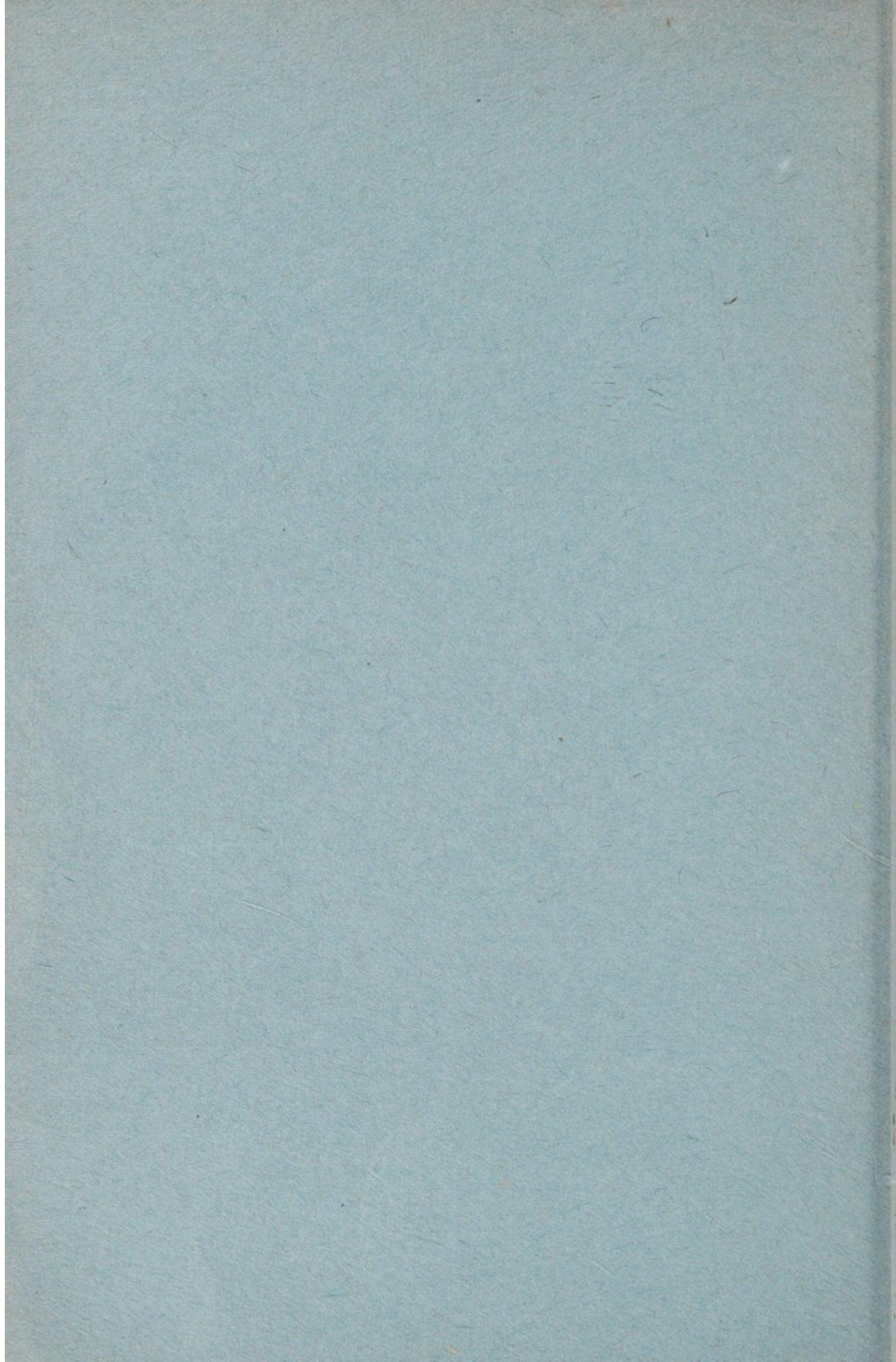

Water and Sewerage.

Extensions to meet the new houses erected have been made.

Public Cleansing.

No change in these services has been made.

Housing.

There has been no gross amount of overcrowding owing to the influx of evacuees—the number of these has varied from time to time, but it is estimated that the population has increased by more than 60%.

INSPECTION AND SUPERVISION OF FOOD.

Milk.

Fourteen milk samples were examined for cleanliness and tubercle bacilli. No tubercle bacilli were found, and the cleanliness may be expressed as Good 3, Moderate 4, and Bad 7.

Meat.

Private slaughter-houses were closed in January and Meat was supplied from the Central Slaughter House at Kendal.

ADULTERATION, ETC., AND CHEMICAL AND BACTERIOLOGICAL EXAMINATION OF FOOD.

The County Council is the Food and Drugs Authority, and this work was carried out by Mr. C. J. H. Stock, B.Sc., F.I.C., County Analyst, Darlington.

