I have the honour to present to you my Annual Report for the year 1969.

BOROUGH OF HYTHE, KENT

The Registrar General's estimate of the mid-year 1969 population was 11,700 which represents an increase of 100 over that of the previous year.

ANNUAL REPORTS OF MEDICAL OFFICER OF HEALTH

Infant Mortality

The number of live-births 112 (100% 752) which was an increase of 5 over that of the previous year, and the crude birth-rate was accordingly 12.1 per 1,000. The Registrar General's Comparability Factor which is a measure of the distribution of live-births by age and sex distribution, was 10.3 for England and Wales, which is slightly higher than that of 10.2 for England and Wales.

Infant Mortality Rate

Two infant deaths were registered during the year.

Strangulation of small intestine due to herniation through a hole in the abdominal wall.

Constitutional Heart Disease.

The infant mortality rate was accordingly 1.8 compared with 1.8 for England and Wales.

The vast bulk of Perinatal Mortality (over 90%) and infant deaths under the age of 1 year is preventable, especially the stillbirths, birth injuries and congenital malformations and the chief national factor is the quality of pregnancy. (Report, however, should be given to the fact that these statistics are too small for valid comparison).

Maternal Deaths and Mortality Rate


This rate was again nil as there were no deaths from Pregnancy, Childbirth and Abortion, and is a reflection of the high standard of modern obstetric practice.

Deaths and Death Rate

The total number of deaths from all causes was 21 (100% 172) and the crude death rate was accordingly 1.8 which is an index of the higher proportion of elderly people resident in the Borough. After adjustment by the Registrar General's Comparability Factor as for births the rate becomes 2.1 and was lower than that of 2.2 for England and Wales.

The chief group cause of death, as naturally would be expected, was Heart and Circulatory Disease and Vascular Lesions of the Nervous System, as these are the most common causes of death amongst the aged of whom there were 15.

Mr. Mayor, Aldermen and Councillors,

I have the honour to present to you my Annual Report for the year 1969.

#### Population

The Registrar General's estimate of the mid-year Home Population was 11,700 which represents an increase of 120 over that of the previous year.

#### Live Births and Rate

The number of live-births was 142 (66M. 76F.) which was an increase of 5 over that of the previous year, and the crude birth-rate was accordingly 12.1; after adjustment by the Registrar General's Comparability Factor which is computed from a population standardised for age and sex distribution, the rate becomes 18.4 and was slightly higher than that of 16.3 for England and Wales.

#### Stillbirths and Rate

The number of stillbirths was 2 (1M. 1F.) and the stillbirth rate was 14.0 compared with a rate of 13.0 for England and Wales.

#### Infantile Mortality Rate

Two infant deaths were registered due to:-

The infant mortality rate was accordingly 14.0 compared with that of 18.0 for England and Wales.

The hard core of Perinatal Mortality (i.e. stillbirths and infant deaths under one week of age) is prematurity, asphyxia and atelectasis, birth injuries and congenital malformations and the chief maternal factor is toxæmia of pregnancy. (Regard, however, should be given to the fact that these statistics are too small for valid comparisons).

#### Maternal Deaths and Mortality Rate

This rate was again nil as there were no deaths from Pregnancy, Childbirth and Abortion, and is a reflection of the high standard of modern obstetric practice.

#### Deaths and Death Rate

The total number of deaths from all causes was 212 (100M. 112F.) and the crude death rate was accordingly 18.1 which is an index of the higher proportion of elderly people resident in the Borough; after adjustment by the Registrar General's Comparability Factor as for births the rate becomes 9.1 and was lower than that of 11.9 for England and Wales.

The chief group cause of deaths, as naturally would be expected, was Heart and Circulatory Disease and Vascular Lesions of the Nervous System, as these are the most common causes of death amongst the aged; of those there were 93.



Ischaemic Heart Disease (i.e. Coronary Thrombosis and Coronary Atheroma) was the cause of 49 deaths:-  
1 between 45 - 54; 6 between 55 - 64; 13 between 65 - 74 and 29 over 75 years. 42 of those deaths were over 65 years of age. These figures, although too small for any valid inference, indicate that Ischaemic Heart disease is primarily a degenerative or senile disease.

Cancer, as invariably in previous years, was the second highest cause of deaths of which there were 54. The age-groups were as follows:- 1 between 25 - 34; 2 between 35 - 44; 2 between 45 - 54; 16 between 55 - 64; 15 between 65 - 74 and 18 over 75 years.

Cancer of the Lung/Bronchus was the cause of 14 deaths (11M. 3F.) in the following age-groups; 4 between 55 - 64; 4 between 65 - 74 years of age and 6 over 75 years.

Cancer of the Breast was the cause of 3 deaths in the following age-groups, i.e. 1 between 35 - 44, 1 between 65 - 74 and 1 over 75 years of age.

Cancer of the Stomach was the cause of 5 deaths in the following age-groups; 2 between 55 - 64; 1 between 65 - 74 and 2 over 75 years.

The other causes of death were miscellaneous and there was no exceptional mortality; there was no death due to Infectious Disease.

#### Tuberculosis

One new case (1M.) of Respiratory Tuberculosis and one (1M.) Non-Respiratory Tuberculosis were notified and the patients were aged 65 years and over.

One death occurred during the year from Respiratory Tuberculosis, the patient being over 65 years of age.

Cases or suspected cases of Food Poisoning are still required to be notified.

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SOCIAL CONDITIONS

The Borough of Hythe is largely a residential district, by the sea, and during the holiday months, attracts many visitors. There are a few light industries, including a light Engineering Works, two Laundries, a Joinery Works, a Plastics Firm and various domestic trades. The Brewery no longer functions as such and the School of Infantry, long established in the Borough, has moved to a new area.

The standard of housing in the Borough has been maintained by the Council at a very high level due to long term pre-war planning and as a consequence there are no slum clearance areas. All pre-war Council houses lacking bathrooms etc. have now been modernised with the aid of government grant.

There was a slight increase, above past averages, of unemployment in the Borough. Social conditions are generally very satisfactory.
