have still reserved a very respectable library of choice books, in all these branches, particularly about 100 volumes and pamphlets of "Presentations, with Autograph letters, and privately printed books." A series of Portraits, with letters, and biographical memoranda of public persons with whom I have been personally acquainted: Carter's Sketches: Dr. Stukeley's MSS. the Celtic cabinet of Models, Drawings, Books, Prints, &c. on Druidical Antiquities. Aided by these materials, and varied anecdotes, with written and printed facts, it is my intention, if life and health be granted me for another year, to produce a *Memoir of my Literary Life*, in conformity to a pledge made to a Committee which has conducted a subscription since the 7th of July last, to offer me a "*A Testimonial for long and useful services in the cause of Archæological and Topographical Literature.*"

The present sale does not include any books or prints relating to WILTSHIRE, or to the ENGLISH CATHEDRALS.

* When eight years old I bought eight volumes at the sale of 'Squire White's effects, for one shilling. These formed the nucleus, the first cell in the bee-hive, which gradually but very slowly increased for many years, from a small box, to a few shelves, thence to a small room, nine feet square, next the partition taken down, and converting two rooms into one: the following remove gave me an apartment 21 feet by 16, which was filled from ceiling to floor. Every other room in the house was progressively occupied, or "lumbered," as ladies say, with books.

These are reserved, as my collections for both are very large, and very interesting ; and I entertain a hope that the first may be kept entire, for a future historian of the county : and the latter also preserved either in a national library, for public use and benefit, or be attached to some establishment, which has for its object, the history and protection of those noble English edifices.

I have occasionally been led to hope, that the Government of the country would found and support a truly NATIONAL, a strictly ENGLISH LIBRARY ; containing, in classed order, all the Printed Books, MSS. &c. that could be procured on BRITISH HISTORY in all its branches ; also, Biography, Topography, and Antiquities, and from which the Historian, the Topographer, the Statesman, the Lawyer, might derive every required aid, if not full information on any and every subject of inquiry and writing. On this point I have corresponded, and personally communicated with some of our most enlightened Members of both Houses ; and have also repeatedly invited their attention and patriotism to the desirableness of establishing some place for the conservatism of the ancient monuments, and architectural antiquities of the country. But alas ! the time and whole attention of Ministers, and other active legislators are absorbed in party contests, and the complicated machinery of national legislation. Had the money, that has been wantonly and recklessly spent in imperfect and unsatisfactory palaces and public buildings, or in the vexatious, and dishonest railway litigation and contests, other better and more useful objects might long since have been effected.

2020 A MAGNIFICENT WAX MODEL, REPRESENTING THE RESURRECTION, BY THE LATE A. ROUGH, ESQ.

* * * This UNIQUE Model, which occupied the late distinguished Artist many years, and whose pious feelings rendered him peculiarly adapted to the creation of such a work, lately formed a most attractive object in the Exhibition of the Royal Polytechnic Institution; from the descriptive Catalogue of which place the following is extracted:—

“The time chosen by the artist is the instant at which egress is made by our Saviour from the sepulchre after the removal of the stone by the angel who guarded the entrance.

Christ is represented advancing from the sepulchre in the full vigour of life, and by the two outstretched fore-fingers of his hand directs attention to the “house opened, not made with hands, eternal in the heavens,” and to the victory he has obtained over *Sin* and *Death*, which is farther exemplified by the double key. *The Angel*, awed by the glory of the risen Saviour, is seen worshipping on his knees, veiling his face with his robes.

The Soldiers of the watch are represented terrified at the “great earthquake,” and the re-appearance of the crucified Saviour. One, in his endeavour to screen himself, falls to the ground, his weight bending the handle of the spear, others fall upon him, and to mark the general consternation, another is represented without his helmet.

The Sepulchre exhibits in the interior the white napkin which had been bound about the Saviour's head, and on the top of the entrance is a skull, emblematical of mortality; at the back are two *Palm Trees* springing from one root, typical of the two-fold victory, which is further illustrated by the *Serpent* retreating from the back of the sepulchre at the instant the Saviour advances from the front, while overspreading it is seen the PASSION FLOWER and the IVY, the former typifying the sufferings of Christ in obtaining our redemption, and the latter that his kingdom shall last for ever. This is the only instance known of the Resurrection being thus exemplified.

An elegant table, the general design of which is rendered subservient to the principal subject, accompanies the model.”
