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

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REPORT, 1873.

DURING the fifty-two weeks of the year 1873 (terminating on Saturday, 27th December, 1873), the returns of the Local Registrars record 18,716 births and 13,042 deaths within the Borough of Liverpool.

Of the births, 9,686 were males, and 9,030 were females; making the total Birth-rate of the Borough equal to 37·0 per 1,000.

The distribution of the births in the different wards and districts of the Borough has been arranged in the following Table:—

Of the 13,042 deaths, 6,754 were of males, and 6,288 of females; 7,038 occurred in the Parish, and 6,004 in the Out-townships.

The Death-rate of the Borough was equal to 25·8 per 1000,

The Death-rate of the Parish was equal to 30·2, and that of the Out-townships to 22·0 per 1,000 of the population.

We are able, from the returns made by the Registrars as to the residences of persons dying in the Workhouses and Hospitals of the town, to classify 1,168 of the deaths in these establishments under the wards and districts from whence the patients were removed, viz., 254 under Scotland Ward, 126 under Vauxhall Ward, 123 under St. Paul's and Exchange Wards (Dale Street District), 204 under St. Anne's and Lime Street Wards (Islington District), 34 under Castle Street and St. Peter's Wards (St. George's District), 104 under Pitt Street and Great George's Wards (St. Thomas's District), 125 under Rodney Street and Abercromby Wards (Mount Pleasant District), 138 under the Out-Townships of Everton and Kirkdale, 54 under that of West Derby, and 6 under those of the Toxteths. This will, however, still leave unclassified 753 deaths of persons whose previous residences were either unknown or not specified; and these, in the absence of definite information, I have placed in the Wards in proportion to the number of total deaths.

The results of the alterations occasioned by this re-arrangement of the deaths in the wards and districts will be shown in the following table, from which a calculated rate of mortality per 1,000 of the estimated inhabitants has been made ; but it must be observed that the estimate of the population of all the districts of the Parish has been made on a rate of decrease which is probably in excess of what is now going on.

The average age at death of the inhabitants of the Borough during the twelve months of the year 1873 was 25 years, in the Parish 26 years, and in the Out-townships 24 years. The following table shows that the average age was lowest during the third quarter, or during the months of July, August, and September, when infantile diarrhoea was rife.

The centenarian was the widow of a labourer, and died at No. 57, Eldon Place, in Scotland Ward.

TYPHUS AND INFANTILE REMITTENT FEVER.

These diseases accounted within the Borough of Liverpool for 335 deaths, or for 174 in the Parish, and 161 in the Out-Townships. The rate of their mortality was equal to 0·6 per 1,000 per annum of the estimated population. Their percentage rate relatively to deaths from all causes was 2·8 during the first, 2·3 during the second, 2·3 during the third, and 2·6 during the fourth quarter of the year. Their annual rate relatively to deaths from all causes was 2·5 per cent., and relatively to deaths from zymotic causes 14·0 per cent. Their deaths included 175 males and 160 females; 124 persons below the age of 15, 72 between the ages of fifteen and 30, and 139 above the age of 30.

Every form of continued fever is included under the generic term of typhus; but the registers of deaths attribute 16 cases to gastric fever, 75 to typhoid fever, 20 to enteric fever, 8 to continued fever, 4 to brain fever, 2 to relapsing fever, and 113 to typhus. Under the term of fever there were registered 39 deaths, under that of febris 7 deaths, and under that of febricula 24 deaths. The deaths registered under the term of infantile remittent amounted to 27.

The following tables are in themselves sufficiently explanatory. The first compares the averages of deaths from typhus during the preceding ten years with those during 1873; the second table shows the districts of the town and the periods of the year in which all forms of continued fever were most fatally prevalent; the third marks in streets the habitats of the disease; and the remaining tables the occupations and social positions of its victims.

SCARLATINA.

Scarlatina accounted during the year for 205 deaths, or for 106 in the Parish, and 99 in the Out-Townships. The rate of its mortality was equal to

0·4 per 1,000 per annum of the estimated population. Its rate relatively to deaths from all causes was 0·6 per cent. in the first quarter, 0·4 in the second, 0·9 in the third, and 4·3 in the fourth quarter of the year; its annual rate relatively to all deaths was 1·5 per cent., and relatively to deaths from zymotic causes 8·5 per cent.

CHOLERA.

Of the 21 deaths from Cholera, 13 were registered as English Cholera, 4 as Cholera, and 4 as Cholera Infantum. There is reason to believe that the deaths of a female emigrant, aged 33 years, and of her child, aged 6 months, in the Liverpool Workhouse Hospital, on the 3rd and 5th September were due to the poison of Asiatic Cholera. They arrived from the Continent, *via* Hull, and the mother was taken ill on the journey, and was removed from the Brunswick Station direct to the Workhouse Hospital. The disease did not spread from any case of Cholera which occurred in the Town or Port.

