

To the Chairman and Members of Hartismere Rural District Council.

Madam Chairman, Ladies and Gentlemen,

I have the honour to present the Annual Report of the Medical Officer of Health for 1972.

Vital Statistics:

There was a reduction in the number of births and a consequent fall in the local adjusted birth rate to 15.5 (National figure 14.8).

No stillbirths occurred during the year.

There were fewer deaths in young children under the age of 1 year and the Infant Mortality Rate dropped from 23.00 to 14.00 (national figure 17.00).

There was a reduction in the total number of deaths and the local adjusted death rate dropped to 10.9 (National rate 12.1).

There were no significant changes in the table of causes of death.

51.2% of all deaths occurred in persons aged 75 years or over.

Infectious Diseases:

There were no serious outbreaks of notifiable infectious diseases.

Housing:

A comprehensive survey of houses in the district was carried out at the request of the Department of Environment and a copy of this is included in the report.

It will also be seen that there were increases in the number of new private and new Council houses built during 1972.

Poultry Packing Stations:

2,894,174 birds were processed in the 4 Poultry Processing Premises during the year. Only 1.01% birds were condemned as being unfit for human consumption.

In conclusion I should like to express my appreciation of the co-operation and assistance of Mr. Spindler and the staff of the Public Health Department during the year under review.

124 cattle were killed in the one licensed slaughter house during the year and 100% inspection of carcases was carried out.

No carcases were condemned which again shows the first class quality of meat handled.
