Gentlemen,

I beg to submit the annual report as Medical Officer of Health for the year 1940, prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Ministry of Health.

TABLE A.

It has not been necessary to take any action respecting the condition existing on boats entering the port.

TABLES C and D.

No cases of infectious disease have been notified to the Port Medical Officer of Health during the year.

TABLES E and F.

It is impossible to give a definite total of rats killed in and around the port, as gassing operations are carried out, and results cannot always be seen.

Twenty dead rats have however been found after operations.

No rats have been found in vessels.

FOOD INSPECTION.

No foodstuffs have entered the port during the year, and it has not been necessary to take any action under the Public Health (Shellfish) Regulations, 1934.
