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

INFECTIOUS DISEASES.

There were no notable outbreaks of infectious disease and no deaths from this cause.

DIPHTHERIA. Although 23 cases were notified as diphtheria, when the diagnosis was finally revised 10 were found to be some other disease, leaving 13 only as true Diphtheria. Of these 13, there were 2 who had been immunised, one having a mild attack and the other being a doubtful case but finally accepted as Diphtheria.

IMMUNISATION AGAINST DIPHTHERIA.

> Sessions were contined at which injections were given by Private Practitioners to children of school age and under. Each child had three injections of T.A.F. prophylactic serum.
