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

I beg to submit my annual report for 1945.

BIRTHS.

10 births were registered: 11 Males, 8 Females.

DEATHS.

32 deaths were registered in the district. To these must be added 8 deaths of residents which occurred outside the district. The resulting total is 40.

ZYMOTIC DISEASES

Two cases of chicken pox; two cases of pneumonia; three cases of whooping cough; and fifty-two cases of measles were notified.

TUBERCULOSIS.

Three cases of tuberculosis were notified.

OVER 65 YEARS.

Of the total number of deaths, 30 were over 65 years of age.
