

The supply was sufficient for the needs of the area. The chlorination plant worked efficiently and bacterological reports on the chlorinated supply were satisfactory. There were no extensions of the supply other than to the Housing Site,

Sewage Disposal.

A new 9" Soil Sewer and a 12" Surface Water

Sewer were laid in Butts Road serving the new Housing Site, length

103 yards.

Poet War Sewage Proposals.

Sewage Disposal Works estimated cost £5,000.

A new 9" Sewer from Butts Road, North Street junction to the Triangle 300 yards approx. £1,000.

Housing.

As elsewhere there is a definate housing shortage in the area, in addition there are a number of unfit houses which will necessitate action when the erection of sufficient new houses renders this practicable.

There are also some cases of overcrowding as must be expected under the excisting circumstances.

The number of applicants for Council Houses at the end of 1945 was 154.

One house was erected during the year by private enterprise.
