Annual Reports of the Medical Officer of Health and Chief Public Health Inspector for the Year 1968

Mr. Mayor, Aldermen and Councillors,

I have the honour to present to you my Annual Report for the year 1968.

Population

The Registrar General's estimate of the mid-year Home Population was 11,580 which represents an increase of 400 over that of the previous year.

Live Births and Rate

The number of live-births was 137 (76M. 61 F.) which was an increase of 4 over that of the previous year, and the crude birth-rate was accordingly 11.8; after adjustment by the Registrar General's Comparability Factor which is computed from a population standardised for age and sex distribution, the rate becomes 17.1 and was slightly higher than that of 16.9 for England and Wales.

Stillbirths and Rate

The number of stillbirths was 2(1 H. & 1 F.) and the stillbirth rate was 14.0 compared with a rate of 14.8 for England and Wales.

Infantile Mortality Rate

Four infant deaths were registered due to:-

Broncho-pneumonia: Hydrocephalus & Anencephaly - 6 months.

Broncho-pneumonia - Severe sub-normality - 8 months.

Prematurity - 3 hours.

Combined Immunological deficiency: Therapeutic alynphoplasia: - 1 month

The infant mortality rate was accordingly 29.0 compared with that of 18.0 for England and Wales.

The hard core of Perinatal Hortality (i.e. stillbirths and infant deaths under one week of age) is prematurity, asphyxia and atelectasis, birth injuries and congenital malformations and the chief maternal factor is toxaemia of pregnancy. (Regard, however, should be given to the fact that these statistics are too small for valid comparisons.)

Maternal Deaths and Mortality Rate

This rate was again nil as there were no deaths from Pregnancy, Childbirth and Abortion, and is a reflection of the high standard of modern obstetric practice.

Deaths and Death Rate

The total number of deaths from all causes was 201 (83 M. 118 F.) and the crude death rate was accordingly 17.4 which is an index of the higher proportion of elderly people resident in the Borough; after adjustment by the Registrar General's Comparability Factor as for births the rate becomes 8.7 and was lower than that of 11.9 for England and Wales.

The chief group cause of deaths, as naturally would be expected, was Heart and Circulatory Disease and Vascular Lesions of the Nervous System, as these are the most common causes of death amongst the aged; of those there were 117.

Ischaemic Heart Disease (i.e. Coronary Thrombosis and Coronary Atheroma) was the cause of 53 deaths; 1 between 35 - 44 years of age; 1 between 45 - 54; 12 between 65 - 64; 12 between 65 - 74 and 27 over 75 years. 39 of those deaths were over 65 years of age. These figures, although too small for any valid inference, indicate that Ischaemic Heart disease is primarily a degenerative or senile disease

Cancer, as invariably in previous years, was the second highest cause of deaths of which there were 31. The age-groups were as follows:1 between 25 - 34; 7 between 55 - 64; 13 between 65 - 74 and 10 over 75 years.

Cancer of the Lung/Bronchus was the cause of 4 deaths (all male) in the following age-groups; 2 between 55 - 64; 2 between 65 - 74 years of age.

Cancer of the Breast was the cause of 5 deaths, in the following age groups, i.e. 2 between 65 - 74 and 3 over 75 years. It is reasonable to assume that the patients sought medical advice too late, having regard to the facts that Cancer of the Breast is an insidious disease, although easy to diagnose.

Cancer of the Stomach was the cause of 2 deaths in the following age-groups; 1 between 65 - 74 and 1 over 75 years.

The other causes of death were miscellaneous and there was no exceptional mortality; there was no death due to Infectious Disease.

SOCIAL CONDITIONS

The Borough of Hythe is largely a residential District, by the sea, and during the holiday months, attracts many visitors. There are a few light industries, including a Brewery, two Laundries, a Plastics Firm, a School of Infantry, and domestic trades. The standard of housing in the Borough has been maintained by the Council at a very high level due to long-term pre-war planning and as a consequence there are no slum clearance areas. There is little unemployment in the District and social conditions are generally very satisfactory.