There were 3 deaths from Asiatic Cholera in the River, on board the French vessel the "Rosaire," from Havre, on the 28th September. The bodies were carried out to sea, and the vessel placed in quarantine and disinfected. Another case of Asiatic Cholera, which by mistake was taken to, and died at, Smithdown Road Hospital, outside the Borough, was of a man who had travelled from Havre, *via* Southampton and London, to join the ship "Hortense Dusantoy, stationed in the Wellington Dock, Liverpool, where immediately on arrival he was taken ill and removed to Hospital without any suspicion that it was a case of Cholera.

TUBERCULAR DISEASES.

This group of diseases includes Phthisis, Scrofula, Tabes Mesenterica, and Hydrocephalus. They occasioned 1,989 deaths in the Borough of Liverpool during the year 1873, of which 1,055 occurred in the Parish, and 934 in the Out-Townships. The death-rate was 3·9 per 1,000 of the estimated population; their percentage death-rate relatively to deaths from all causes was 15·2.

The Select Vestry are kind enough to forward to my office a daily list of the cases of Fever and Small Pox attended by the Parochial Medical Officers, and a monthly list of the cases of all Zymotic diseases, of Tubercular diseases, and of sickness from other causes, which have occurred in the twelve districts of the Parish.

The daily list enables the Health Committee to take action for the purification of the houses, and I am able from the other to classify the districts and streets in which sickness has prevailed.

The following are the streets within the Parish of Liverpool in which three or more cases of Fever, or two or more of Scarlatina, or two or more of Small Pox have occurred during the year.

These show that the average number of persons suffering from Continued Fever (including therein Typhus, Typhoid, and Simple Continued Fever), at one time in Hospital during the year 1873, was 26, and their percentage death-rate 10·8; the average number of cases of Measles at one time in Hospital during the year was 7, and their percentage death-rate was 24·5; the average number of cases of Scarlatina at one time in Hospital during the year was 2, and their per centage death-rate was 34·4. No cases of Small Pox were in Hospital after the 9th August, but the average number at one time in Hospital to that date was 1, and the percentage death-rate was 6·0.

Eleven cases of Small Pox (of which 6 were taken to the Workhouse Hospital and 5 to the Netherfield Road Hospital) were Emigrants or Seamen from on board ship. Forty cases of Fever occurred among Emigrants and Seamen from on board ship; of these 36 were taken to the Workhouse Hospital, and 4 to the Netherfield Road Hospital.

The number of persons in receipt of Parochial Relief on Saturday, the 28th June, 1873, was 8,368, or 1,431 less than at the corresponding period of 1872, and the number on Saturday, the 27th December, was 8,017, or 1,345 less than at the same period of 1872.

LODGING-HOUSES.

The Health Committee have, since the passing of the Sanitary Act, 1866, ruled that, as far as possible, all registered lodging-houses should have a day apartment for the accommodation of their lodgers, and that all houses where single rooms were occupied by day and night should be registered as sub-let. The space required for a night lodger in a registered lodging-house is 300 cubical feet, while the space in a sublet house for each adult is 350 feet. The effect of this arrangement is to lessen the number of registered lodging-houses.

There were on the register 1,035 lodging-houses at the end of 1872, and 1,007 at the end of 1873. This difference was occasioned by the removal of 227 old licenses, and the addition of 199 new ones. The visits to lodging-houses are both by day and night. The lodging-houses of the better class, and especially those provided only with single beds for each person, and only with the number of beds equivalent to the number of lodgers allowed, are not visited at night except on grave suspicion, or on complaint, or in the case of foreign emigrant lodging-houses. The night visits are pretty nearly restricted to the low districts and tramp houses. The number of day visits paid during the year was 39,865, and the night visits 5,776. The number of lodging-houses found overcrowded on the night visits was 37, the number of informations laid for breaches of the bye-laws was 107, with the results of fines in 103 cases to the extent of £22 17s. 0d., in sums varying from 1s. to 20s. and costs. The number of lodging-houses found dirty was 187; notices were served to limewash and cleanse.

It is necessary frequently to visit houses which are not licensed either as lodging or sub-let houses, especially when emigration is brisk, or at race times. There were 1,799 such visits paid during the day, and in 198 of the cases where suspicion was confirmed, they were followed up by night visits. A tenant harbouring lodgers is not taken before the Justices for the first offence, but is noticed to have his rooms measured and licensed. There were 205 such notices issued during the year, but in only 3 cases did the tenants refuse to comply; they were brought before the Justices and fined. A bye-law requires that every case of infectious sickness in a lodging-house should be at once reported to the Medical Officer of Health. 25 cases of Fever occurred in lodging-houses; 23 of the patients being lodgers were at once sent to Hospital, the bedding removed to the disinfecting apparatus, and the rooms purified and cleansed. The remaining 2 cases being members of the keepers families were not removed, but the lodging-house licenses were at once suspended. No lodger died from Fever in a registered lodging-house, but there were 100 deaths from non-contagious diseases in lodging-houses, of which 64 belonged to the keepers' families and 36 were lodgers.

