II. Extracts from Vital Statistics.

**BIRTHS.** The number of births registered during the year was 34 (Males 24, Females 10). The birth-rate calculated to a population of 2900 is 11.7 per thousand.

**DEATHS.** The number of deaths registered in and transferred to this district was 42 (Males 22, Females 20), eight of these being over the age of 80 years or 19 per cent of the total deaths. The death-rate calculated to a population of 2900 is 14.4 per thousand.

**INFANT MORTALITY.** Two children died under the age of one year giving a death-rate of 58.8 per thousand births.

III. Sanitary Circumstances of the Area.

Nineteen new water services were laid for 26 additional houses bringing the total houses connected to the water mains up to 569. Twenty further connections to the sewers were made for 32 houses bringing the total houses connected to the sewers up to 491.
