### C. SANITARY CIRCUMSTANCES OF THE DISTRICT.

1. (1) Water Supply.—The town is supplied with water entirely by electrically operated plant, which has worked satisfactorily. A Chlorinator installed by Messrs. Turn-Over Filter Co., Ltd., of Belfast, is in operation.

The number of new services laid was 7, one service has been renewed, and 22 repaired.

The usual emptying and cleansing of reservoirs has been carried out during the year.

During the year 82,165,916 gallons of water were recorded as pumped, giving an average of 225,122 gallons per day, as against 226,087 per day in 1942.

Nine bacteriological analyses were made, which show that the water still maintains its high standard of purity.

- (ii) Drainage and Sewerage.—No extensions to the Sewerage System were made. New sprinkler arms were fitted to the two secondary filter beds, which are working satisfactorily.
- 2. (i) Rivers and Streams.—One complaint was received of pollution to the Finham Brook. The matter was rectified after repairs had been completed to the filters.

The effluent, in view of the shortage of settling tank capacity, is good, but additions are urgently required in these tanks to enable the works to function satisfactorily.

- 3. (i) Public Cleansing.—House refuse collection is carried out on a fortnightly basis. All property is provided with moveable, covered, metal dustbins, and a fortnightly system is also in operation for the collection of salvage, including paper, bones, rags, rubber, bottles and scrap metal. The following materials were sold during the year:—
  - 62 tons 5½ cwts.—Paper.
    - 2 tons 173 cwts.—Bones.
    - 4 tons 6 cwts.-Rags.
    - 6 tons 18½ cwts.—Bottles.

There is considerable difficulty in finding a market for the broken glass, large quantities of which are lying at the Council's site in Dalehouse Lane.

#### D. HOUSING.

The usual Table has been completed and is being kept for reference.

#### E. INSPECTION AND SUPERVISION OF FOOD.

(a) Milk Supply.—The number of registrations under the Dairies, Cowsheds and Milkshops Order is 40; of these, 19 were retailers only, 10 producer-retailers, and 11 were producers only. Premises have been visited at intervals, and 4 informal notices requiring cleansing and minor alterations have been served and complied with.

Three persons are licensed for the sale of Pasteurised Milk, and one for the sale of Tuberculin Tested Milk.

- (b) Meat.—Visits are made by the Inspector as required.
- (c) Other Trades.—Bakehouses have been inspected. One notice was found to be necessary, and has been complied with.
