

Thirty House were found with Sanitary defects, These were all remedied without The necessity for blosing Orders being applied for. Water The District is well supplied with water, Supply: which is soft, of good quality & quantity, samples are taken for analysis occasionally. The Dorough of Fastings Waterworks supply on The intermittent system 8 houses in Fairlight & 22 in Ore. There is no pollution of Rivers of Streams in The District. Rivers TStreams Savorage and The Severage is chiefly by means of cesspools, Sewage Disposal earth closets + a few privies. 