PREVALENCE OF, AND CONTROL OVER, INFECTIOUS AND OTHER DISEASES.

It is most satisfactory to note how few infectious diseases have occurred; the following were notified:—Scarlet Fever 2, Diphtheria 1, Erysipelas 1, Puerperal Pyrexia 1, and Pneumonia 3; there were 288 cases of Measles and 5 of Whooping Cough.

Whilst the notification of Measles and Whooping Cough does not assist the control of these diseases, the Ministry of Health desires the fullest data indicating the incidence and distribution of them.

Artificial immunization against Diphtheria has been continued through all elementary schools under the Education Authority, and A.P.T. is the prophylactic which has been used.

Up-to-date Isolation Hospital accommodation is still lacking.

An orthopædic ^{hospital} for evacuees was opened at Ibbotsholme.

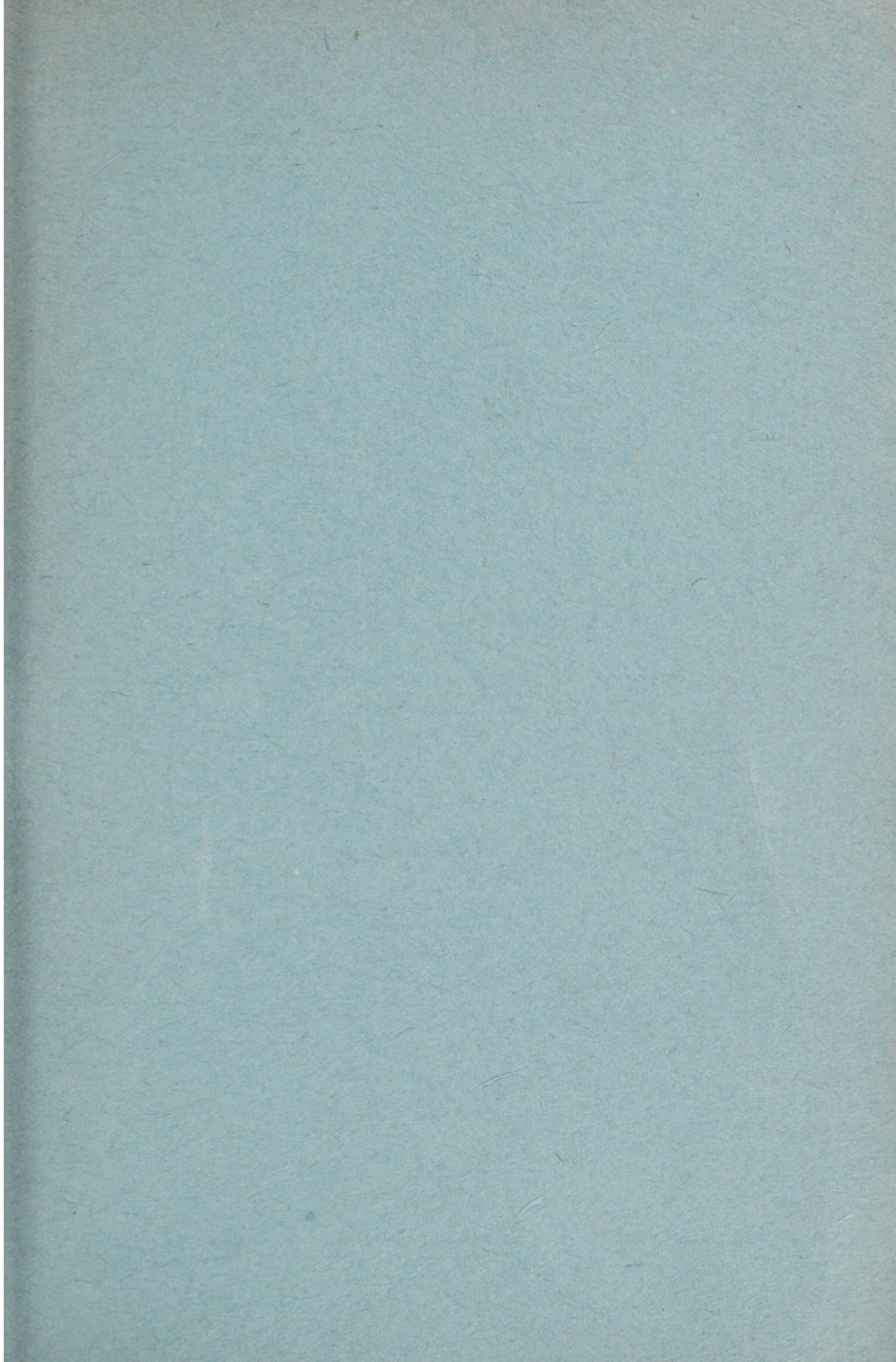