SUB-LET HOUSES REGISTERED UNDER THE SANITARY ACT OF 1866.

The number of sub-let houses on the Register at the termination of 1872 was 9,680; the number registered during 1873 was 482, making the total on the Register on the 31st December, 10,162. The number of visits paid during the night was 11,844, and during the day, 58,586, with the result of finding 1,044 rooms overcrowded. In addition to overcrowding, the offence (though not punishable in sub-let houses) of permitting adult males and females, not married, to occupy the same room, comes under the notice of, and is entered in the books of the Inspectors. There were 436 rooms thus indecently occupied by 631 males and 804 females, besides having also in these rooms 294 children between the ages of 5 and 13 years. The character of the indecent occupation may be judged of from the following facts: in 218 instances one man and two women were found in the same bedroom; in 105 instances, two men and one woman; in sixty instances, two men and two women; in thirty-one instances, one man and three women; in nine instances, three men and one woman; in seven instances, two men and three women; in three instances, one man and four women; in one instance, four men and one woman; in one instance, three men and two women; and in one instance, one man and five women.

Informations were laid against 866 chief tenants for permitting overcrowding in rooms, with the following results:—695 were fined 1s. and 1s. costs; 3 fined 1s. and 2s. 6d. costs; 104 fined 2s. 6d. and 2s. 6d. costs; 23 fined 5s. and 4s. 6d. costs; 9 fined 10s. and costs; 2 fined 20s. and costs; and 2 fined 40s.

and costs; making a total of fines levied during the year of £120 7s. 6d. Of the remaining 28 cases, 16 informations were withdrawn, the tenants having abated the overcrowding; in 12 cases the tenants were acquitted—the majority because it was the first offence, and the remainder because of their poverty, and their promise not again to offend.

BAKEHOUSES.

809 day visits and 1,047 night visits have been made to Bakehouses during the year. 31 informations were laid for working young people below the age of 18 years, between the hours of 9 p.m. and 5 a.m. In 28 cases penalties varying from 2s. 6d. and 2s. 6d. costs to 10s. and costs, and making a total of £13 5s. 0d., were inflicted. 95 Bakehouses were found dirty, and notices were served to limewash and cleanse them.

LICENSES FOR CATTLE.

During the year 1873, 9 applications for Licenses to keep 85 cows were made to and granted by the Health Committee; 39 shippsons licensed to keep 429 cows have been given up during the year. There are at present 521 shippsons licensed to keep 5,145 cows. 48 of the premises previously licensed have been transferred to fresh tenants. In 74 of the shippsons pigs are also allowed to be kept; in 67 of them, only 2 pigs each; in 6, 4 pigs; and in 1, 5 pigs.

63 applications were made during the year to keep pigs in styes separate from and unconnected with shippsons; 13 of the applications for keeping 43 pigs were granted. 20 piggeries licensed to keep 104 pigs have been given up during the year. 35 piggeries previously licensed have been transferred to fresh tenants. The total number of premises or styes now licensed in the Borough (excluding shippsons) is 320, for keeping 923 pigs.

MORTUARIES.

Under the provisions of the 27th section of the Public Health Act, 1866, the Council provided Mortuaries, or proper places for the reception of bodies, dead of infectious disease, which are detained in any room in which persons live or sleep, and of bodies which are in such a state as to endanger the health of the inmates of the house, or room in which they are kept.

The following is a list of the cases removed to the Mortuaries by order of the Justices on the certificate of the Medical Officer, with remarks as to the condition of the rooms from which the bodies were removed.

REMOVAL OF THE SICK TO HOSPITAL.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACT, SEC. 26.

Under the provisions of the above Section, there were removed to the Workhouse Hospitals, 12 persons, including 3 men, 3 women, and 6 young persons and children, all suffering from Fever. In 10 of the cases the law had to be enforced against the wishes of the patients or of their friends.

THE DISINFECTING APPARATUS.

The number of articles sent to the Disinfecting Apparatus during the year amounted to 33,684.

DISINFECTION OF HOUSES.

In all cases of infectious disease the houses were disinfected, free of cost, with sulphurous gas, by officers appointed by the Health Committee, but whenever there was sickness in any room of the house, so as to endanger health by the use of sulphurous gas, carbolic acid powder was freely sprinkled in the rooms and passages of the house until the sulphurous gas could be used safely. No house is considered properly disinfected until the sulphurous gas has been used. The existence of sickness, and the consequent employment of carbolic acid powder, necessitate many visits by the persons in charge of the disinfection. There were in all 2,946 visits paid to the houses for the purposes of disinfection; the number of houses properly disinfected being 1,377.


