# V.—Summary of Nursing Arrangements, Hospitals and other Institutions available for the District.

Professional nursing in the Home-

a. General. Only part of the district has a nurse who can be called upon. This nurse also acts as a midwife and is maintained partly by her fees and partly privately.

b. For infectious cases of measles, &c., no special

arrangements is at present in force.

Midwives-

Two midwives practice in the district. They are both self supporting and not subscribed by either Local or County Authorities.

Clinics and Treatment Centres.--None.

Hospitals—Provided or subscribed by Local Authority or County Council—

- 1. Tuberculosis.—None.
- 2. Maternity.—None.
- 3. Fever.—The Calne Joint Isolation Hospital.
- 4. Small Pox.—Accommodation for the treatment and isolation of Small Pox cases is provided by the County Council at Swindon.
- 5. Others.—None.

There is no institutioned provision for unmarried mothers, illegitimate infants and homeless children except in the Calne Union Workhouse.

AMBULANCE FACILITIES-

a. Infectious cases are removed to the Isolation Hospital in an ambulance which is kept there.

b. Sickness and Accident cases can be removed to Hospital in an ambulance which is run jointly for the benefit of Calne and Chippenham. It is kept at Chippenham.

# VI.-Laboratory Work.

Pathological and Bacteriological examinations required for the elucidation of Infectious Diseases are made by the Pathological Laboratory at Bristol University and are paid for by the Local Authority.

Anti-Diptheria Serum is provided by the Local Authority when required.
