Owing to the extreme improbability of ships entering Ilfracombe from infected ports, no permanent arrangements have been made with respect to these conditions; measures would have to be devised should occasion arise.

  Ordinary infectious disease cases would be removed to the North Devon Joint Isolation Hospital at Bideford.

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- (b) Surveillance and follow up of contacts

  Cases would be investigated and contacts followed
  - Cases would be investigated and contacts followed up by the Medical Officer of Health and Sanitary Inspector.
  - (c) Cleansing and disinfection of ships, persons, clothing and other articles

Steam disinfection would be done at the Council's disinfection station, Bicclescombe Park. Cleansing and disinfection of ships, persons, clothing and other articles would be carried out by the Council's staff under the supervision of the Medical Officer of Health and Sanitary Inspector.
